## INTRODUCTION.

The object of this work is to furnish an epitomized introduction to the subject of coins from a numismatic standpoint, with a practically complete list of United States and Colonial Coins, and the Copper Coins of Canada, with the more common technical terms used, tables of fictitious value, and, in the U. S. series, the number of each date and denomination issued.

It is designed also for tradesmen, clerks and others who daily handle large numbers of coins, as it will enable them to rescue from circulation many that are worth from one to five hundred times their face value, thus saving to the numismatist pieces that would otherwise be lost or injured in circulation, as well as adding to the finder's income, according to his care and opportunity.

The value of a coin does not depend as many suppose upon its *antiquity*, but upon its *scarcity* and *condition*. Some pieces struck within a few years are far more valuable than many that antedate the Christian era.

As a rule, a coin to be worth anything must be in *good* condition; only the rarer pieces are of value when pierced, much worn or in any way defaced; while the more common will command a premium only when in the best condition.

It may be well to remark that any *uncirculated* or strictly *fine* coin is worth retaining. The list of values in this book is an average struck from the prices paid by numerous deal-

ers in different parts of the country, and may be relied upon as a generally fair estimate when the piece is good or very good.

In conclusion, never attempt to clean a coin. Never heat it, rub it, or put it in acid or ammonia. Send it greasy and corroded to the collector or dealer, but **NEVER** rub it!

### Technical Terms and Definitions.

---

A **COIN** is a piece of metal bearing some definite device,  
and is struck for circulation as a representative of value.

A **MEDAL** is a piece of metal struck in commemoration of  
some person or event, and is not designed for a circu-  
lating medium.

A **TOKEN** is a piece stamped and issued by private parties,  
and is not lawful currency, though used as such in  
times of necessity. During the Rebellion, when small  
coins as well as large ones were withdrawn from circu-  
lation, there were issued immense quantities of such  
tokens now known as "copperheads." The "Hard  
Times Tokens," or "Politicals," of 1837 is another  
instance in this country, while similar pieces are abun-  
dant in Canada and Great Britain.

**MONET** is from the Latin *moneta*, and in the temple of Juno  
Moneta the Roman mint was located.

**NUMISMATICS** is the science of coins and medals, which are  
here considered as works of art without reference to  
their intrinsic value.

**THE PLANCHET** is the blank metal on which the piece is  
struck.

**THE OBVERSE** is that side of a coin or medal bearing the  
head or principal figure.

**THE REVERSE** is the opposite side.

**THE LEGEND** is any inscription excepting the name of the  
person represented.

**THE INSCRIPTION** is a general term including all legends,  
titles, etc.

**THE FIELD** is the blank surface between the device and the inscription.

**THE MINT MARK** is a private mark struck by the mint to indicate its place of coinage.

**FILLET HEAD**,—hair tied with a ribbon at back of head.

**FLOWING HAIR**,—hair untied, and flowing backward.

**TURBAN HEAD**,—bound with a turban inscribed "Liberty."

**LETTERED EDGE**,—has an inscription on the edge.

**MILLED, OR REEDED, EDGE**,—ribbed or serrated, to prevent cutting down or shaving of gold and silver coins.

**TYPES** are the different designs of similar coins; *vide our three types* of 5-cent pieces in 1883.

**VARIETIES** are slight variations of the same type, and are usually so slight as to escape observation unless specially directed. As an example, the silver coins of 1873 have two marked varieties; one having arrow points at date, the other without.

**SIZE** in this country is reckoned in sixteenths of an inch.

**COINS** are classed according to condition, as follows:

**UNCIRCULATED**,—as it comes from the mint.

**NEARLY UNCIRCULATED**,—showing no marks of handling.

**VERY FINE**,—showing only the slightest trace of usage.

**FINE**,—barely touched by circulation.

**VERY GOOD**,—but little worn.

**GOOD**,—well defined, but showing abrasion on hair, cheek, stars or other higher part of device.

**VERY FAIR**,—inscription and device perfectly clear.

**FAIR**,—inscription and device legible.

**POOR**,—worn almost beyond recognition.

**VERY POOR**,—device and inscription obliterated.

**PROOFS** are coins struck for collectors, and not for circulation. The dies and planchets for these are highly polished, and they are wrapped in prepared paper to prevent corrosion of their mirror-like surfaces.







## COINS OF THE AMERICAN COLONIES.

There are so many varieties of some of these coins, differing greatly in degree of rarity, that it is impossible to affix their market values with accuracy. An approximation has been made with those usually in dealers' stock; the rest are quoted "scarce," "rare," or "extremely rare."

In arrangement I have followed the order of their issue as far as was consistent with keeping them in their natural groups, with the "Washington pieces" following in their order of issue.

Each piece is described with sufficient minuteness to be readily recognized by the amateur.






