## Explanation of the Articles in the Calendar.

These pages are calculated for Toronto, Quebec, Fredericton and Halifax, and for ordinary purposes will serve with sufficient accuracy for every city in the Dominion of Canada.

The times of the SUN'S RISING AND SETTING are given for the upper limb, and are corrected for refraction for Toronto, Quebec, Fredericton, Halifax, and Fort Garry.

The civil times both for the rising and setting of the Moon's centre are given for every day for Toronto, Quebec, Fredericton, Halifax, and Fort Garry.

The column, SUN ON MERIDIAN, gives the time that a watch should shew when the shadow of a sun dial is on the noon mark.

Moon's Age.—This column shews to the nearest tenth of a day the Moon's age at Toronto Noon.

The column, MOON ON THE MERIDIAN, gives the mean time at which the Moon's centre passes the meridian of longitude 4h. 46m. W. When in the column headed Moon's rising or setting, or Moon on meridian, the letters A.M. occur, unaccompanied by any number, they denote that the numbers given for the succeeding days relate to the morning, and those for the preceding days to the afternoon, but that the Moon does not rise or set or cross the meridian (as the case may be) on that day.

The MOON'S MERIDIAN ZENITH DISTANCES are given to the nearest tenth of a degree for a point in latitude 45° and longitude 4h. 46m. W. They are not corrected for parallax or refraction.

The column, UPPER TRANSIT OF POLE STAR, shews for every day the mean time at which the Pole Star makes its upper transit across the meridian of longitude 4h. 46m. W. It passes the meridian in the morning from April 10 to October 8. It passes the meridian twice on October 9; and in the afternoon during the rest of the year.

The time at which the lower transit of the Pole Star occurs may be found by adding 11h. 58m. 2s. to the time of its preceding upper transit.

The six last columns will serve with sufficient accuracy for the whole of Canada.

From the time of the upper transit of the Pole Star may be found the time of its greatest western or eastern elongation, by adding or subtracting the constants given in the annexed Table.

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**MOON'S PHASES.**—This Table gives the times for the four meridians when the moon passes the geocentric longitudes of 0°, 90°, 180°, and 270° east of the sun. It gives also the times of her greatest and least distance from the earth.

**TWILIGHT.**—In this table are given the times at which twilight begins in the morning and ends in the evening, i. e., the times when the sun's centre is 18° below the horizon.

**GREATEST ELONGATION OF THE POLE STAR.**—This column gives the greatest azimuth of the Pole Star east or west from the meridian as observed at a place in latitude 45°. When the greatest elongation corresponding to any other latitude is required, the number given in the column should be corrected by means of the following Table.

The 1st correction for the degrees of latitude is to be subtracted from the greatest elongation given in the calendar or added to it, according as the degrees of latitude are less or greater than 45°.

The 2nd correction, which is always additive, is found by multiplying the number given in the third line of the table by the number of minutes in the latitude.

Thus for latitude 43° 20'...1st correction = -3' 51"	2nd correction +1.9×20 = +0' 38"

If the altitude of Polaris above the horizontal plane observed at the time of its meridian transit be corrected for refraction, the latitude of the place of observation will be found by subtracting the polar distance from the altitude so corrected, for the upper transit, and by adding the polar distance to the corrected altitude, for lower transit.

By observing Polaris with a horizontal circle at the time of its upper or lower meridian transit, the direction of the meridian may also be found; but as its motion in azimuth at these instants is more rapid than at other points of its course, any error in the time will then produce the *greatest possible* effect on the azimuth. Near the time of greatest elongation, on the other hand, the change of azimuth is very slow; so that an error in the supposed time of observation will occasion a comparatively *small* error in the azimuth. On this account, the instant of greatest elongation east or west of the meridian is the time most favourable for the determination of the meridian.

Again, as the point of greatest elongation is the one at which the change of altitude is most rapid, any error in the time will produce a comparatively large error in the altitude. Hence this point of the star's path is the *worst* that could be taken for finding the latitude.

As the transits of Polaris and the times of its greatest elongation often take place when the sky is clouded, or during daylight, several days may sometimes pass without the occurrence of an opportunity favourable for these observations with Polaris.

To remedy to some extent this inconvenience, Tables are herewith given which contain the times of transit of two other circumpolar stars, with the intervals between the times of transit and of greatest elongation; and also the azimuths at the same instant.

