NO MOSQUITOES, NO FEVER.

Infection Carried Only by Insects During First 3 Days' Illness.

Washington, Aug. 2.—The public health and marine hospital service has issued a circular on the prevention of yellow fever.

No mosquitoes and no yellow fever, is the motto announced in black letters at the top of the circular.

CITY'S PENALTY SUITS

AGAINST STREET RAILWAY

Judge Snider, as Referee in Case, Orders Company to Pay \$18,100 for Non-observance of Schedule Laid Down by City Engineer.

The city wins the penalty suits against the Toronto Railway Company, and by the judgment of Judge Snider, which was announced yesterday, the suit was commenced on May 2, 1904, and for every day since so that the city's claims against the company now total \$45,000. This finding of Judge Snider practically carries with it the results in the remaining suits pending, and leaves the company liable to the city for \$100 a day until the city engineer's schedule is reasonably complied with.

The suits came before the judge, court last spring and Mr. Justice Street referred them to Judge Snider to take evidence and report a finding. The evidence of the city was based on the city engineer's records of the service, and the issue turned on whether or not the company under their agreement was bound to reasonably carry out the timetable ordered by the city engineer.

Judge Snider's finding is that the agreement requires the street railway company to reasonably conform to the city engineer's schedule. It must be shown that the company has a legal vacation in over and the company will have fourteen days to appeal to the city engineer, and if the company fails to do so, the case will finally be taken to the city council.

The city authorities are jubilant. General Manager Fleming has nothing to say about it.

In giving his judgment of the case, Judge Snider reviewed the claim made by the city—the condition of the agreement which gave them the right to make the schedule or timetable of day and night car service that they should recover \$100 a day for each day of non-compliance. "On the side of the railway company they contended that the agreement under which the city sued did not refer to a service of cars reasonably complying with the city engineer's timetable, which may in itself be unreasonable, but refers to regular or proper cars, or at most in not giving a service of cars reasonably sufficient for the accommodation of the passengers, and having regard also to the service of cars on similar lines in other cities. Little evidence of the reasonableness in other view of the service of cars provided by the company has been given by the company, but the city has shown that the burden of proof is on the company."

Judge Snider in giving his judgment said that he believed that the city engineer's schedule was a reasonable one to make a timetable relating to the running of the cars day and night, and that they should comply with it. Other than the busy hours of the day, the judge found that the company had failed to comply with the schedule of the city engineer had been obeyed.

However, during these busy hours from 7:30 a.m. to 8:30 p.m., the company ran 685 trips of cars on sixteen routes instead of the 1211 which the city engineer demanded. The judge found that the company only ran 390 trips instead of the 685 which the city engineer required. Between 7 and 8 p.m. there was an average of 100 trips.

Other things where the company has failed were in speed and service of cars, and intervals between cars.

Most important of all was the statement made by Judge Snider in regard to the length of time that the company had been at fault. He said:

"I find that on the 181 days in question the defendants were able to run the equipment to comply much more nearly with the said timetable of the city engineer than they were able to comply fully with the required night service."

In case of error.

As directed by the court, Judge Snider added the following:

"In case I am in error in holding that the breaches of the service as determined by the city engineer's schedule, in manner of running the cars, or at most in not giving a service of cars reasonably sufficient for the accommodation of the passengers, and having regard also to the service of cars on similar lines in other cities. Little evidence of the reasonableness in other view of the service of cars provided by the company has been given by the company, but the city has shown that the burden of proof is on the company."

Judge Snider in giving his judgment said that he believed that the city engineer's schedule was a reasonable one to make a timetable relating to the running of the cars day and night, and that they should comply with it. Other than the busy hours of the day, the judge found that the company had failed to comply with the schedule of the city engineer had been obeyed.

However, during these busy hours from 7:30 a.m. to 8:30 p.m., the company ran 685 trips of cars on sixteen routes instead of the 1211 which the city engineer demanded. The judge found that the company only ran 390 trips instead of the 685 which the city engineer required. Between 7 and 8 p.m. there was an average of 100 trips.
