THE AFFAIRS OF IRELAND

AN AMENDMENT OF TREVELYAN'S REJECTED. Gladstone Considers the Vote Against Himself—Will he Retain?—Reported Hitting of Trevelyan.

LONDON, July 7.—In the house of commons, during the debate on the report of the commission on the Irish land question, Gladstone said that the government had taken measures unknown to parliament to operate against the secret societies.

The supporters of the government do not think that a ministerial crisis will result from the vote on Trevelyan's amendment. Gladstone declared that under ordinary circumstances he would have asked the cabinet to resign.

The defeat of the government was due to the defection of the liberal unionists, many of whom were not expecting a serious controversy on the report of the commission on the Irish land question.
