British Capture Village of Lagnicourt and French Take Towns of Folembray and La Feuillee, South of the Coucy Forest--German Army Making Strong Resistance Before St. Quentin.

BRITISH MACHINE GUN FIRE DISPERSES TEUTONS IN NEIGHBORHOOD OF FAUQUISSART AND EAST OF YPRES-MUCH FIGHTING IN AIR EAST OF NIVELLE-ST. VAAST AND ARMENTIERES-FIGHTING NEAR MONASTIR.

London, March 26.—The British this morning attacked and cap-tured the village of Lagnicourt, according to the official report from British headquarters this evening. North of the Bapaume-Cambrai road thirty prisoners and a machine gun were taken. During the after-noon the Germans delivered counter-attacks from the east and north-east. These attacks the statement says, were repulsed. The text reads: Morth of the Bapaume-Cambral road we took thirty prisoners and a ma-chine gun. During the afternoon the enemy delivered determined coun-tattacks from the east and northeast, but were driven off. A third attack, caught in the open by our artillery, failed to develop.

Were Attacked by Bombs.

"Another bombing stack made by the enemy during the night upon our positions north of Beaumetz-Les-Cam-brai was repulsed. Parties of the ene-my who endeavored to approach our mes in the neighborhood of Fauquis-eart and east of Ypres were dispersed by our mechanic sur fire

art and east of Ypres were dispersed by our machine gun fire. "There was considerable artillery activity today by both sides. "East of Nivelle-St. Vaast and Ar-mentieres there was much fighting in the air yesterday, in the course of which two German machines were brought down and three others were driven down damaged. Seven of our machines are missing."