In order to harmonize with the rest of the Calendar, where the times of transit of Polaris are placed, the transits of that star are given in *civil* time; for greater convenience, however, the transit of  $\delta$  and  $\epsilon$  Ursæ Minoris in the following Tables are in *astronomical* time. For the sake of brevity the times are given for the 1st, 11th, and 21st of each month, and also on those days when *two* transits take place.

The times of meridian passage on any intermediate day may be found with sufficient accuracy by subtracting the following numbers from the recorded time which next precedes it in the Table.

THE PLANETS.—The times of rising and setting of the five chief planets are calculated for Toronto, and are corrected for refraction. The times of culmination, although computed for the meridian of Toronto, will serve approximately for the whole of Canada. The meridian zenith distances, being designed merely to aid in finding the planets, have been given only to the nearest tenth of a degree, as seen from the latitude of 45°.

Star Table.

From the times of the Upper Transit of the Pole Star may be derived, with the aid of the following Table, the times of culmination, and of the rising and setting of the principal fixed stars, as seen from the parallel of 45° north latitude

To ascertain when any star found in the following Table will be on the meridian, add the number in the left-hand column of figures to the preceding meridian transit of the pole star given in the calendar. To find the time of rising of a star, subtract the number opposite to it in the right hand column of figures from the time of its meridian passage. For the setting of a star, add the same number to the time of its meridian passage. Those stars marked (.....) revolve in a circle of perpetual apparition, and do not rise or set at places in and to the north of latitude 45°.

Eclipses.

In the year 1874 there will be two eclipses of the Sun, and two of the Moon, and a transit of Venus over the Sun's disc.

I.—A total eclipse of the Sun, April 15-16, invisible in Canada. This eclipse is visible in South Africa, and as a partial one in the southern part of South America.

II.—A partial eclipse of the Moon, May 1, invisible in Canada.

III.—An annular eclipse of the Sun, October 9-10, invisible in Canada. This eclipse is seen as a central one in Siberia.

IV.—A total eclipse of the Moon, October 24.

The local astronomical mean time at which the various phases occur at different stations, are given in the following Table.

A POPULATION REGISTER.

In the ten years between the Census of 1861 and that of 1871, the natural increase in the population of England and Wales, by excess of registered births over deaths, was 2,705,598; and, after deducting the number of English emigrants, as reported by the Emigration

Commissioners, viz., 649,742, there remained an increase or gain of 2,055,856. But the actual increase shown by the Census returns of the persons enumerated in 1871 was 2,646,042, being 590,186 more than the above number.

THE QUEEN.—VICTORIA, of the United Kingdom of Great Britain and Ireland, Queen, Defender of the Faith. Her Majesty was born at Kensington Palace, May 24, 1819; succeeded to the throne June 20, 1837, on the death of her uncle, King William IV.; was crowned June 28, 1838, and married, Feb. 10, 1840, to his Royal Highness Prince Albert. Her Majesty is the only child of his late Royal Highness Edward, Duke of Kent, son of King George III. The children of Her Majesty are—

Her Royal Highness Victoria Adelaide, Mary Louisa, PRINCESS ROYAL OF ENGLAND AND PRUSSIA, born Nov. 21, 1840, and married to his Royal Highness William, the Crown Prince of Germany, Jan. 25, 1858, and has had issue, three sons and four daughters.

His Royal Highness Albert Edward, PRINCE OF WALES, born Nov. 9, 1841; married, March 10, 1863, Alexandra of Denmark (Princess of Wales), born Dec. 1, 1844, and has issue, Prince Albert Victor, born Jan. 8, 1864, George Frederick Ernest Albert, born June 3, 1865; Louisa Victoria Alexandra Dagmar, born Feb. 20, 1867; and Victoria Alexandra Olga Mary, born July 6, 1868; and Maude Charlotte Mary Victoria, born Nov. 26, 1869.

**TABLE OF STAMP DUTIES.**

On every promissory note, draft, or bill of exchange, not more than \$25, 1 cent; over \$25 to \$50, 2 cents; over \$50 to \$100, 3 cents.  
On every promissory note, draft, or bill of exchange, executed singly, for the first \$100, 3 cents; for every additional \$100, or fraction of a \$100, 3 cents.  
On every draft or bill of exchange executed in duplicate, for the first \$100, 2 cents; for every additional \$100, or fraction thereof, 2 cents.  
On every draft or bill of exchange executed in more than two parts, for each part for the first \$100, 1 cent; for every additional \$100, or fraction thereof, 1 cent.

