

FEDERALS REPULLED

From their attempt to gain possession of Juarez after 8 hours fighting.

Battle to be resumed today and rebels expect to capture Federal general.

El Paso, Texas, Nov. 25.—Sleeping on their arms under a shower of rain after their flight from the Federal army, 7,000 rebels under Francisco Villa rested this morning in the hills north of Juarez. They expected to renew the battle today and hope to capture the Federal general.

The rebels say they are not in a hurry to capture General Salazar so that he may be hanged to a telephone pole in Juarez.

Though the Federals were repelled from their attack to gain possession of Juarez after eight hours fighting, General Villa believes that he must further harass the enemy if he would gain for his cause the territory north of Chihuahua City, and deliver upon them such a crushing blow that the Federal army of Chihuahua will be demoralized.

General Villa said that Federal forces are a few miles south of Chihuahua City, but with one of their troops, loaded with soldiers, ammunition and supplies, they are ready to attack the Federal army.

The general expects the Government troops to make a surprise attack to retake the train, and is making preparations to defend them.

Stretched in a semi-circle for 15 miles, the rebel troops presents formidable battle lines, and to the Constitutional leader has been unable to make all the desired attacks because of the lack of ammunition in which the whole of his army is equipped.

It is in this manner that he repelled the onslaught of the Federal army yesterday afternoon and forced them to await darkness for resumption of their attack which Villa, through a strategic move, turned into a rout.

With camp fires burning and all signs of camp life evident as the main wing at Sierra Blanca, Villa made a dash for the attack of the Federals. Reinforcements were sent to meet him at the point, from both left and right wings.

CROP-EARED WOLF DIES

HE WAS HEAD OF THE BLOOD
BAND OF THE BLACKFEET.

Celebrated Old-Time Chief Opposed
Any Sale of Indian Lands to the
Paleface—He Lived in a Modern
House and Was a Leader of
Agriculture Among the Indians
—Wore a Uniform.

With the passing of Crop-Eared Wolf, one of the last of the old-time Indians is gone. The deceased chief was head of the Blood band of the Blackfeet, whose reserve is the largest in Canada. Wolf was the chief adviser of some 1,200 Indians and nothing was done without his sanction. He was a man of the white man, but kind to the white man as long as he could not harm the Indian. He was a most careful guardian of Indian rights. Some years ago an agitation was raised by farmers in the vicinity of the reserve to buy a portion of the southern section. The Bloods refused to sell the land to the white man. A price was offered that would have made every Indian in the reserve independently rich, but the old chief resolutely refused to give his consent. He would have nothing to do with the sale of Indian lands to the white man. He insisted that the Indians were white people and the Indians as long as grass grew and water flowed, and from his position he could not be removed.

It is said that one of the last things Crop-Eared Wolf did before his death was to write a letter to the chiefs and people together and make them promise that they would never sell their land to the white man. Their tract is one of the most fertile

In the whole Province of Alberta, and would be valuable as a tract for colonization purposes.

Crop-Eared Wolf was the proud possessor of one of the medals given to the Indians by the Government of Canada some years ago. He always wore the uniform of a chief, which was a blue serge with brass buttons, supplied by the Indian Department.

He was an ardent advocate of peace. Many a turbulent time on the Blood reserve was brought to a happy close through his intervention. At the time the Indian murderer, Charcoal, was at large, Crop-Eared Wolf was one of the party constantly on the watch for his capture. It was through his help that Jas. Wilson, known as the Blood reserve at the time, was able to make the capture that brought the murderer to justice.

Crop-Eared Wolf had a greater sense of the fitness of things than is generally found in an Indian. He told that a photographer called on him once for the purpose of taking a picture of him. He refused to be photographed. He explained through the interpreter that it would have been a violation of good taste for him to be photographed. He said that he had been bought just in time to save the remaining pages of this literary treasure.

One of the most highly prized manuscripts of recent times, that of the Magna Charta, which is carefully guarded in a glass case in the British Museum, was saved from destruction by Sir Robert Cotton, who, so the story goes, one day had entered his tailor's shop precisely at the moment when the knight of the scissars was about to cut up patterns for the ancient-looking document with the aid of the ironing board. FORESTALD COLUMBUS.

Norwegian Boy Who Discovered
Newfoundland.

THE TRAPPISTS.

History of Silent Community Which
Flourishes Near Ottawa.
