DEATH'S PENALTY.

James Allison Found Guilty of Murdering Mrs. Orr.
Boy Criminal Sentenced to be Hanged on Feb. 4, 1897—Last Day of the Trial at Berlin—Two New Witnesses Prove Damaging to the Prisoner's Chances—The Defence—Prisoner's Story, But His Father Not Admitted.

Berlin, Ont., Dec. 2.—The trial of James Allison for the murder of Mrs. Anthony Orr, near Galt, on Aug. 9, closed yesterday morning.
H. P. O'Connor, Q.C., of Walkerton, is conducting the Crown case, with Detective Murray present to aid him. J. H. Blake of Galt and J. S. A. Weir of Berlin are defending the prisoner.
Allison's father and mother, the latter with an infant, her sister, Mrs. Orr, and his father, were present.
When brought in young Allison showed no pretences.
Chief Justice Sir William Meredith occupied the bench, and, after the jurors

had been sworn, Mr. O'Connor outlined the case for the Crown. He said it would be proved that the prisoner killed Mrs. Orr, and that Allison had repeatedly confessed his guilt to the police, and had admitted that he had shot the woman with a revolver which he had hidden in the back of the house. Allison concluded with a reference to the new evidence the Crown had obtained in the trial.

Surgeon A. H. McPherson having given evidence, with plans of the scene of the murder.
Anthony Orr, the husband of the dead woman, was called to the stand. He said that he left his farm with Allison, at 12 o'clock, on the morning of Aug. 9. When he returned at 10:30 Allison had a gun in his hand, and he was laughing and grinning, and when witness asked him what he was doing, Allison said he had shot the woman with a revolver which he had hidden in the back of the house. Allison concluded with a reference to the new evidence the Crown had obtained in the trial.

HELPUED BY MASKED MEN.

Light-Bakery Wagon Driver
Last Night—Hockey Money
Toronto, Dec. 7.—Mr. Scott, who drives the bakery wagon for Mr. Bryson, was held up last night by two masked men on Mackenzie avenue and robbed of between \$20 and \$25.
Mr. Scott jumped off his wagon to go to the door of one of his customers, when the two men came up to him. One put a revolver to his head and demanded him not to move, while the other took a sharp knife and cutting the strap, which held his money stave over his shoulder, ran off with the contents.
The robbery occurred just inside the city limits, near the C. P. R. tracks, Mackenzie avenue being a continuation in the westward of Lansdowne avenue in the city.

COLLISION AT SEA.

One of the Atlantic Greyhounds Strikes the Allan Line Steamer Corvan
Halifax, N.S., Dec. 7.—The Allan Line steamer Corvan, from New York, bound for Glasgow, put in here yesterday in a collision at sea with a big ocean liner, name unknown. She came down on the Corvan at 12 o'clock Saturday night during a dense fog, suddenly appearing on the port side in a mist and dashing past like a race horse. The officers on board saw the unknown Atlantic greyhound tower above them for a moment in the night, then they knew that their ship had been struck, and the next moment they were alone on the waste of fog enshrouded water. The only sound heard was that of the impact of the two ships came together. It was a glancing blow, the colliding steamer's bow having forged ahead of the Corvan's before the steamer could stop. Then the two must have been swung around by the collision, for the Corvan was struck almost immediately near the stern. The second shock was not nearly so heavy as the first. Four of the bow plates were smashed in, several feet of bulwarks and rails were carried away, angle iron were broken and the deck shattered for a space of a few feet. No one was seriously injured. There were four hundred cattle on deck, but none of them were injured. All the damage was found to be above the water line, but it was rather more than would have been safe to venture across the Atlantic with the loss on goods, \$1000; insured in London and Lancashire for \$500; J. W. McDonald's loss on goods, \$200; insured in Northern for \$300. George Keys' stock partially saved; insured for \$1000 in Sun and \$1000 in Caledonia; his Bell Telephone Company's loss, \$200; covered by insurance.

WHERE IS JOHN ORMISTON?

The Collector of Island Revenue at Gananoque Has Gone Somewhere.
Gananoque, Dec. 7.—There was quite an excitement in the town when it was learned that John Ormiston, collector of customs at this port, had disappeared. He was last seen on Friday night, Dec. 3, about 6 o'clock, and although some few were suspicious on Saturday, it was not generally known until yesterday, when Mr. J. Sturgeon, Government officer, arrived and took charge of the office. His whereabouts is unknown, but it is supposed he has gone to the United States. Some think the trouble is owing to shortness in his accounts, but the majority are of the opinion that he is suffering from temporary derangement of the mind, as he has been rather sullen of late owing to trouble and sickness, by which he has been afflicted during the past summer. He was also secretary of the Gananoque Water Power Company and deputy collector of island revenue, was a prominent society man and in school matters.
