Any person who is the sole band of a family, or any mais over 18 years old, may homestead a quarter section o. available Dominion land in Manltobe, Baskatchewan or Alberta. The appli cant must appear in person at the Dominion Lands Agency or Bub-agency for the district, Bairy by proxy may be made at any spency, on certain souditions by father, mother, son, daughter, brother or elster of intending homesteader.

Duties-Big months' residence upor and cultivation of the land in each of a farm of at least 80 acres solely owned and occupied by him or by his father mother, son, daughter, brother or sis

Bach of six years from date of home-tiesd entry (including the lime required homestead patent) and cultivate fifty sorres extra.
