William Coy, the suspected murderer, was arrested by State Detective Pease at Westbury, and has been lodged in jail since 10 o'clock this morning. Pease, a Washington farmer, was out in the woods with his dog. The dog scratched around among the leaves and the earth, and made such a fuss that as the owner went to investigate, the body was found.

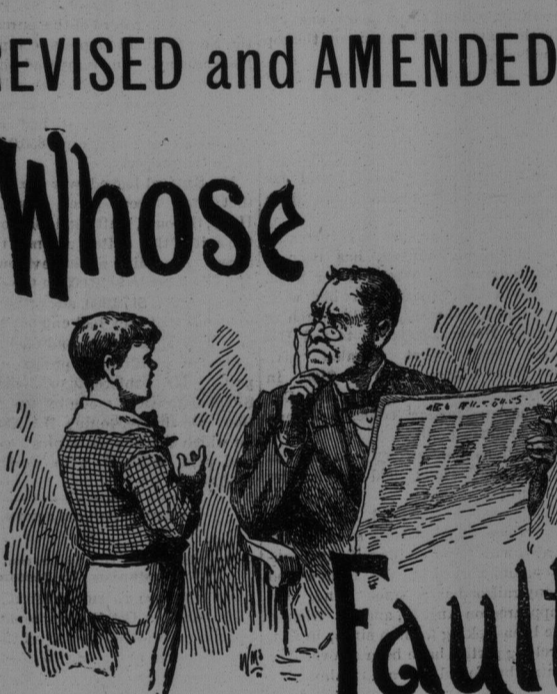
