"From Rat Portage steamboats are taken up the lakes for Fort Francis and the Seine River country. The trip through the Lake of the Woods and up Rainy River is a most delightful one and is one continual panorama of beautiful scenery among the islands and lakes. 





ALBERTA'S TUNNEL.

It Will Be 800 Feet Long and Will Cut Two Ledges.

The Alberta company has started a 300-foot tunnel which is intended to cut two ledges. These ledges come down the south side of Columbia hill from the Columbia ground and are about 100 feet apart at the points where they will be cut by the Alberta tunnel.
