EQUATION OF TIME.

—o—

It is only a few days in the year that a regular clock or watch agrees with the Sun in shewing true time.

Clocks and watches are constructed so as to divide time equal ;— whereas the Sun, by reason of the obliquity of the ecliptic and her unequal motion in different parts thereof, divides time unequal—hence the difference called Equation of Time. The following Table will show how many minutes should be added to, or subtracted from any hour shewn by a Sun-Dial, in order to regulate a watch to mean time.

Examples.

Required to regulate a Watch to mean or equal time, on 21st Feb.

Look for Feb. 21, and opposite to it you will find 14 minutes to be added to Solar in order to find the mean time, therefore when the Dial shows any hour, set your watch 14 minutes faster.

Required to regulate a Watch on the 3d October, to equal time ?

Look for October 3, and opposite to it, you will find 11 minutes to be subtracted from Solar in order to find mean time ; therefore set your Watch 11 minutes slower than any hour shewn you by the Dial.

- A red flag, an Enemy's merchantman,
- An Union Jack over neutral or enemy's signals, the vessel is detained, or a prize,
- A white flag over any signal, vessel bears a Flag of Truce,
- A ball at the mast head—vessel is on shore or in distress: should immediate aid be necessary, guns to be fired.

Time of going through the Falls.

THE Falls are level (or still water) about three hours and an half on the Flood, and about two hours and an half on the Ebb, which makes it passable four times in 24 hours, about 10 or 15 minutes each time.—No other rule can be given as much depends on the floods in the River St. John, and the time of high water or full sea, which is often hastened by winds, and in the proportion to the heighth of them.
