



These Courses, being given during the summer season, offer peculiar advantages to Students in Medicine. Among those may be mentioned the access to the Medical and Surgical Practice of the Marine and Emigrant Hospital, which contains 250 beds. In this Hospital are admitted during the period of navigation 1,500 patients, of whom from 4 to 500 are the most instructive and important surgical cases.

During the summer 1846, there were admitted 72 cases of Fractures, among which were:

The operations are important and frequent; and every means have been adopted to render them of the greatest advantage to the Students. Among the operations performed during the summer 1846 were those of Amputation, Lithotomy, Hernia, Trephine, Ligature of femoral and other vessels, Removal of the head of the Humerus, and of various tumours, &c.

The Students will have the advantage of Clinical Instruction in the said Hospital in the French and English language, and will have also access to a Library of the best standard Medical Works. Board can be readily obtained and at a very reasonable rate in the neighbourhood of the Hospital.