The duties to be paid by stamps affixed to each promissory note, draft, or bill of exchange: but the person affixing such stamp shall, at the time of affixing the same, write or stamp thereon the date at which it is affixed, and each stamp shall be held *prima facie* to have been affixed at the date stamped or written thereon, and, if no date be so stamped or written thereon, such adhesive stamp shall be of no avail.  
Penalty for neglecting to affix stamps, or for wilfully writing or stamping a false date thereon, \$100.  
The Governor in Council may direct stamped paper to be prepared for the purpose of this Act.

LETTER RATES, ETC.

Canada.—Letters posted in Canada addressed to any place within the Dominion (including Manitoba, British Columbia and Prince Edward Island) pass, if prepaid, for 3 cents per 1/2 oz., but if posted unpaid such letters are charged 5 cents per 1/2 oz. Letters mailed at any office for delivery by or from that same office, are charged one cent each and must be prepaid, otherwise they are sent to the Dead Letter Office.

Newfoundland.—Postage on letters 6 cents per 1/2 oz. Newspapers 2 cents each. Prepayment necessary.

Bermuda (via Halifax).—Letters 6 cents per 1/2 oz. Newspapers 2 cents each. Printed matter 6 cents per 4 oz.

United States.—The rate on letters to the United States is 6 cents per 1/2 oz. if prepaid, 10 cents if unpaid. Newspapers 2 cents each.

MAILS FOR CANADA FROM ENGLAND.

Two Ocean Steamers carrying mails for Canada leave Liverpool in each week, viz.: a Canadian Packet on every Thursday, via Berry on Friday, sailing to Quebec in summer and Portland in Winter, by which the Postage rate is 3d. stg. per 1/2 oz.; and a Cunard Packet every Saturday, via Cork on Sunday, bringing Mails to New York, by which the Postage rate to Canada is 4d. stg. per 1/2 oz. A Canadian Packet leaves Liverpool every alternate Tuesday for Halifax, calling at Queenstown en route. Postage 3d. stg. per 1/2 oz., same as by Canadian Packet to Quebec or Portland.

The British Post Office forwards letters to Canada by the first packet sailing after the letter is posted, unless the

WEST INDIES VIA HALIFAX.

Letters for the West Indies, British and Foreign, are sent via Halifax and Bermuda, monthly; postage 12 cents per 1/2 oz., newspapers 2 cents each; locks, 6 cents per 4 oz. No unpaid correspondence forwarded by this route.

REGISTRATION OF LETTERS.

Persons posting Letters containing value, should be careful to require them to be registered, and to obtain from the Post Master a Certificate of receipt for Registration.

The charge for Registration, in addition to the Postage, is as follows, viz.:

- On Letters to any other place in Canada, or British North America . . . . . 2 cents.
  - On Letters for the United States . . . . . 5 "
  - On Letters for the United Kingdom . . . . . 8 "
  - On Letters for British Colonies or Possessions, sent via England . . . . . 16 "
  - On Letters for France and other Foreign Countries, via France (see Table).
  - On parcels, patterns, or samples, in Canada, 5 cents
  - On book packets & newspapers to United Kingdom, 8 cts.
- Both the postage charge and registration fee must in all cases be prepaid.

Registration is not an absolute guarantee against the miscarriage or loss of a Letter; but a Registered Letter can be traced when an Unregistered Letter cannot, and the posting and delivery or non-delivery can be proven.

PARCEL POST.

The charge on Parcels by the Parcel Post, which is limited to places within the Dominion, is 12 1/2 cents per 8 oz. (with 5 cts. additional if Registered.)

BOOK POST.

A Book Packet may contain any number of separate books, publications, works of literature and art, maps or prints, photographs, daguerrotypes, when not on glass, or in frames containing glass; any quantity of paper vellum or parchment (to the exclusion of letters); and the books, maps, papers, &c. may be either written, printed or plain, or any mixture of the three; and may be either British, Colonial or Foreign.

Book Packages must be open at both ends or both sides. The rate on Book Packages between any place in Canada, and to Newfoundland, is one cent per ounce.

Unless so prepaid Post Cards addressed to the United States will not be forwarded.

