Ottawa, June 9.—In the Commons this morning Hon. W. T. White, replying to a question put by Hon. Geo. P. Graham yesterday, made a statement in regard to the latest Dominion loan of five million pounds, four per cent. debenture stock, maturing in 1960. The minister said the financial success of the loan was assured when it was underwritten. The stwenty-five millions to be raised would be used to defray capital expenditure. "Will that include the construction of armories?" asked Mr. Lemieux. "No; we do not borrow money to build armories," replied the minister. Referring to the press criticism of the loan, Mr. White said that this was but natural, and was to be expected, until such time as money conditions are better.





IN BOSTON The first yacht to bring a cup to America—more than three score years ago—is moored unnoticed and almost forgotten at the Summer-street extension bridge, close to South station, But few of the thousands who pass this bridge daily give the old yacht more than a momentary glance.
