FARM AND HOUSEHOLD.

What is a silo, and what is ensilage? From the Book of Ensilage.

As a general rule, silos should be built rectangular in form, the width being about one-third the length, and the height about two-fifths of the length, and if possible should be sunk about one-half below the surface of the ground.

It is a side hill near the stables, so that the surface of the earth will come nearly to the top of the walls at one end of the silo, it will be found very convenient in filling the silo, in weighing the ensilage, and in removing the weights as it is filled out.

Where it is not convenient to get stone for weights, heavy logs of wood may be used, sawed in pieces about three feet in length, and placed on end all over the planks which cover the ensilage; three feet of wood being equal to one of stone.

WEEKLY REVIEW.

PRODUCE.

Since our last report there has been a perceptible fall in Liverpool quotations, with the prospect of a further decline within the next few days. Flour, on the 11th, was quoted at 11s. 1c on Tuesday it was 11s. 6d. Spring wheat within the same time fell 1/2c, red wheat 7/4, white wheat 11/4, club 2 1/2, corn 1 1/2, and cheese 2s. On the other hand pork, bacon, and lard advanced, the former going up 1/2c, bacon 2s. 6d., and lard 1/4c. Under the heading of "The Foreign Market," the Chicago Inter-Ocean speaks as follows:—

"The continued prosperity of the country for the coming year depends very much upon its success in finding a market for its surplus of wheat. But if the reasoning of the London Telegraph is to be accepted without reserve, there is no question as to the ability of American and Canadian wheat in England at less than the minimum price of producing wheat there. The Telegraph observes that the price at which wheat is now selling, 43s. 9d. per quarter, or 11s. 30c per bushel, is 'just a little lower than the minimum cost of production in the United States' of 23c per quarter, or 5 1/2c per bushel, allowing for the cost of freight, and the cost of transportation from the farms in the West to Liverpool—a very liberal allowance—we see, says the Telegraph, 'what margin of profit Americans must have.' It is 13s. 6d. per quarter, or 34c per bushel. We need not say that we do not know what 'the average cost of producing wheat all over the United States' and Canada may possibly be, and do not believe that any one does. Wheat is not sold for export from the Eastern or Southern States, nor to any great extent east of Illinois, and the cost of transportation from the farms in the West to Liverpool is not more than 10c per quarter, or 2 1/2c per bushel. The rate at this time is 12c, by lake and canal from Chicago to this city, and 10c from there to Liverpool, based on the average cost here and at Buffalo. But there must still be added the cost of transportation from the farms to Chicago, and the elevator and other charges there. Rates are high just now, and 31c will rarely cover all the cost of transportation to Liverpool from the farms where wheat is actually exported, from the farms on which it is grown to Chicago or to some other Western port of shipment, is probably as much as 15 cents per bushel, and for this reason that direct shipments of grain eastward by rail from the nearest railway station to the farms have increased so much more rapidly than the shipments from the principal Western markets."

The American grain markets remain nominally unchanged. Occasionally there is a slight advance, but the figures back to their old places. Considering that new grain will soon be moving, the prices remain high. Receipts of wheat at Milwaukee, according to reports, are very small, and moderate shipments. Old No. 2 is in fair demand at that place, the prices ranging from 84c to 86c.

In the home market business is light, with few transactions. Speculators in grain feeling assured that figures must come down, and they are, therefore, holding off. Another, and a principal cause for the inactivity displayed, is that the stocks in store are merely nominal. On the 18th the total stocks were—Flour, 255,000 bush; fall wheat, 4,700 bush; spring wheat, 8,700 bush; oats, 2,200 bush; barley, 1,400 bush; rye, 171 bush; rye, 60 bush. On the same date last year they were—Flour, 300,000 bush; fall wheat, 12,000 bush; spring wheat, 5,200 bush; oats, 2,400 bush; barley, 2,200 bush; rye, 100 bush. No. 2 spring was effected at \$1.10, and No. 1 old at \$1.10. On Tuesday, five cars No. 2 fall for September delivery, were sold at \$1.05, and one car No. 1 old at \$1.05. The seller afterwards purchased at \$1.05, and on the same terms, at \$1.05. At the close of last week a lot of 400 barrels of superior flour cleared at \$1.25, which appears to be the ruling price for the same grade to-day. Extra quotes at \$1.35, and superior extra, \$1.30 to \$1.35. The first sample of new fall wheat four and shovels on "Change" cleared at \$1.25, and our carload was sold at \$1.25. As the wheat and our carload was sold at \$1.25, the above quotations will take another drop. Several cars of old oats were taken up at 1c, if ranging from 35c to 37c. Rye is offering at 80c to 85c, but none is offered. Barley, No. 1, if offered, would sell at 60c.

On the 22nd new grain is commencing to make its appearance, but as yet in large quantities. During the week the price of new fall ranged from \$1.10 to \$1.15. Barley sold at 57c to 58c, peas 57c to 58c, rye, 60c to 65c, (new) rye, 60c to 65c, and rye, 60c to 65c. Trade in wood appears to be firm, holders being unwilling to sell for less than 25c. One large dealer offered as high as 25c, for a choice lot of about 15,000 ft, which was refused, but afterwards sold to another dealer at a slight advance. Small lots, however, go at 25c. Hay sold from 7c to 10c for new, and for old brought 8c. Stems commands from 9c to 12c, according to quality, and 4c to 5c for old. The vegetable market was well attended, but no material change in prices, and the market for hops, in potatoes, which now sell at from 30c to 45c per bushel.

Flour—There is more offering than at this time last week. Superior sold at 83c, and equal lots at 82c to 81c. Extra No. 1, at 81c to 80c. Superior extra still scarce, and worth nominally from 85c to 90c for fall and spring chickens.

Wheat—No sales reported. Good brands are worth from \$1.00 to \$1.10. Western wheat free, however, from any special excitement. The aggregate sales will be about \$1,200,000.
