RUSS "REDS" LI VY "TAXES" FROM ALL

Keep Terrorist Coffers Full by Unique Robberies Most Boldly Executed.

Warsaw, Poland, Oct. 29.—It takes a lot of money to start a revolution, and a great deal more to keep it going.

Dynamite bombs are comparatively cheap, and here and there a fanatic may be found who will undertake to "remove" a governor or a general and pay his own expenses.

The favorite method of creating a "crisis" in Russia now is the general strike. That is the most expensive of all the revolutionary weapons.

Of late voluntary subscriptions to the Russian revolutionary movement have fallen alarmingly.

In Poland sinews of war have been secured by organizing a gigantic series of robberies, of which the chief victims are government institutions.

Besides filling the revolutionary coffers these daring outrages have rekindled interest in the socialist and revived the waning faith in their power to make it hot for the Government.

Among the first official institutions the Polish socialists determined to attack were the Government vodka shops, from which a large revenue is derived.

A man enters a shop, buys a bottle containing as much as two or three quarts, drops it in the doorway, sets a light to it, and shouts, "It's burning!"

At this signal his accomplices rush in and before the cashier can recover his presence of mind hold a revolver to his head, while one or two others empty the contents of the till into their pockets.

By this time a crowd has collected round the shop, with perhaps a soldier or two. But the assassins make their escape, shooting their revolvers right and left.

The rabble loots the burning shop and the ambulance comes to take away the wounded and dead.

In one day, between the hours of 10 o'clock in the morning and 6 in the evening, 22 spirit shops thus were looted in Warsaw alone.

The authorities then set soldiers to guard every spirit shop in Warsaw, Lodz and other large towns.

Two soldiers and a policeman were stationed outside a large spirit shop in one of the busiest thoroughfares of Warsaw.

Meanwhile another band of bandits had entered the spirit shop, held up the cashier, and carried off 500 rubles.

These raids became so frequent last summer that the authorities determined to shut some of the spirit shops and double the guard at others, but neither plan works well.

Somehow, though, the raiders have a hard fight for their booty. At a small town near Lodz, after they took 2,000 rubles' worth of money and stamps, they were chased by five Cossacks.

On reaching the open country, the socialists, when their pursuers got a little nearer, took refuge in a corn field, shooting the first man at the outset, but avenged him before long by killing two men and wounding a third.

But the survivors kept up such a heavy fire that they finally escaped, after a five hours' struggle, leaving two killed and two wounded behind.

The survivors managed to take all the money with them, and were never caught by the police.

But the sums thus obtained were not large enough to meet the need of the "party," which began to organize more profitable raids.

In Poland money is sent from the postal centers to the railway stations in carts.

Nearly every man in the pay of the Russian Government will impart information for a bribe, so the socialists soon got to know the routes of the postal wagons and the hours at which they would start.

OCEAN STREAMS CHANGING

Fact Explains Presence of Southern Fish in Northern Waters.

The tarpon ranks as the greatest of game fishes, and attracts large numbers of anglers to Florida and the Mexican coast, but its occurrence in northern waters has not previously been recorded.
