EIGHTEENTH ANNUAL REPORT
OF THE
TORONTO MAGDALENE ASYLUM
OR
FEMALE HOUSE OF REFUGE.

The Managers of the Magdalene Asylum or Female House of Refuge, in issuing their Eighteenth Annual Report, would desire to acknowledge their sense of obligation to the Divine goodness, through whose blessing alone it is that they have in any measure been successful in ameliorating the unhappy condition of the fallen of their own sex.

The number of such who evince a desire to abandon their evil courses, and who, by freeing themselves from their former evil associates, seek to lead a new life, is not large; but to all such, of whatever grade, the Refuge is ever open to receive and welcome them. Their good resolutions are encouraged, and their hopes sustained, with that religious teaching whose aim it is to show what an evil and bitter thing it is to depart from the living God, and how blessed to have their hard hearts softened, their rebellious wills subdued, so that they who in time past have lived only in sin, may in time to come live only to God.

Although as a rule, appeals made to the friends of the inmates to receive them back to the bosom of their families, are unsuccessful, it is with much pleasure the Managers have to relate one pleasing exception. It is the case of an intelligent and well-educated young woman who, having been seduced from her home and her friends, had come to this city. Here she had regularly entered upon a career of sin, but was shortly afterwards, in the providence of God, led to see the folly of her course, and having incidentally learned the existence of this Institution, she sought its refuge, and upon the advice of those who had befriended her, she returned to her parents, by whom she was received with tears and affection; and in a letter since received, she expresses much gratitude for the kindness received during her stay in the Asylum, and her father

is very warm in the expression of his gratitude to Mrs. Aiken, the Matron, for the interest taken in his child. One such instance very fully illustrates the value of this Institution, and more than repays all the labor of those connected with it.

The number of inmates at the commencement of the year 1872, was 38. During the year, 31 were admitted and 33 left. Of those who left, 19 went to service (7 of whom returned), 1 returned to her friends, 2 were dismissed, 5 insisted on going out, 15 ran away (2 of whom returned). Of those who went to service, one was afterwards respectably married.

The amount received for work done by the inmates during the year was \$856.

In the Spring, preparations for the erection of the new building were just about to commence—the plans having been drawn—when the strike amongst the mechanics took place, on which account it was thought advisable to proceed no further till the Spring of this year, when it is hoped no obstacle will interfere to delay the erection of what has now become an absolute necessity, as it is very doubtful whether the present dilapidated building will stand the blasts of another Winter.

The Managers gratefully acknowledge their indebtedness to their numerous and generous friends for their liberal contributions, and will continue thankfully to receive what is so freely offered.

Their obligations to Dr. Robinson continue to increase. The calls upon his time and services have been very numerous.

It gives the Managers much pleasure to bear testimony to the zeal and fidelity with which the Matron and Assistant Matron continue to discharge their onerous duties.

They also embrace this opportunity to express their high appreciation of the labors of those gentlemen who continue to conduct Divine worship in the House, and those who from time to time impart spiritual instruction to the inmates.
