

REPORT, ETC.

FEBRUARY 10, 1842, (the second Thursday in February), the day appointed for the Anniversary Meeting of the "Church Society of the Archdeaconry of New Brunswick," on the preceding day, viz., Wednesday, February 9, the Clergy and Lay Deputies assembled in General Committee in the National School House, Divine Service having been celebrated in Christ's Church.

Read the Accounts of William J. Bedell, Esquire, the Treasurer, made up to January 1st, shewing a balance in his hands of £187 1s. 4d.

Read Mr. Bedell's Account of the Funds set apart for "Missionary Visits," shewing that the amount of that Fund is £678 9s. 7d., of which £635 10s. 7d. is at interest on endorsed notes.

Read the Secretary's Account of the distribution of the Books imported in 1841, from the Society for Promoting Christian Knowledge.

Read a List of the Books now in the hands of the Secretary, remaining from the importations of 1839, 1840, and 1841, of the value of £25 11s. 4d., currency.

Read the following Statement, shewing the Operations of the Society for the past Year.

Showing the Operations of the Church Society during the Year 1841.

I. Missionary Visits. The Appropriations to this object now amount to £600, and the accumulated interest to about £100. The Rev. Mr. Hudson's Account for Travelling Expenses to January 1st, 1842, amounts to £23; that of the Rev. Mr. Thompson to August 6th, 1841, to £15 7s. 8d. The annual interest of the existing Fund will therefore very nearly cover the Travelling Expenses of the two Missionaries now employed.

II. DIVINITY SCHOLARSHIPS. The amounts limited to this object

are now £24 5s. 6d.

III. AID TO SCHOOLS, > The Invoices shew that Books and

IV. BOOKS AND TRACTS, Tracts to the amount of £106 9s. 4d. sterling, were imported last Year. The Books remaining on hand of former importations, amounted to £24 5s., currency, composed chiefly of the Bibles presented to the Society by the Society for Promoting Christian Knowledge. All of the above have been disposed of except 1 Family Testament, 19 Bibles, 81 Testaments, 94 Prayer Books, 23 Bound Books, amounting in value to £25 11s. 4d. All the grants made by the Executive Committee amounting (with one of 1839) to £111, have been supplied except one of £5.

V. Churches. Of all the grants made for Churches there is only one with respect to which no proceedings of any kind have been

taken, viz., 1839, Welford, £10. Of the grants of

1838. All have been paid.

1839. All have been paid except Welford, and one to Jackson.

Town; the Church in the latter place is in progress.

1840. All have been paid except Dundas, S. W. Miramichi, £20 each, and Bay de Verte, £10. All the Churches are in progress.

1841. All have been paid except further grants to Dundas and S. W. Miramichi, £20 each, and Chamcock, £20.

RESOLUTIONS OF APPROPRIATION.

Resolved, That such sums be take. from the Collections for General Purposes, as will make up with the Collections limited to that object, the sum of £50; the same to be added to the Fund for "Missionary Visits;" and that a sum not exceeding £100, be placed at the disposal of the Executive Committee, for "Missionary Visits to neglected places."

Resolved, That such sums be taken from the Collections for General Purposes, as will make up with the Collections limited to that object, the sum of £30; the same to commence a Fund, to found Divinity Scholarships; to be put out at interest by the Treasurer.

Resolved, That the sum of £175 be placed at the disposal of the Executive Committee, for the "Building and enlarging of Churches and Chapels," and that it be an instruction to the Committee, to comply with the recommendations of the several Local Committees.

Resolved, That such sum as will purchase a Bill of Exchange for £50, sterling, be transmitted to the Society for Promoting Christian Knowledge, for a supply of Prayer Books of various kinds; and that the balance of the Society's available Funds be applied to the purchase of Books and Tracts, suitable for Distribution, Libraries, and Schools.

ANNIVERSARY MEETING.

Thursday, February 10, 1842.

