## THE STRONGEST PLEA YET FOR SOLDIERS' SOCKS

Some of the Men Wearing Paper

For Foot Coverings, Writes
Captain---Many Pairs Lying
Idle in England

Moncton, Dec. 16—Capt. H. R. Emmerson of the 6th C. M. R., writing to this wife in Moncton, gives some interesting information regarding shortage of socks among men at the front. In a letter in the Transcript today he says:—

"I notice by your letters you are taking interest in work for soldiers. If you would interest other women in knitting socks for soldiers in the trenches you would accomplish something worth while. The London store houses are full of socks for wounded soldiers in the hospitals; that is just where the soldiers need them least. The army cannot get even an odd pair for the men in the field from the Red Cross Society, and so the men have to go short and use paper in a great many cases. There is a lot of hard work going to waste in Canada making socks for the Red Cross, which same socks will rot in storage in England.
