FIFTY-SEVENTH ANNUAL REPORT.

1893-4.

REPORT OF BOARD OF MANAGEMENT.

1. The Trustees and Managers of the Toronto House of Industry beg to submit their Fifty-Seventh Annual Report of the affairs of the Institution.

INMATES.

2. Applications for admission to the House are steadily on the increase, and for a considerable portion of the year the Managers were obliged to avail themselves of a portion of the Casual Lodge for the accommodation of regular inmates, the present building being totally inadequate to meet the wants of the increased population. Owing to the crowded state of the House, it is impossible to properly classify the inmates or supply the necessary infirmary wards, a considerable number being affected with chronic disorders.

The Management would also call attention to the necessity of adding a department to the Institution to accommodate an increasing class of respectable aged, but friendless people, who could here find a permanent home in separate apartments at a moderate cost to themselves.

The erection of a wing combining this work and a Chapel where all the inmates could assemble for divine worship would fill a long felt want of the Institution.

OUTDOOR POOR.

3. Owing to the large number of laborers and artisans unemployed during the winter, there was a considerable increase in the applications for outdoor relief. The total number of families

relieved during the winter was 2,343, comprising 10,695 persons, at a cost of \$13,426.25, or per capita \$1.29. A comparison with the previous year shows an increase of twenty-five per cent. the number of families relieved being 1,900, comprising 8,457 persons.

CASUAL POOR.

4. The Management would invite the attention of the citizens to this department, which furnishes temporary lodging to the homeless. An inspection would show comfort and cleanliness far in advance of many lodging places, for which regular fees are exacted.

The Lodge, however, is not for the accommodation of persons having money to provide themselves a bed; but while it was not taxed at any time during the winter to its utmost capacity, many citizens have been importuned unnecessarily for "a ticket for a bed" on the plea that admission was refused to the Lodge or other false representations.

5. The full reports following from the Executive Casual Poor, and the Visiting Committees also the Superintendent's report and the Treasurer's Statements furnish ample and interesting details of all the work carried on during the year by the Institution.

6. For several years past the Corporation Grant for the distribution of coal and bread to the city poor was inadequate, and in consequence the indebtedness on this account had seriously accumulated.

The debt being contracted at the request of the city authorities, the Management have the gratification to report that on the recommendation of the Executive Committee, the Council recently granted a sufficient sum to place the Institution entirely out of debt.

7. Public attention has frequently been called to the expense of the management of the charity, and many very misleading statements have been made, the most serious report having arisen through a mistake of the Government Inspector, and which occurs in his published report presented to the Ontario Government, representing the cost of maintenance of inmates in this Institution as being per capita fifty-one cents per day, whereas it

is in reality only ninteen and one-quarter cents. The error is occasioned by the Inspector including in the cost of maintenance of inmates the distribution to 8,457 Outdoor Poor.

It has also frequently been charged that a large part of charitable funds are spent in salaries, etc., in some cases over fifty per cent. of the receipts.

The Management calls attention to the amount paid by the Institution on salaries, etc., which will be seen to amount to only about four and one-half per cent. of the receipts.

8. We beg to acknowledge with thanks the usual generosity of the Consumers' Gas Company in donating 2,000 bushels of coke for distribution amongst the Outdoor Poor.

9. Religious services are regularly maintained by ministers of the various denominations, assisted by a number of visiting ladies, who take charge of the music.

10. The Superintendent, Mr. A. Laughlen (ably assisted by his wife) and Mrs. North, the Matron, continue to discharge their respective duties to the entire satisfaction of the Board.

THE ANNUAL REPORT OF THE EXECUTIVE COM-MITTEE, APRIL 17TH, 1894.

The Executive Committee of the House of Industry desires to express its gratitude to the citizens of Toronto, to the various business firms and to the corporation of the city, for their expression of confidence in the management of this institution by their liberal support. It is happy in the fact that it can place before its supporters such a statement of the use of the funds, which will not only satisfy the contributors and justify the action of the corporation in the opinion of the citizens; but, increase the confidence of the supporters. In the first place, it is strictly non-denominational; it has no object whatever in helping one more than another; it has avoided sectarian agencies which would like to use the House as a tool for special interests and

has entrusted its visiting to men above reproach, who are well known to the citizens, and to whom our warmest thanks are due.

It desires to set before the public the economy which has been used. It has a Superintendent and Matron of the House; a Superintendent for the casual ward (with one or two assistants at a nominal sum), and a Physician, to whom very moderate salaries are paid and all the rest is voluntary.

It has relieved 2,343 families, of which 784 came for the first time; 1,278 have been helped from one to four years; and 281 from five to thirty years; its expenses have been:—

New heating apparatus was put in the House by Bennett & Wright, which has reduced the amount of coal consumed, slightly, and has given far more heat and an intense amount of satisfaction.