The Archdeacon opened the Meeting with a few remarks upon the benefits which had been derived from the past proceedings of the Church Society.

The providing for Missionary visits to destitute places had always been a favorite object with the Members of this Society, and two Visiting Missionaries had been for a considerable time engaged in that service, to whose zealous and successful exertions ample testimony had been given at the meeting yesterday. The impulse which both had given to the building of Churches, in their respective Districts, was indeed of itself sufficient proof of the value of their labour. One of them has three Churches now in hand, the other two. The people, it has been stated, did not require excitement to engage in such undertakings. They were of themselves anxious to set about them; in fact, could not easily be restrained. The advantages derived from the appointment of these Missionaries had cost but little to this Society, as the Society for the Propagation of the Gospel, with their accustomed libe-

rality, provided their salaries, and left to us only the payment of their

actual expenses in travelling.

In the settled Missions also, the building of Churches was going on with great rapidity. The little aid which this Society was enabled to afford, had acted powerfully as a stimulus to such undertakings. Apprehensions indeed had been expressed, that this work was going on too fast, and that Churches were being built, which there would be no Clergymen to serve. But it was hoped that this would not be the case with the Churches assisted by this Society. Whenever grants of this kind were made, the Committee acted upon a reasonable probability that the buildings would at least occasionally be used; and there was good ground to hope that the number of labourers in our vineyard would soon be considerably increased.

A large quantity of valuable Books and Tracts too, had been dispersed throughout this Province by means of this Society. During the last two years fifteen hundred copies of the Common Prayer Book in particular, had been imported and disposed of. The foundation of several Lending Libraries had been laid. Not a few extremely valuable publications of the Society for the Promoting Christian Knowledge had become known for the first time in this Country, and we know better than we did before what help to the cause of true Religion might be derived from our connexion with that great Institution. The last year's importation had been so managed, as to place means of religious information within the reach of all classes in the Community; and the Society could not, he thought, do better than pursue the same course in future.

That no Report of any Local Committee shall be introduced in the General Report of the Society for that year, unless sent in within the time prescribed by the above Resolution; 4. That the Secretary do transmit a copy of the foregoing Resolutions to each of the Local Committees as soon as possible.

" REV. SIR,

"I have the honor to acquaint you, for the information of the Executive Committee of the "Church Society," that in the course of the last summer, two American Clergymen, the Rev. Mr. Jones and the Rev. Mr. Carder, visited Saint John, and that I had the pleasure of making their acquaintance, and shewlng them such attentions as Ministers of the same Church have an undoubted right to. On their return home, I received a letter from Mr. Carder, from which the following is an extract, dated New York, October 6, 1841:

lowing is an extract, dated New York, October 6, 1841:

'I have just returned from a meeting of the Board of Managers'
of the Tract Society, and remembering the kindness which you manifested towards Mr. Jones and myself, and the interest you seemed to take in our doings, I took the liberty of making a statement of my visit to the Province, and my agreeable intercourse with you; and moved the following Resolution, which was unanimously adopted:

Resolved, that Ten Thousand pages of Tracts be presented to the Church Society of the Archdeaconry of New Brunswick, through

the Rev. Frederick Coster, Secretary, as an expression of kind and brotherly feelings on the part of this Society. Another Resolution

was also adopted, requesting me to be the medium of communicating through you to your Society, the sentiments expressed in the first Resolution, and to forward the Tracts to you. I need not say that I discharge this office with the most sincere gratification. I shall discret the Tracts to be put up to-morrow, and they will accompany this letter; only regretting that Mr. Jones, not being able to attend the meeting, was not associated with me in this friendly office. I shall add a few copies of the Church Almanac, which I hope the Clergy of the Archdeaconry of New Brunswick will consent to receive from the Editors as a friendly token.

"I will thank you to state to the Executive Committee, that the Tracts so kindly presented to the Society, were received, and that they are in my hands awaiting the orders of the Committee.
