#### MEETINGS.

The Regular Meetings of the Society are held quarterly, on the 25th March, or Lady Day; 24th June, or Midsummer Day; 29th September, or Michaelmas Day; and the 26th December.

Annual Election of Officers and Committees take place on 5th January.

The Members meet also on 23rd April—St George's Day.

The Meetings of the Committee of Management are held on the second Monday in every month.

The Meetings of the Sub-Committee of Charity are held weekly.

### RELIEF.

Application for Belief should be made on a Printed Form, stating the particulars of the case, &c., signed by any two members of the Society as a recommendation, and handed into the Sub-committee of Charity.

Members may also bring up-any case of distress within their knowledge at any of the above meetings.

The Printed Forms above mentioned may be had on application to any of the officers.

There are six beds, with the necessary bedding, all the property of the Society, in the Finlay Asylum for the use of persons who may be sent to that institution by the Society.

### REPORT

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OF THE

### COMMITTEE OF MANAGEMENT

TO THE MEMBERS OF THE SOCIETY

FOR THE YEAR 1881.

The Committee of Management have the honor to make the following report for the past year, being the forty-sixth since the foundation of the Society.

They are happy to be able to say that with the advent of greater commercial and industrial prosperity cases of distress have correspondingly decreased, and the Society have therefore not been called upon to provide relief to the same extent as usual. They have however, alforded necessary aid in 46 cases, the total amount expended in charity including \$100 voted to the Ladies' Protestant Home and Finlay Asylum, being \$344 22. For details regarding this expenditure the members are referred to the report of the Sub-Committee of Charity annexed.

Five members have been elected during the year, three life and two ordinary.

The Treasurer's account will show the financial position of the Society.

The usual anniversary service was held in the Cathedral on the evening of St. George's day, when a sermon was preached by the Right Reverend the Lord Bishop, and Rev. C. W. Rawson and Rev. Thomas Richardson assisted in the service. Mr. E. A. Bishop kindly undertook the musical portion of the service, and the ladies and gentlemen of the choir, and others, lent their valuable assistance, to all of whom the Society is much indebted. The collection amounted to \$141.

Death has been busy amongst us during the past year, and several old and valuable members have been removed. In July Mr. Richard Moorsom Harrison, a life member since 1845, and also an original member of the Society. At Montreal, in August, Mr. Benjamin Cole, an ordinary and also an original member, and one who during a long residence in this city took a very active and lively interest in the Society's affairs, having been President from 1857 to 1858; he had attained the good old age of 93 years and 10 months at the date of his death. Also in August, Mr. Samuel Dallimore, an ordinary member as well as one of our original members. In September Mr. William Miller, a life member since 1863, and also one who took a great interest in the affairs of the Society: in his position as Deputy-Shipping Master he frequently aided us by finding apportunities of working their passages to England for those desiring to do so. In November, Mr. Thomas Andrews, a life member since 1861, and also for a long period an active and prominent member.

Your Committee feel it incumbent upon them to bring under the notice of their successors the necessity of striking from the list of ordinary members the names of several who refuse to pay their subscriptions, provided they do not pay the amounts due upon being served with the notice provided by our by-laws. The whole respectfully submitted.

### REPORT

OF THE

# Sub-Committee of Charity

TO THE COMMITTEE OF MANAGEMENT

FOR THE YEAR 1881.

The Sub-Committee of Charity in laying before you their report for the past year, have pleasure in stating that the calls on them have been only \$244.22, as against. \$405.84 last year. The greater part of this difference is accounted for by their not having been called upon to forward applicants from the West to England and the East.

This year they had only one case to torward to England; this was a widow from River du Loup.

The number of cases relieved were 46—22 of which were residents of Quebec, some of whom/were sufferers by the fire of June last; they were supplied with money, flour, fuel and groceries.

Four were sent to the Finlay Asylum; an average of ten days each.

Eight were forwarded to Montreal and the West. Three, contributions to forward them to Manitoba. One sent to England.

Five transient relief.

One a loan of \$20.

One, an old man (72 years) long resident in Quebec, to Boston to join his son.

One funeral expenses of an old member.

Thanks are due to the Richelieu Navigation Company, and L. Stafford, Esq., for their kind services on behalf of the Society.

The Right Rev. George Jehosaphat Mountain D.D., D.C L Lord Bishop of Quebec, was the second son of Bishop Jacob Mountain, the first Anglican bishop of Quebec. He was born 27th July 1789 at Norwich England, came to Canada with his father, 1793, and died after a brief illness at Bardfield his country seat, on ith January 1863. He was nineteen years Rector of Quebec, and was consecrated Bishop 14th February 1836. He was a diligent visitor among his flock, and in the dreadful visitations of cholera in 1832 and 1834, he literally lived night and day among the dying and the dead, while in 1847, when the province was visited with the pleague of typhus fever, and the poor emigrants were dying by thousands at the Quarantine station, the Bishop took his turn at Grosse Isle regularly with the rest of the clergy; and again when the cholera visited Quebec in 1849 and 1854 he was diligent in visiting the hospitals. Du ing many years and up to the time of his death, Bishop Mountain, besides his life membership, contributed regularly to the Society a donation equal to four annual subscriptions, and at all times took a great interest in its proceedings.
