A note of warning is being sounded by the St. John press, that New York confidence men are laying traps for the unwary, or for those whose credence is smaller than their greed for money, by filling the country with circulars that pretend to offer counterfeits of U. S. Treasury notes for a consideration. It is not unlikely that some game will be played in this direction, and the public should take warning accordingly. The circles sent out, denominated the goods offered as green leaf articles, although the greater is written in an ambiguous strain, at the same time no one of ordinary perception could be deceived as to the nature of the offer, which amounts in fact simply to exchange good money for a proportionally greater amount of counterfeit money. This is their offer, but if any person happens to be fool enough or criminal enough to enter into negotiations with the sender of the circular, he will probably receive a paper in return or a bundle of notes for his money. Regular counterfeiters are not at all likely to run the almost sure chance of detection by carrying on negotiations for "showing the queer," through the hands of a counterfeiter. When these records get hold of a counterfeiter, they themselves or parties in whom they have the confidence, breed of natural crime, interest, or some other bond, set the article in motion. The business is best by every danger for real counterfeiters to ever give the slightest hint of their nefarious trade. One of the dodges used by the confidence man spoken of in the first paragraph of this article is to endeavor in his circulars to slip that on first glance, bears the appearance of having been cut from a newspaper, but which, in fact, has been printed in order in this form to impose on the reader, and give it contents an air of authority. This slip is headed "The Spurious Treasury Note," and goes on to give an account of the stealing of Treasury Bank Note plates has no other foundation than a statement to that effect, set in circulation some years ago, and which was at the time promptly denounced by the United States Government as an arrant falsehood. This circumstance, however, is not generally known to the public, and consequently is perfectly well aware of, and they lay their plans accordingly.

The Provincial Educational Association commenced at Halifax on Wednesday last. A large number of teachers were present. Teachers' education is too much theoretical and not sufficiently practical. For the holders of third class certificates gainfully by thoughtless something should be done to urge them to greater proficiency and the obtaining of a higher grade. The time of such certificates might be limited instead of permanent.
