

EUROPEAN INTELLIGENCE.

Parliament meets on the 21st January. An earlier day was mentioned, and we should not be surprised, even still, if the Houses assembled immediately after Christmas. Of the dissolution we now hear—but it is a mere hearsay—that it will not occur before May.

The Ministry.—All the Ministers' dined with the King at Brighton on Wednesday.

We are sorry to announce that intelligence has been received this morning that the Bank of Messrs. Foster & Co. of Carlisle, stopped payment yesterday.

We fear the potato crop in all the localities, after the constant harsh rains, and the increasing frosts, which characterize the month of November, is almost wholly destroyed. The consequence must be disastrous; after another week of the same weather, the hay crop is notoriously short, and the price already exceedingly high, so that to add to the calamity, farmers will not have spare potatoes to feed their cattle in the coming season.

A strange rumour is mentioned as prevalent at Paris, that the Emperor Nicholas is insane. Another rumour concerning the Czar is, that he has met with another accident, and has broken his collar-bone.

Copper Steam Balloons.—It is proposed in a paper read before the Academy of Sciences of Paris, to construct balloons of thin hammered sheets of copper, to be filled with gas, and to be guided and supported in their movement by steam power attached to the boat below. They would then move more swiftly than carrier pigeons.

China.—A late number of the Canton Register publishes a copy of a proclamation from which it appears that the Celestial Empire intends to secure itself against interference of missionaries in China of any sort, whatever.

The German papers state that the death of Charles X. which was known at Vienna, was there spoken of with considerable interest and feeling. The remains of the ex King who during a long life had experienced so much misfortune, were, for the present deposited at Naples, but would be eventually transferred to Naples, and there placed in one of the Royal palaces. His death is, in these papers, ascribed to indigestion, occasioned by his having, against the advice of his physician, eaten a melon and some champagne.

Immediately previous to his death, the old King is said to have addressed to his family, and particularly to his Grandson, the Duke of Bordeaux, the wisest counsels, enjoining the latter never to bear arms against France, nor wage a civil war in his native country, and it is even added that he made the young Prince take a solemn oath to this effect in his presence.

Edmund F. Stewart, Esq. has been appointed Acting Collector of His Majesty's Customs in Newfoundland during the absence of the Hon. James M. Spensman.

We have much pleasure in announcing to the public the arrival of Mr. Merriam and his companion of giving lessons in the science of Education. Saturday 21st Dec. 1836.

Brown, End, Allen, Street and Craze, do compose the said Committee.

CHARLOTTE COUNTY.

St. Stephen, Jan. 2 1837.
At a meeting of the Church Wardens, Vestry, and Parishioners of this Parish publicly convened, after having read the letter of the Venerable the Archbishop, to the Rector, church Wardens and Vestry by the Rector of the Parish. It was unanimously *Resolved.* That their meeting approve the General Constitution of the Church Society, and feel it just and right that the Parishioners of this Parish, should interest themselves in its proceedings, and aid in advancing its objects;—that this meeting recommend that committees be appointed to solicit subscriptions from every friend to the church in this parish and that the smallest sum be accepted on the list—that the Parish be divided into districts—and that Messrs. R. Watson and Peter Brown be the Committee to collect subscriptions in district numbered one, commencing at Porter's Mill ending at the Cove, and extending to the northern limits of the Parish—what Messrs. M. Todd and F. Tinker, be the Committee for district num-

bered two, commencing at the Cove, including Mill Town and extending to the western limits of this parish—that Messrs. James Hutchinson, and James Smith, be a committee for district numbered three, commencing at Porter's Mill and extending to the eastern limits of the Parish—that the different committees be instructed to attend to the duties assigned to them with all convenient speed so as to be able to return their lists respectively to the Rector and Wardens on, or before the third Tuesday in January instant, that one or more of the different committees accompany the Rector to the public meetings which he may call in the other churches in this mission, in order to advocate the formation of similar societies, and to request the co-operation of their respective congregations in aid of the general object of the "Church Society," and if agreeable that the Subscribers may join with the Subscribers here in choosing delegates, so that one delegate may represent the whole mission, at the general meeting in Fredericton.

