SOMETHING OF OLD TIME

Ladies Want a Meeting Place With a Restaurant Attachment.

Different Organizations of Women Join Hands to Form a Project to Provide a Place of Entertainment—Grand Truck Foundry Not to Be Moved—Ex-Mayor News from the Ambitious City.

Hamilton, Jan. 13.—(Special.)—The Local Council of Women have their eyes on a place which has long been needed in the city, i. e., a place where all the societies can meet for business or entertainment, and in conjunction with it a restaurant providing meals at reasonable rates. Representatives of the Y.W.C.A., Ladies' Historical Women's Art Association, the Daughters of the American Revolution, the Spaulding Wheel Club, Women's Morning Musical Club and the Alumnae Association, met at the Y.W.C.A. Hall this morning under the chairmanship of Mrs. Hoodless, to discuss the project. A committee of five was appointed to look into the matter. The cost is placed at \$30,000, and Mrs. Hoodless has charge of the correspondence.

Manager Hays Alloys Rumor.

The statement in this morning's World regarding the future of the G.T.R. foundry in this city is confirmed to-day by the fact that the manager of the plant, J. H. Hays, General Manager Hays, who is in Windsor.

WOMAN GOT PREFERRED.

Mrs. H. A. Boomer Appointed to the Chair of London School Board—Mayor Wilson's Inaugural.

London, Ont., Jan. 13.—The City Council for 1898 held its inaugural meeting to-day and appointed the following chairmen of committees: Ald. Hugh M. Douglas, Board of Works; Ald. W. H. Whitney, No. 1 Committee; Ald. Charles Taylor, No. 2 Committee. The Women's Christian Temperance Union managed to get its representative, Mrs. H. A. Boomer, one of the two newly-elected members, to the Council. The address was given by Mrs. Boomer, who is the first woman to have been appointed to the Council. The Council has appointed a woman to the Board, and there is lively fight in the Council over the question. The vote resulted in a tie and the Mayor voted Mrs. Boomer, and she was elected. They plainly told the Council that the appointment was not desired on the ground of "seniority," but that Mrs. Boomer was the better qualified person. In his inaugural address the Mayor commended the system of appointments, and recommended that on the expiration of the term of office of the members of the Council, the City Council should elect the city to its own electric lighting. The contract with the Telephone Company, which expires in June, was also referred to and the City Council was asked to renew the same is to be considered.
