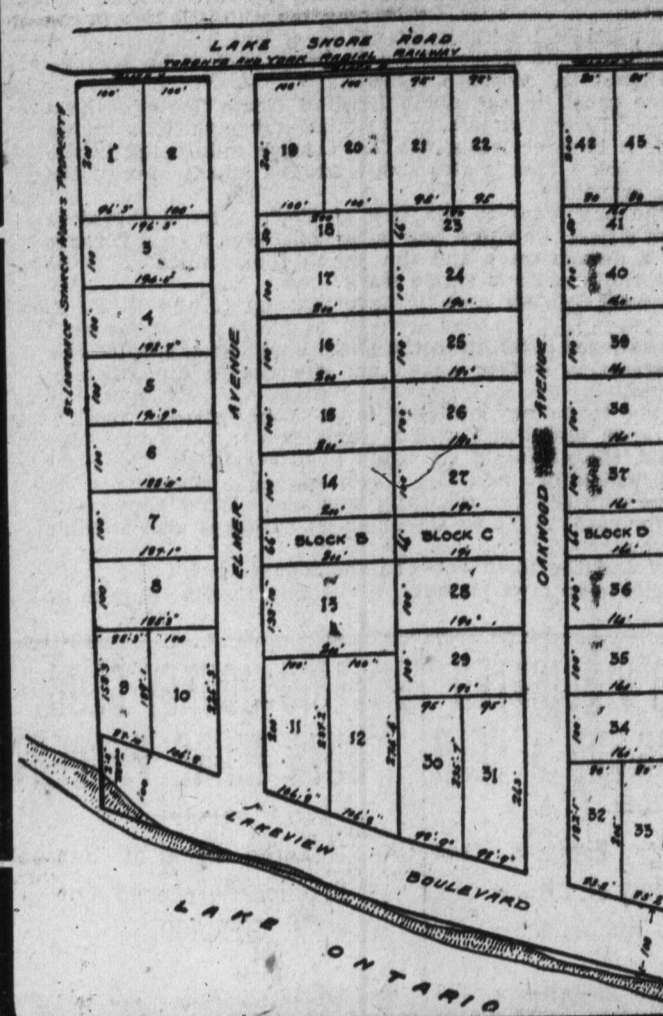

FAILED TO MAKE GOOD

Defendants Claim Sweeney Was to Fix Ontario Government. Before Justice Teetzel, in the non-jury assizes, Geo. R. Sweeney, a Toronto barrister, is suing H. J. F. Sisson, a solicitor of Fort Frances, and Louis Christie, a butcher and lumberman of Rainy River. He asks the court to declare that he is entitled to a half interest in the pine timber on his own property amounting to 17 grants in Paragang Township. He purchased several veterans' claims, upon which the government reserved the right to cut pine timber. Defendants wanted the pine, and as Sweeney, it is alleged, assured them he could "fix" the government to honor their claims, they gave him \$1000. Sweeney's tender was not accepted. So the defendants bought the successful tenderer's right independently of Sweeney. Christie has a contract to supply \$40,000 worth of railroad ties to Mackenzie and Mann and had to have the timber, but as Sweeney had failed to make good with the government they didn't see any further use for him. They have put in a counter claim for \$1545, including the sum that is alleged to have been applied toward "fixing" the government and which was not paid, as well as traveling and sundry expenses, which they advanced to plaintiff.

Theoretical disquisitions and anticipations have always been more alluring than immediate practical works. They are easier to begin with and there are no bounds to the imagination which can revel in the fabric it creates, however remote it may be from probability or even possibility.

This is true of the British Empire and its closer union. Schemes of federation and forms of imperial government have been devised, some meritorious enough, but destined to oblivion because they run contrary to the natural evolution of the states it was sought to weld together.

In giving credit for the grant of autonomy to the Transvaal and the Orange Free State to Mr. Asquith's government an afternoon co-temporary overlooked the fact that his honor is really that of the late Sir Henry Campbell-Bannerman. The letters patent embodying the constitution of the Transvaal were issued on 6th December, 1908, and those for the Orange Free State in July, 1907. Sir Henry did not retire from active politics till the spring of the following year.

HONOR TO WHOM HONOR.

Appropriate recognition was accorded the work of Dr. Helen MacMurchy has done in the last two years by the women's congress yesterday. The very impressive presentation of facts by Miss Dendy, of the Sandwood Schools, Manchester, regarding what is done, and what is necessary to be done, for defective-minded children, was perhaps the best justification that could be required for Dr. MacMurchy's appointment. This action was brought for \$200 damages, the cost of certain iron pipes and the line values, etc., purchased by plaintiff, a merchant of Port Colborne, from defendant, a company at Etobicoke. The defendant's answer is that he sold to Smith only such property and interest as he had in the gas wells, pipes, etc.; that Smith bought such property and interest with full knowledge of the rights which the defendants had in the wells, piping and regulators, and that if the plaintiff has not succeeded in obtaining the property he bought, he has but himself to blame. The defendants did nothing to prevent the plaintiff from obtaining the fixtures on the Dean farm. When the Dean objected to the removal, the plaintiff submitted. He did not ask for a formal assignment of such rights as the fixtures had in the Dean lands, and the action is dismissed with costs. Thirty days' stay.

Dominion Controverted Elections. Ottawa, Electoral District. Before Justice Tait. Menard v. Laurier—A. H. Beston for respondent, moved to dismiss petition for lack of presentation. J. W. Bair, K.C., for petitioner, contra. Menard v. Menard, real estate agent of Ottawa, filed his petition on 5th December, 1908, to set aside the election of the Honorable Sir Wilfrid Laurier in the election held on the 19th and 26th October, 1908. Preliminary objections were filed on 14th December, 1908, and hereafter no proceedings were taken until the filing of affidavit on 18th June on behalf of respondent on this application. Judgment: It appearing that no application was made to fix the time and place of trial within the statutory period and no excuse being offered for not doing so, the petition is dismissed following the decision in the Glangery case.

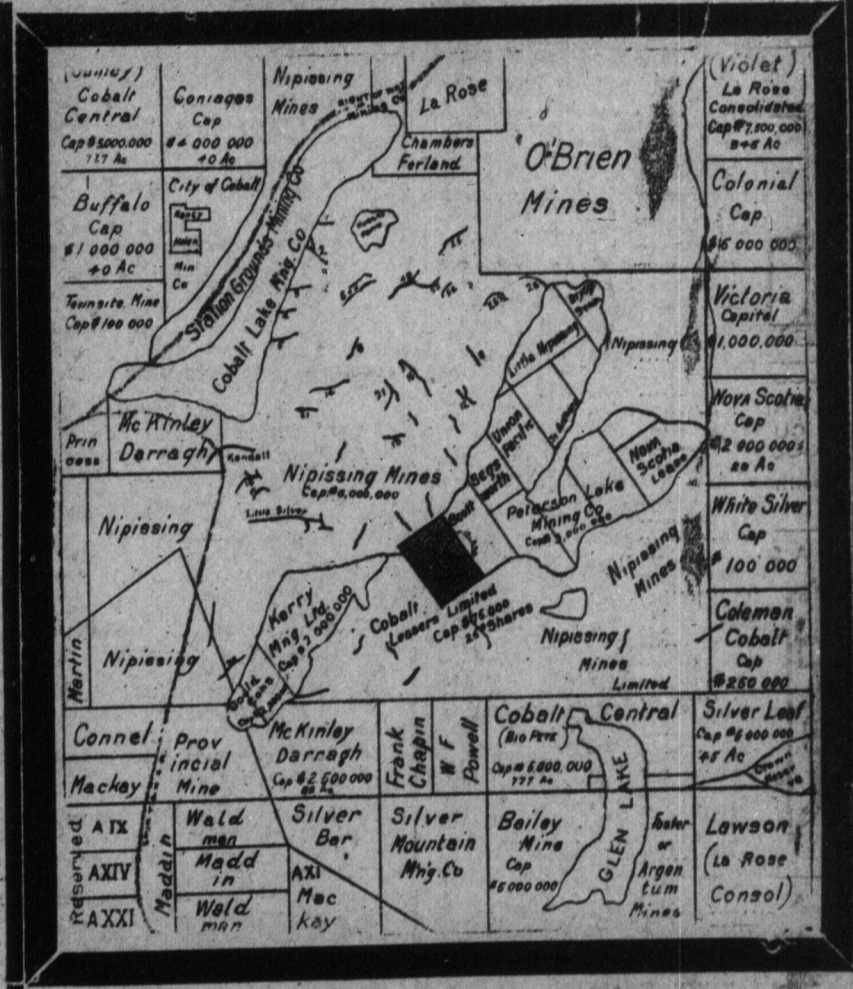

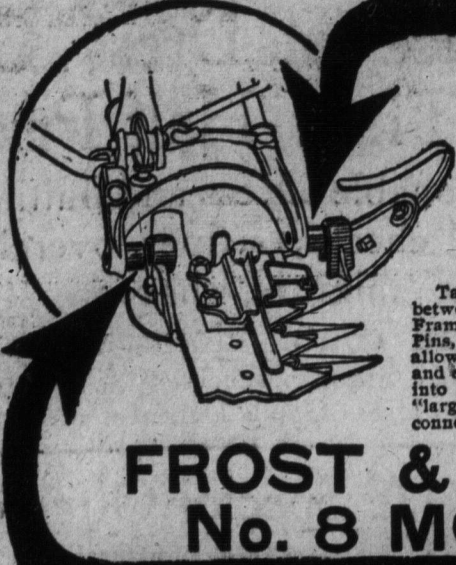

ABOLITION OF CANTEN REMORALIZES THE CAMP. Soldiers Get Their Jags by Wholesale and Saloons Do Thriving Business.

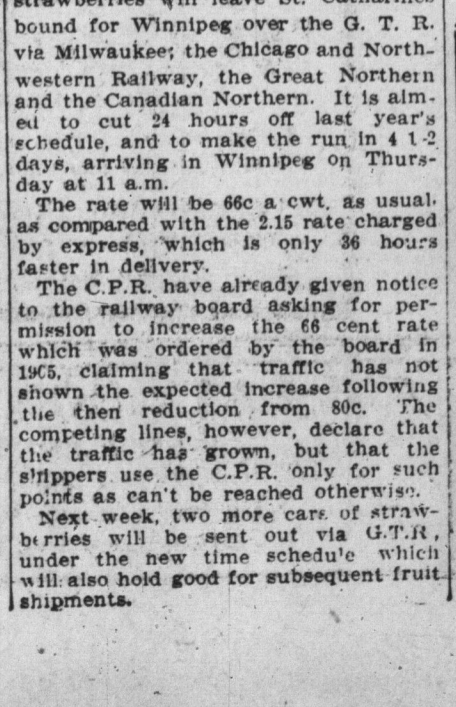