The extra casual ward, for the lowest tramp class, is now all that human ingenuity, at present, can make it. It has a granolith floor, perfectly dry and well drained, the walls are of brick and constantly whitewashed, and the room purified by burning sulphur, camp beds are used and these are kept clean, being steamed as required.

The committee are thankful that those employed by them to superintend are still spared to them on account of their efficiency and character.

REPORT OF CASUAL POOR COMMITTEE.

To the Board of the House of Industry:

The total number of men Casuals who were in the Lodge for the years ending 31st March, 1890, '91, '92, '93, '94, was respectively 1,481, 1,247, 1,050, 996, 1,201. For the same years, the number who were only in one night was 530, 545, 426, 375, 470, or by percentages 35.7, 36.4, 40.5, 32.8, 39. The number of Casuals who were in the Lodge from one to three nights was 817.

The number of nights that any one of the remainder—384—was in the Lodge, ranged from three nights to 133 nights, or comparing the record for the same five years, we have 196, 166, 125, 124, 133, respectively, as the number of nights during which any one individual was in the Lodge.

The number who were in the Lodge for at least 100 nights for the same years and in the same order was 14, 24, 12, 15, 20.

The average number sheltered each night in the Lodge during the months of December, January, February and March was 62, or (counting the same individuals more than once) taking the years and the order as before, the numbers are respectively 75, 82, 60, 65, 62, or by percentages on total number in Lodge for these years, 5, 6·5, 5·7, 6·6, 5·2.

In addition to the 1,201 men Casuals, there were sheltered in the Lodge last year, 87 women.

During the season 758 cords of wood were cut and split by the men Casuals in the wood yard; for the past five seasons the number of cords cut and split was 404, 729, 804, 759, 758.

The Wayfarers begin to come into the Lodge about five in the afternoon, and no one of average orderly conduct is refused admission up to 10 or 12 o'clock at night.

Each Wayfarer must take a warm bath upon coming in, after which he is provided with a good clean night shirt and a comfortable bed in which he sleeps till about 6.30 next morning. Breakfast is at 7 o'clock, and work begins in the yard at 8 o'clock.

To cut, split, and pile a quarter of a cord of wood, requires from each man from two to three and one-quarter hours. The Wayfarers who wish can have a good bowl of soup and a liberal allowance of bread with it at noon each day after the assigned work is finished.

The labour test has been continued for the four winter months of December, January, February and March. This is the fifth winter during which your Committee has tried it. The reports of your Committee from year to year show that the effect of the labour test has been beneficial. But your Committee must express its conviction that more should be done for the wandering poor than has yet been done by the Board. Hitherto we have brought the tramp up to a certain stage in recovering industrious inclinations, but we have allowed him to slip from our hands before these inclinations have been formed into habits of industry. What the Board should now aim at is the establishment of a labour colony, to which all able-bodied and chronic medicants should be committed with interminate sentences. The incorrigible idlers and tramps need a thorough course of reformatory treatment; they should be kept in confinement until their bodies which are generally saturated with tobacco and alcohol, are renovated and brought under normal conditions; until they have received some necessary industrial training, and until there is some fair assurance that they will become, if discharged, producers instead of parasites. The effect of the labour test will be necessarily incomplete till this labour colony or farm is added to the woodyard.

REPORT OF COMMITTEE ON OUTDOOR RELIEF.

During the past year, there has been much greater demand on the House than on any previous year. Your Committee has special satisfaction in stating that with very few exceptions, excellent work has been done by the visitors, as the reports show that special care has been taken to send up to the House deserving cases.

One Meeting of Visitors was held in November 20th, 1893. The attendance was good. Important matters were considered, such as the labour test; how to detect fraud, etc., etc.

Soup has been distributed in four points: (1) The House; (2) West; (3) East of the Don; and (4) on Markham St., north of Bloor St.

Distribution began in January, and from 70 to 150 gallons were distributed daily. Entire cost, boilers, etc., included, \$550.52.

Bread has been distributed from seven points: (1) From the House; (2) from Bathurst and Arthur Sts.; (3) Margueretta and College Sts.; (4) 1152 Yenge St.; (5) 850 Yonge St.; (6) Oak and Sackville Sts.; (7) 804 Queen St. East. Number of loaves distributed, 51,024. Cost, \$3,619.67.

Groceries distributed, 8,447 pounds; consisting of oatmeal, rice, sugar and tea. Cost, \$514.

Families relieved, 2,343; Individuals, 9,407.

Coal distributed, $1{,}010\frac{1}{2}$ tons of hard; and soft, $30\frac{3}{10}$ tons. Cost for hard coal, \$5,858; for soft, \$166.65.

Wood, 345\frac{1}{2} cords. Cost, \$2,180. Carting, \$205.

Printing, etc., \$332,10. Total expenditure on outdoor poor, \$13,426.25.
