RECEIPTS ARE \$120,000,000 A YEAR

Standard Oil Trust is Practically Run by One-Man Power, Says Mr. Monett.

Washington, May 16.—Attorney-General Frank S. Monett of Ohio was before the Industrial Commission today, as a witness in the Standard Oil Trust case.

Mr. Monett, who has been proceeding in his official capacity in Ohio, Monett gave the figures, showing the capital stock of the 30 companies comprising the trust, as well as their assets, showing the capitalization to amount in the aggregate to \$102,233,000, and the amount is \$122,581,000.

According to a report which the commissioner has prepared for Aid. Burns' special committee, the total cost of flushing the streets proposed, including labor and hose and carriage charges, for the next six months at six nights a week, will be about \$625. For three or two nights per week it will be proportionate.

To flush Yonge-street from King to Davenport-road will cost for labor alone \$115 per night, to flush King-street, from Simcoe to Sherbourn, \$6.46 per night; to flush East Queen-street to River Don, \$8.08 per night; and West Queen-street \$12.11 per night. This is exclusive of hose and water. Deputy City Engineer Fellows will estimate the cost of the water.

The merchants, said Mr. Jones, can have it as many nights per week as they wish, but they will probably save more by protection of goods than the cost of the dust laying.

"At any rate," he added, "I do not know of any place outside of Toronto where merchants are allowed to expose their goods on public thoroughfares."
