MANY CONTINGENTS COMING. Conservatives Throat Province Taking Big Interest.

Full advantage is being taken of the extraordinarily low rate by which visitors to the Conservative demonstration on Wednesday next can secure ten days in Toronto at single fare. Large parties are being organized at the county centres throughout the province and from now on the incoming trains will be crowded with pilgrims to the political arena at Hamilton's Point. Among the contingents which are being organized are those from Bruce, Lincoln and Niagara, North Bruce, South Victoria, South Grey, Oxford, North Simcoe, North Grey and North Wellington.

The Conservatives of West Durham have chartered a steamer to bring them from Bowmanville, and it is expected that several hundred excursionists will come from that town. The steamer, which is being chartered by the local Conservative party, will also come over by steamer, and a special boat will leave for Port Dalhousie at 11 o'clock on the evening of the picnic.

Ex-Mayor John Shaw, chairman of the reception committee, is indefatigable in his efforts to bring the comfort and convenience of the visiting members of parliament and the delegates from the outside portions of the province. The afternoon will be devoted to an old-fashioned conservative picnic, with music by massed military bands and other attractions. The evening will be taken up by the grand rally, when speeches will be delivered by the leaders and other prominent public men.

That there is no immediate necessity for a new line from Quebec to Moncton is clearly apparent. But even if it is advantageous to have a somewhat shorter route than the present one, the carrying of it over to the Grand Trunk will be simply disastrous. Mr. Pettypiece refers to the heavy outlay which the Intercolonial has involved, and the excellent condition of the road bed and equipment at the present time. The total cost of the Intercolonial railway and its equipment up to June 29, 1902, was \$88,319,619.55. Of this total amount, \$12,941,705.69 was incurred during the last five years of the period ending on that date, principally in extending the road, improving its condition and adding new rolling stock. The Intercolonial has a rolling stock valued at \$10,000,000. As a result of this expenditure of the people's money by the government, the Intercolonial is one of the best pieces of railway in the country, both in standard road bed and equipment.

An order to show cause why the injunction should not issue was obtained by the artist's attorneys, comes up for argument to-day before Judge Dugro.

FOR A NEW FIRE STATION. Berkeley Street Firemen Likely to Get Improved Quarters.

The Board of Control held a short meeting yesterday morning to receive a report from Commissioner Fleming regarding repairs to the fire stations throughout the city.

Mr. Fleming recommended that a new hose house be erected on Berkeley street instead of spending \$4000 on repairs to the old station. He said the place was in such a state of disrepair that it was impossible to put it in a habitable condition, and in consequence of the fire chief's report that several of the men had fallen sick through the use of the building, a new one should be erected. This would cost about \$25,000.

Controller Richardson said a new hall was absolutely necessary, while Controllers Burns, Loudon and Oliver were in favor of an overdrift if any such appropriations were made.

Another \$500 was asked by the Commissioner for repairs and additions to Yonge-street and Dundas-street stations.

The recommendations were sent to the Property Committee.

Deciding Against Unions. The Dominion Bridge Co. was awarded the contract for the structural work on the new wing of the Isolation Hospital, provided they carry out the specifications only so far as possible.

This provision is placed so as to allow the company to get away from the clause binding them to employ union labor and pay the union scale of wages. The company objected to the rate claimed by the striking iron workers, and the city could get no offer from any other standpoint.

Groynes at the Island. Island residents will be glad to know that the work of constructing groynes at the south beach of Island Park will be proceeded with at once. Government Engineer Gray has so informed City Engineer Rust.

Strength in Numbers. Believing that in unity there is strength the members of the Board of Control will meet Mayor Urquhart in Ottawa next Thursday and aid him in fighting the Toronto and Hamilton Railway Bill, when the bill comes before the Railway Committee.

WHAT THE TROUBLE IS ABOUT. Mr. Lennox says that the contract was between himself and Tiffany & Co. When the new York firm got the measurements wrong, and Dodge and the Tiffany men mustered there, he was given the blame.

When the murals arrived they were too large. Dodge came to Toronto and wanted to solve the problem by simply dumping down the decorations to suit the space. None of the murals have as yet been accepted by the hotel company, and it is necessary to confine to the artist and the Tiffany firm.

RUSSIA'S LABOR TROUBLES. Fatal Rioting at Kiev—All Over at Odessa.

Kiev, Russia, Aug. 7.—Three workmen were killed and 24 wounded yesterday when the Cossacks fired on and charged the strikers who were attempting to interfere with railroad traffic. The rioters numbered 200. A magistrate, an officer and several soldiers were injured by stones.

The Standard's Odessa correspondent, under date of Aug. 2, says that all the trouble has now resumed work, that the strike is practically ended, but that the city will remain under martial law for at least another ten days. The strikers did not get all their demands, but in most cases were met with fair spirited compromises on the part of employers.
