

# BLOWN TO DEATH IN CHURCH

A BOMB PREMATURELY EXPLODED BY A SWING DOOR.

he Explosive Was Intended To Be Thrown Among the Worshippers-The Miscreant Struck On the Arm By the Door and Horribly Mangled - His Identity Established.

PARIS, March 15.-At 2 o'clock this atternoor a bomb was exploded in the Church of the Madeleine. One person sup-posed to be the author of the explosion was killed and several others were injured. The police made one arrest.

The Anarch Disembowelled, The Abbe Le Rebours, who is attached to the Church of the Madeline, was stand-ing near the inner swinging doors when the explosion occurred. His version of the affair is this:






