LONDON, Feb. 27.—Sir John Pannocote, the British Minister at Washington, being found not quite sympathetic to Lord Salisbury on many important questions of policy, will in future be assisted by a high official from here, probably Sir Charles Tupper.

The difficulty arises through Lord Salisbury's and Sir John Pannocote's divergent opinions on the fisheries question and the situation in Canada, which causes the dispatches between the three to be slightly incoherent.


