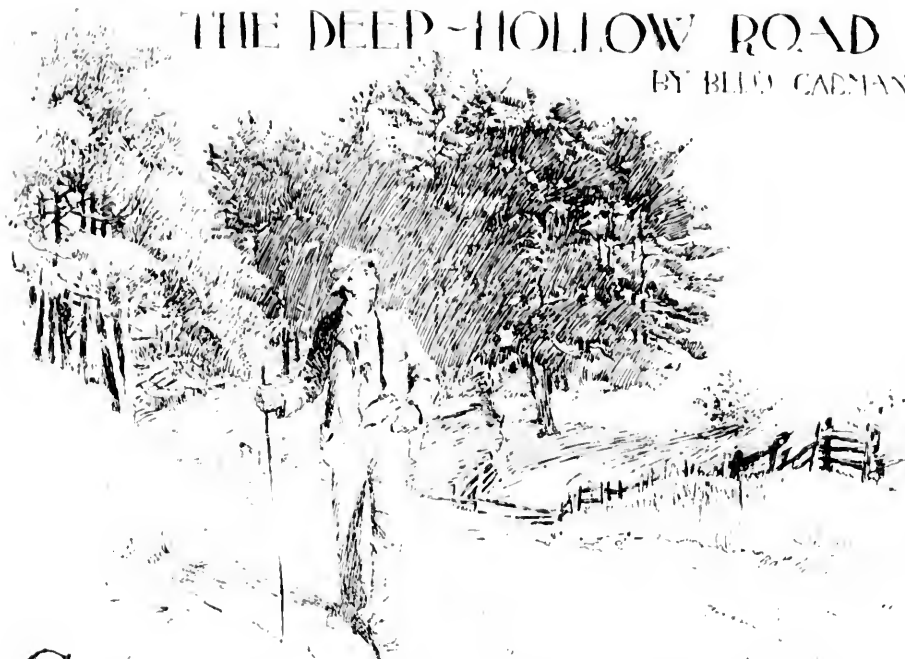




A Canadian Monarch.

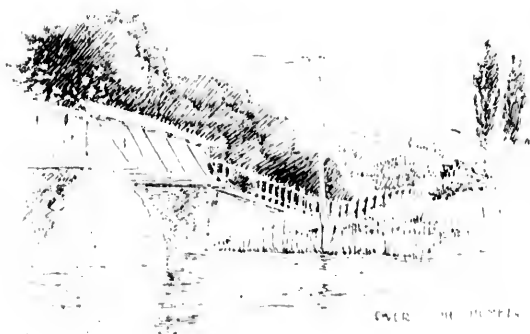

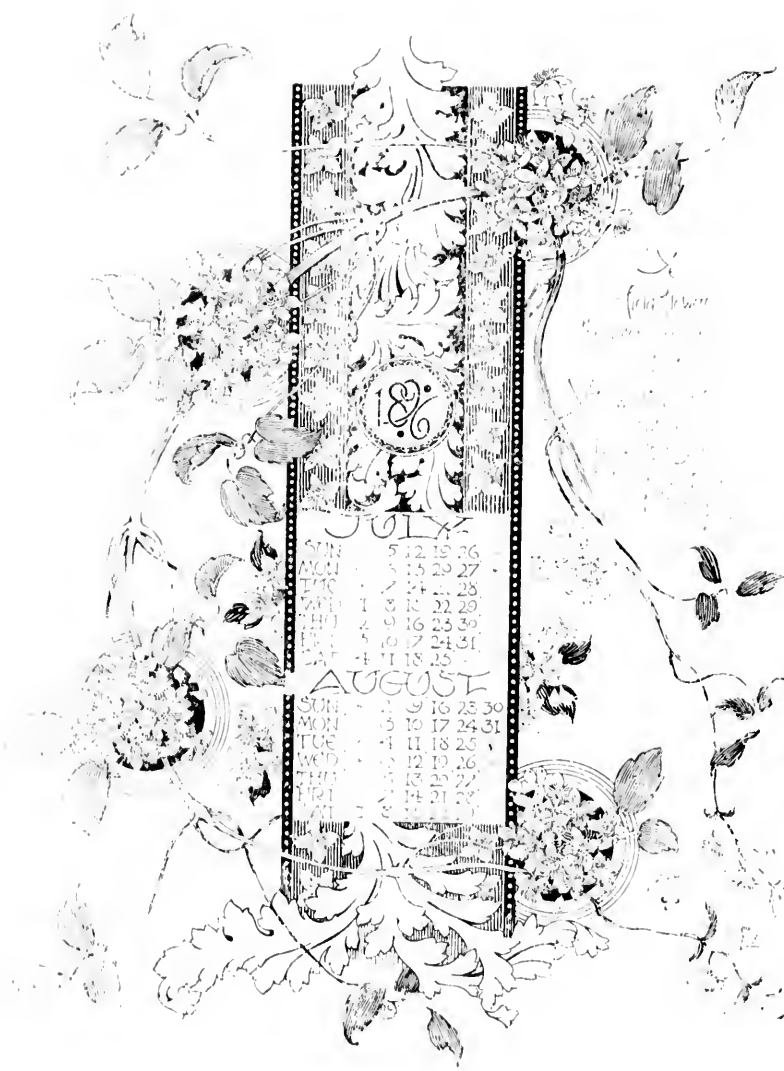
