

THE CAPTURE OF SONTAY.

ESTIMATED LOSSES OF THE HOSTILE ARMIES.
New York, Dec. 30.—Last night Vincenzo Dragone, violinist in a theatre here, procured the arrest of two Stollans, Paris and Pison, but the complainant's story was regarded by the police as improbable. He discharged them both shortly after sunset. Pariz was arrested, and on landing here to-day indicted him on Dragone's evidence. The latter says the two men were members of a band of Sicilian bandits with headquarters in this city, governed and organized on the plan of bandits in Italy. He says last March Pariza enticed him to a street where Pison was on 23th street. Both of them threatened to kill him with daggers, which they pressed against his neck, and demanded \$3000 from him. He told them he had not so much. Finally, he told them the victim had only \$2000 in bank, they agreed to accept it, and allowed Dragone to go home after exacting a promise not to divulge what had occurred and to threaten to kill him. Dragone gave his bank book and watch chain to the men who called at his house and the bandits drew the money. He said he had no other alternative, but was waiting till the note came due. He consulted Inspector Byrnes and Pariza and Pison were arrested, but the justice thought Dragone was crazy and released both.

ROBBERY AND MURDER AT MID-DLEMISS, ONT.

An Old Man Wantonly Killed After Being Plundered—Three Men Arrested on Suspicion.
LONDON, Ont., Dec. 29.—About 9 o'clock last night two men knocked at the door of Grant Silcox's store in the village of Middlemiss, about twenty miles from here, a station on the Loop Line of the Grand Trunk railroad, between Glencoe and St. Thomas. The slutters of the store were up, but Silcox and his son (a boy of 12) were in the store at the time the old man, thinking it was a customer, ordered the boy to open the door. The boy did so, when he was immediately seized by the men and ordered to get out on pain of death to the other man. The other man then made no noise. The man who was ordered a revolver at Silcox and demanded his money or life. At first he refused, but the robber told him he would find the money in the till. The robber went there and in the till found \$200 and a quantity of silver. The slutters, taking at the same time a pocketbook containing \$200 and several notes, were later seized; a common sister, when the latter seized a common stick on the counter and striking him on the head struck the slutter, taking the key villain then left the store, taking the key villain with them. The youth recognized a young man named Wrightman of the village as one of the thieves, but did not know any other ones. Wrightman and a man named Graham, who were together at a dance in Silcox's village, on Saturday night, were during the morning. They deny all knowledge of the crime. After informing great County Attorney MacKillop, who was at the village, where the slutter was held in the evening, it is doubtful whether Wrightman or Graham are the guilty parties. Both have been in petty thieving scrapes previously, but it is scarcely believed they would commit such a heinous crime in a place where they are so well known.

A REVOLVING EXHIBITION.

Brutes in the Garb of Men Fight with Iron Knives.
BRIDGEPORT, Conn., Dec. 29.—Giant Jim, a blacksmith of New Haven, and Chubby Joe, a Bridgeport iron-worker, fought a prize fight yesterday. Iron knuckles were used, and the men were stripped to the waist. The fight was sickening and many of the large crowd of spectators who were present left the ring open like the cut of a cleaver, and blood ran down their naked bodies, freezing at the belts in red icicles. Their faces soon became unrecognizable, and all semblance of humanity was lost. They really were, nothing but brutes. The onlookers were not very refined or sensitive, but the bloody sight was not a pleasant one for them, and at the end of the second round they interferred. The fight was declared drawn. The appearance of the contestants was disgusting, and their condition dangerous.

SHIPPING ON THE CLYDE.

Bret Harte's Report on the State of Trade.
WASHINGTON, Dec. 30.—Bret Harte, our consul at Glasgow, reports that during the nine months ended September the returns of the Clyde shipping office show an enormous aggregate of 2,200,000 tons, the new shipping over the first three-quarters of last year, which was the largest output then on record. The prospect for the coming year, however, does not brighten very few contracts comparatively having been booked. Should there be a revival in general trade a large amount of new tonnage will be ordered, but otherwise the Clyde shipping will experience a notable recession.

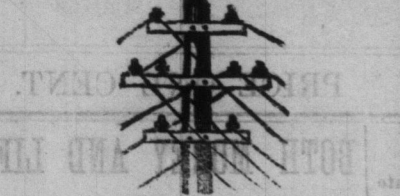

Plain Words for Canadian Methodists.

An important crisis is rapidly approaching in the history of the Methodist church of Canada—there is only one now—and much depends on the manner in which it is met and passed.

For purposes of this discussion, the Methodist church may be regarded as having one university to grant degrees, one college doing real university work and one theological hall for the education of the ministry.

The question of higher education is, therefore, for the church narrowed down to the issue whether this triple institution will be maintained where it is, or will be transplanted to a more suitable spot to flourish anew under more favorable conditions.

All honor to Cobourg and its vicinity for what they have done for the Methodist college. There was good reason to justify the selection of Cobourg as its site at a time when the provincial university was in the hands of an exclusive and bitterly hostile set.

But it does not follow that a site selected for the reasons which prompted the choice of Cobourg must for ever determine the policy of a great church. Toronto of today is not the Toronto of 1840, the Methodist churches of this city are collectively very different from the small persecuted remnant which found its voice in the burning hillsides of the late Dr. Ryerson.

But whether Victoria comes to Toronto or remains at Cobourg the methodists of Canada must face the question of its maintenance. It has two sides, one theological and the other secular. If the institution is to be maintained in its double function it must be maintained so as to a credit to the church or it will become a discredit.

Powerful and wealthy as the Methodist church is the task of keeping up a first-class hall for the training of its own ministry and the task of keeping up at the same time a first-class college for teaching literature, philosophy and science to all who want such tuition are together more than it can adequately perform. It is only a few years since the theological faculty of Victoria was established, and since that time it has done much to wipe away the once common and not always deserved reproach of an uneducated Methodist ministry.

But the theological faculty of Victoria is not at all what it should be. The work is, from the want of professors, not sufficiently subdivided and without a minute division of labor efficiency in divinity teaching is impossible. Two or three men, however transcendent their abilities and attainments, cannot impart instruction effectively in all the branches of the theology, any more than the same number of men can give true collegiate instruction in all the varied departments of an art or a medical curriculum.

Neither is the arts faculty of Victoria what it ought to be in these days of college expansion. It has done excellent service in the past and might easily continue to do good service for the future, but not the highest kind of university work. No college in Canada is equipped for such work at the present time, and it is doubtful whether it is either possible or desirable for this province to keep up more than one such institution.
