# THE CITY OF REVELSTOKE.



The Trade and Railway Centre of a Vast and Wealthy Territory The Past Progress and Present Prospects of the Business Capital of North Kootenay An Extensive Mining, Lumbering and Agricultural Region.

**G**EOGRAPHICAL POSITION.—The City of Revelstoke, incorporated March 1, 1899, is the trade center of the vast district known as North Kootenay, and has sprung up within the last three years to a position of great importance among the rising towns of the Province of British Columbia. It is situated on a beautiful site at the second junction of the main line of the C. P. R. and the Columbia River. A branch line to Arrowhead, 28 miles south of Revelstoke, connects the town with South Kootenay, Fort Cay, Front Lake and the Shew. At present the connection is made at Arrowhead with the piloted line of steamers belonging to the C. P. R., but it is expected that this season the railroad itself will be extended through the wealthy mineral district known as the Garden of Kootenay Lake. Revelstoke is the outfitting point for the mining camp situated to the north of the main line, as far as the Big Bend of the Columbia and there is every prospect that during the summer a line of steamers will afford an easy means of transportation into that district, and further north to the rich valley of Camo River.

## A Big Railway Centre.

Owing to this unique geographical position Revelstoke is rapidly rising into prominence as one of the chief railway points on the C. P. R. system. Here are already located the head offices of all the chiefs of the district, the superintendent, chief dispatcher, bridge inspector and

surveyor. It is a divisional point, and large workshops have just been opened. Every year sees the accommodation afforded by the already extensive railway yard increased, and the importance of the place as a railway centre is even now well established and will continually increase.

#### Its Trade Territory: The Mines.

As a trade centre Revelstoke commands a wide territory, which, with the railway and steamboat communication now on the eve of being established, will become an exceedingly valuable one. There is in the best place the big stretch of rich mineral country, only just beginning to be prospected, lying north of the main line, up to the Big Bend of the Columbia, and further north up the wide valley of the Canoe River to the extensive and valuable mica deposits of Tete Jaune Cache. This immense district includes the famous gold fields which a little more than thirty years ago were the scene of the great "Big Bend stampede." The ground where the old miners worked is still rich in the yellow metal, and with the improved appliances of today will no doubt yet yield considerable wealth. There is one large hydraulic plant installed in the district now, and it is quite likely that other strong companies will follow the lead of the Chicago capitalists who own it, and put in plants to work the large area of gold bearing gravels found in this district. Besides the placer, the whole of North Kootenay is rich in gold and silver bearing quartz, and valuable finds of galena and gold-copper ores are being made every season, as the vast extent of the district becomes more thoroughly and systematically explored. East of Revelstoke lies the Illecillewaet district, the oldest mining camp in Kootenay, and one which is destined yet to come into prominence again.

South lie the Endeavour and Fish Creek camps, then which there are no more promising districts in Kootenay today. As soon as ever the railroad strikes through this wealthy mineral country, there will be a dozen properties shipping at once, as indeed some even now are, in spite of the difficulties of transportation, and in a few years after the iron horse has opened the district up the Silver Slocan itself will have to look to its laurels. Several mining companies have their head offices in Revelstoke, such as the Lilloet, Fraser River and Cariboo Goldfields, Ltd.; the Carnes Creek Consolidated, Ltd.; the Great Western Mines, Ltd.; the French Creek Co.; the Stoneleigh Co., and the place is destined to be the financial point from which all the mining done in North Kootenay will be handled.

#### Agricultural Resources.

The agricultural possibilities of the Revelstoke district are considerable. The soil along the Columbia is rich and there are large areas, which if cleared would make first class farming land. The heavy snow fall keeps the frost out of the ground in winter, and vegetation begins to spring up as soon as, or even before, the heavy blanket of "the beautiful" provided by nature disappears. Summer frosts are unknown, and storms of a nature to damage crops almost equally rare. So far

little has been done to develop these possibilities, but there are one or two market gardens close to Revelstoke, where strawberries and vegetables of all kinds are raised in abundance without trouble, strawberries in particular being a sure and enormous crop. Further north in the Canoe River valley it is reported that the conditions are singularly favorable for pastoral and agricultural pursuits. The country is open, with patches of timber, the natural grasses profuse, and the climate warm and the snowfall very light. There is no doubt that before long this favored region will attract settlers, and another Okanagan or Nicola valley be added to the province.

#### Lumbering Interests

The lumbering interests of the district are considerable. The country on the lower levels is practically one vast forest of cedar, hemlock, pine, fir and spruce, and owing to the greater humidity of the climate and large snowfall, the timber acquires much greater size than it does in South Kootenay, so that the North Kootenay mills supply not only their own district, but fill a big demand throughout the whole mining region of West Kootenay. There is no large mill in operation in Revelstoke, one at Compuhix, and one at Nakusp, while an extensive and valuable plant has been installed on the northeast arm of the Arrow Lake, opposite Arrowhead.

#### The Rising City of Revelstoke.

The City of Revelstoke itself is beautifully situated and nicely laid out along the banks of the golden Columbia, and surrounded on all sides by mountain scenery unsurpassed on the continent. It has every advantage, social and commercial, which a rising western town can afford. There are two chartered banks, stores of all kinds, six hotels, an excellent water system, electric light, telephone system, two newspapers, several resident doctors and lawyers, four churches—Anglican, Roman Catholic, Methodist and Presbyterian—the Salvation Army, a good public school and opportunities of obtaining private tuition, a large theatre, Masonic, Oddfellows, Foresters, Orange, Knights of Pythias and Sons of England lodges; three breweries, a sawmill, sash and door factory, steam laundry, daily trains and mails east, west and south; in short every factor necessary to make existence at once prosperous and enjoyable to the man of modern civilization. A glance through the pages of this directory will show the different interests represented in this town, and give a good idea of the callings and occupations of its rapidly increasing population. With regard to the latter, it is only necessary to point out that the first issue of this directory, published two years ago in 1887, only contained about 400 names. The issue for 1890 contains in the neighborhood of 1,000 names, and from the notes taken by the way while going round collecting names this year, the editor is inclined to think that the total population cannot be much less than 2,500 to 3,000.

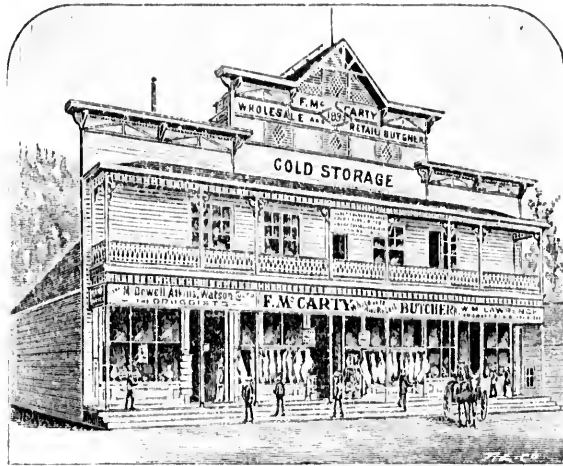
