

Sir John, on moving the second reading of the Franchise Bill, said the object of the bill was simply to provide for a system of representation which would be equitable and uniform in all the pro-vinces. The British North America Act lated that the franchise existing in the different provinces should be used for representation in the Dominion Parliament until otherwise determined by Dominion Legislature. The result was that the present condition of the electoral franchise was altogether anomalous and should no longer exist in a country own-

ing and drawing its inspiration from free institutions. At the outset it was a necesity that the Provincial franchise The House should apply because there was no Parliament to settle upon a Dominion fran-chise, but that necessity had long disappeared and it was an anomaly and contrary to the first principles of popular represen-ation, that Federal Parliament should not have control of the franchise by which its members are elected. 