THIRD ANNUAL REPORT

Of the Church of England Sunday School, *Ladies and Gentlemen.*

In making my third annual Report of the state of the Episcopal Sunday School of this Parish, I have great reason to thank a gracious and good God, for the continued and increasing advancement which it has attained, to the all-important object which it has in view. The average numbers in attendance for the last year, have been 31 boys and 45 girls, and I have the pleasure to report the general attendance of these young persons, as well as the kind society of the Teachers, in the performance of their highly responsible duties, which are attached to the office of a Sunday School instructor, on the regular attendance and zealous support of the Teachers, such institutions must entirely depend. The regular attendance of the instructor, is generally followed by that of the pupil, and piety and zeal in the teacher, secures the respect and confidence of the young persons in the class, and a consequent readiness to hear and obey, those admonitions, which it may be necessary from time to time to give.

I am common with every person connected with this Sunday School, have much reason to regret the loss of some valuable Teachers who have left this Town, and I trust will not be thought too much to say, that they have been the very sinners and nerves of our institution, not only from their very punctual attendance on Sundays, but on all other occasions, when called upon, and also from the anxiety shown by them for the spiritual advancement of the children, and for their unwearied anxiety, in securing the constant attendance of every member of their classes.

By occasional visits to their parents and friends when the absence of any from the school required such attention. But above all, it is well known, that the weight of their example was powerful and salutary, as they were, and I have no doubt always will be, by precept and example, and benevolence towards their fellow creatures.

It is now generally allowed and felt that religious advancement of young persons, is most powerfully promoted by the instructions of the Sunday School. There the young mind is turned to religious reading and meditation, and there a child is taught that the Sabbath was graciously intended as a divine founder, to be not only a day of rest for the body, but the very harvest of the soul, and there the infant tongue is taught to utter the prayer of praise and thanksgiving, and to acknowledge and feel that salvation is only to be obtained by repentance towards God, and faith in the Lord Jesus Christ. Thus may we hope that those on whom the benevolent attention of the Teacher is bestowed, will be seen in after life pressing with joy and gratitude the prize of their high calling in Christ, laying up his words in their hearts and in their sons; and that they will teach their children, speaking of them when they sit in the house, when they walk by the way, when they lie down and when they rise up.

But I trust I shall be permitted to offer a few words to parents, as one who wishes well to them and to their children.

Parents then are aware, that Sunday Schools have been established for the good purpose of instructing children in their duty towards God and man. But unless parents do something on their part, there is every reason to fear that our endeavours will not be attended with that success which is most deserved. All that is desired of them is, to take care that their children shall partake of the instruction offered by attending regularly and going to School in proper time, and we further wish, they would ask their children what they have learned and set them good examples. By taking care that the children attend regularly at School, and especially by instructing them regularly at home, according to the best of their ability, and setting them good examples, parents may hope, that though the blessing of God, their children will prove comfort to them. What joy will parents feel, when seeing them fill their respective stations in life, with usefulness and honour; then say they say, "Blessed be God, who put it into the hearts of his servants to establish Sunday Schools, we see and feel the effects thereof. By hearing our children repeat their catechisms and Hymns, our attention is called to God, and to our duty, thus both we and they are become better." And if this be the case, when they see their children in another world, instead of being reproached by them, they will receive their warmest thanks, and rejoice with them for ever. God in his mercy, through Christ, grant that this may be the case.

Finally may I be permitted to entreat the zealous continuance of the Teachers, in the labour of love in which they are engaged, and particularly to call their attention to the absolute necessity of personal visits to the parents of the children of their respective classes, not only the parents of those who are absent from school, but also of those who are regular attendants. Permit me again to remark, that the usefulness and prosperity of Sunday Schools, depend almost entirely on the Teacher. Zealous attention and holy zeal, generally secure an overflowing School; while the want of those qualifications, are the first causes of total failure.

In conclusion, I beg to leave to the regular attendance of the Teacher at our monthly meetings; at those meetings preparation is made for after instruction, and an opportunity is afforded for consulting all matters connected with the institution; at this is most deserving of their particular attention.

I am happy to report that the subscriptions of some kind individuals have enabled us to purchase additional to our leading Library. The continued support of our friends is particularly requested, for this most beneficial branch of our establishment.

I have no conclusion to entreat the continued support of every member of our Church, in favour of all establishments of such importance to the temporal and eternal welfare of the rising generation.
