Annual Meeting.

St. Andrew's Hall, Jan. 24th, 1894.

The Annual Meeting of the congregation was held at 8 o'clock, P.M. The Rev. Mr. Mackie was appointed Chairman, and opened the meeting with prayer.

Mr. R. R. Creighton was appointed Secretary.

The minutes of the last congregational meeting were read and confirmed.

The following Reports were read:

The Kirk-Session Report, by Mr. Mackie; the Managers' Report, by Mr. McIntyre; the Women's Home Association Report, by Miss A. Davidson; Supplementary Revenue Report, by Mr. McIntyre; the Sunday School Secretary's Report, by Mr. Pollie; the Sunday School Treasurer's Report, by Mr. W. T. Minnes; the Young Women's Guild Report, by Mr. T. Donnelly; the Women's Foreign Mission Report, by the Rev. Dr. Mowat; the Young Men's Guild Report, by Mr. W. T. Minnes. All of which were received and adopted, except that clause of the Church Debt Interest Fund Report referring to the resignation of the present Treasurer, Mr. R. S. Dobbs.

The following resolution was unanimously adopted:

The meeting has learned with profound pleasure of the legacy given to the church by the late Mrs. Barclay, especially when it is remembered that this good lady was possessed of very limited means, Mrs Barclay, was a devoted adherent of St. Andrew's, and one who always had its best interest at heart, and we desire to place on record the recognition of her beneficence. "She did what she could."

It was moved by Rev. Dr. Grant, seconded by Mr. Macdonnell, and resolved:

That Messrs. W. T. Minnes, John Pollie, and S. W. Hobart be appointed Managers to succeed those retiring.

On motion of Mr. W. T. Minnes it was resolved:

That the names of the following gentlemen be placed on the Reception Committee, viz.: Messrs. John Craig, Jas. Cannon and John Mackerras.

It was resolved:

That Misses Smith, A. Davidson and M. Harold be appointed a committee to assist the Treasurer of the Church Debt Interest Fund in a canvass of the congregation for subscribers thereto.

It was moved by Mr. Jas. Minnes, seconded by Mr. Jas. Lesslie, and resolved:

That a collection in aid of the Sunday School Library be taken on the first Sunday in May next.

On motion of Mr. John McIntyre, seconded by Mr. Jas. Minnes, it was resolved:

That Messrs. John Kinghorn and W. Gill be appointed Church Auditors for the year.

The Benediction was pronounced by Mr. Mackie and the meeting closed.

Kirk-Session Report.

The Kirk-Session respectfully report to the congregation that the Sabbath Services have been regularly conducted all through the year and have been well attended.

The Wednesday evening Service has also been appreciated by increased numbers, the average attendance being eighty-five.

The Sacrament of the Lord's Supper has been celebrated three times during the year instead of four, as, owing to a new arrangement of dates of observance, it had been kept for the fifth time just at the close of the preceding year.

The Sacrament of Baptism was administered to 17 children, the administration in almost all instances taking place in the homes.

In the Church records 15 marriages have been registered, and 20 deaths.

During the year 42 persons have been added to the Communion Roll, 21 on profession of faith, and 21 by certificate.

The Kirk-Session has lost by death the valuable counsel of Mr. Alex. Ross. A record of their estimate of him has been placed in their minutes and is as follows:

"The Kirk-Session at this their first meeting since the death of Mr. Alex. Ross, resolve to place on record their sorrow at his removal and their sense of loss. They remember with gratitude to God his life-long attachment to the church; his valued services as teacher in the Sabbath School for nearly fifty years; his work as a manager, trustee, as an elder for the last six years of his life; and above all the gentleness and simplicity of his nature, his integrity of spirit, his life of faith, and his departure in confidence of a blessed immortality. They record also their sympathy with the widow and family, and commend them to the effectual consolation and abiding care of God."

The Session beholds with much satisfaction the increasing zeal that is animating the congregation and the peace and harmony that are its striking characteristics.

The Session desires to record their high sense of the services that have been voluntarily rendered the church by the members of the choir during the year, and return their very grateful thanks for the same.

The Session has examined the report of the Poor Fund, administered by the Home Association, and has ordered its publication as an appendix to their report.

Acknowledging God's goodness in all the way through the past and confidently trusting in Him for the future, the Session would exhort the congregation to all faithfulness and diligence in the work of the Lord.

Report of the Board of Managers.

ST. ANDREW'S HALL, JAN. 24th, 1894.

In presenting their report for the year ending 31st December, 1893, the managers desire to congratulate the congregation on the favourable financial results which have been attained. Notwithstanding the undoubted monetary stringency which has affected all classes, it is most gratifying to record our ability to meet our several engagements. This must be humbly recognized as a matter of devout thankfulness to Almighty God.

The managers beg to emphasize their appreciation of the zeal and untiring energy of the women of the congregation during the past year, who have so nobly raised upwards of \$2000 for the liquidation of our funded debt. The women also most generously undertook to pay off the cost of placing a new furnace, with all the requisite appendages, in the Manse.

It is to be hoped that the Treasurer of the Supplementary Fund will be cheered for his well directed efforts by a large reinforcement to his list of contributors. The managers would again earnestly urge on the congregation the continuance of this easy mode of paying off the interest on our secured liability.

To avoid the necessity of discounting and thus save the interest consequent thereupon, the managers, at the risk of perhaps an unwelcome persistency after the contributions which have been made, would invite the congregation to the payment, as much as possible, of the pew rents in advance, and also the regular attention each Sunday to the voluntary envelope collection.

The retiring managers are Messrs. D. Fraser, G. S. Hobart and D. Gibson, and the retiring ushers are Messrs. McArthur, G. Somerville, J. Pollie and W. T. Minnes.

Church Debt Interest Fund.

To the Chairman Board of Managers, St. Andrew's Church.

DEAR SIR,

In forwarding to you a detailed statement of the receipts during 1893, towards the fund for meeting the interest on the church debt I desire to offer the following remarks:

The total number of contributors was 119 only; of these, one, James Ballantyne, died; and another, Miss Urquhart, left Kingston to reside in Toronto. Inclusive of interest the total amount realized was \$306.68.

While acknowledging and thanking many for the regularity with which they have sent in their envelopes, it is my duty to point out that the scheme is a complete failure, utterly failing, as it does, to meet the purpose for which it was intended. A sum of \$900 was wanted, and only a little over one-third has been collected, a very large number of the congregation having failed to take the matter up.

To ensure success I must have 300 contributors at \$2.60 each, and if by the end of March next this number has not been reached, or nearly reached, I resign the treasurership and leave the scheme to be worked by other hands; meanwhile, all who wish the church well, and who have not already notified me, should lose no time in intimating to me the amount they are willing to give, 5, 10 or 15 cents per week.

Two teachers, Miss Fowler and Miss McIlroy have gone out with their classes, the places being eagerly filled by earnest young ladies. The pictures used for the last year have been a great source of interest to the children and particularly helpful in the review of the lessons each quarter.
