There is the usual round of conjectures, expectation, disappointment and comment over the present political situation, although everything appears to be going with the current and in the natural order. Those who took the now successful politicians at their word, will, no doubt, soon be undeceived. If anyone expected that very radical changes of any sort would come with the advent of Mr. Laurier to power, they will find that they had no ground for their belief. We have, all along, held that whatever the late Opposition may have professed they would do in the way of materially changing the country's fiscal policy, they would abandon such professions should they succeed in defeating the Government, and the utterances of Mr. Laurier's organs since the elections indicate that no fear of any serious tariff change is justified by the present outlook. Indeed, Mr. Laurier, himself, has said as much, and leading Liberal newspapers are informing the country that a commission is to be appointed to make enquiries into the subject before any tariff changes whatever shall be effected. This, of course, may lay the party managers open to the charge of consulting the manufacturers and calling in interested parties to assist in "tinkering the tariff" to suit themselves, but it is a practical way of obtaining necessary information, and the Liberal papers which condemned it when resorted to by their opponents, will doubtless take a different and approving view of it when their friends find it necessary, now that they are at the helm of the ship of state. To use a familiar declaration of late Sir John A. Macdonald in a slightly altered form, our Liberal friends will be forced to affirm, beyond long, that they never advocated a decrease, but only a readjustment of the tariff.