British and Foreign Postage Table.

VIA ENGLAND.

No. 2.—*Shewing the amount of Postage to be collected in the Dominion of Canada, upon Letters, Newspapers, and Book Packets, forwarded by Canadian Mail Steamers to the United Kingdom, and, through the United Kingdom, to the undermentioned Colonies and Foreign Countries.*

In all cases the postage must be prepaid. Letters for the United Kingdom, if posted unprepaid or insufficiently prepaid, will be forwarded—but charged on delivery with amount of deficient postage, and a fine of 3d. stg. each letter. Letters may be registered to all places, except those the names of which are followed by the letters *n r*, indicating that no registration can be effected.

The Registration Fee on letters addressed to the United Kingdom is 5 cents each. In all other cases the Registration Fee is 16 cents from Canada to the place of destination: except to places marked *a*, in which cases a Registration Fee of 8 cents each letter, and a postage of 4 cents per 1/2 oz. must be collected; and, in addition, double the ordinary rates of postage as given in this Table.

No Book Packet addressed to Portugal, Madeira, the Azores, or Cape de Verds, must exceed 1 lb. in weight; to Russia and Poland no such packet must exceed 8 oz. A Packet of Patterns for Germany or Belgium, or any country *via* Belgium, must not exceed 8 oz. A Book Packet for Greece must not exceed 3 lbs. in weight, nor must it exceed 2 feet in length by 1 foot in width or depth.

Upon Letters and Book Packets forwarded through the United States, the following additional rates must be collected, *viz*:—2 cents per 1/2 oz. on Letters, and 2 cents per 4 oz. on Book Packets. Upon Newspapers forwarded through the United States there will be an additional charge of 1d. stg. on delivery.

An additional postage of 6 cents per 1/2 oz. must be collected on Letters, 2 cents each on Newspapers, and 6 cents per 4 oz. on Book Packets and Patterns for places marked thus \*, when addressed to be sent *via* Brindisi.

On Book Packets for the United Kingdom, not exceeding 1 oz. in weight, the postage is 2 cents; on Book Packets weighing more than 1 oz., the progressive rate of postage will be found in Table below.

(a) Letters can be registered to Shanghai, in China, and to Yokohama, in Japan, by San Francisco, but to no other place in either country.

(b) Printed Prices Current and Mercantile Circulars can, where this letter is prefixed, be forwarded as Newspapers.

(c) The postage to be collected on Newspapers for the Sandwich Islands is two cents for each paper, and an additional charge of one cent for each two ounces weight or fraction thereof; thus, on a single paper weighing three ounces, collect four cents. In this case, Canada retains the two cents charged on each paper, and the postage of one cent per two ounces weight only is credited to the United States.

\* Where an asterisk is prefixed, an additional charge of one cent per two ounces weight on Newspapers and one cent per ounce on Books and other Printed Matter must be collected, and the whole of this additional charge must be credited to the United States.

Registration can be effected on correspondence for those places only to which the fee is given.

POSTAGE RATES, ETC., ON PATTERNS AND SAMPLES WITHIN THE DOMINION.

Patterns or samples of merchandise and goods for sale, not exceeding 24 oz. in weight, may be posted in Canada to be forwarded to any place within the Dominion, on prepayment by postage stamp of a rate of 1 cent per ounce, under the following regulations:

If such rate be not fully pre-paid by the stamps affixed, the packet is to be rated with the deficient postage and a fine of five cents in addition.

Packets of samples and patterns may be registered on prepayment by postage stamp of a registration fee of 5 cents in addition to the postage rate, and provided such packet be handed in to the Post Office for registration.

Patterns or samples must be sent in covers open at the ends, so as to be easy of examination. Samples, however, of seeds, drugs, and so forth, which can not be sent in open covers, may be enclosed in bags of linen or other material, fastened in such a manner that they may be readily opened; or in bags entirely closed, provided that they be transparent, so that the officers of the Post Office may be able to satisfy themselves as to the nature of the contents.

The packet may bear on the outside the address of the sender, in addition to the address of the person for whom it may be intended; also a trade mark and numbers, and the price of the article enclosed; inside, there must be no enclosure but the samples or patterns themselves; the particulars, however, of the trade marks, numbers and price, may be marked on the articles themselves, instead of on the outside of the packet, at the option of the sender.

Patterns or samples of merchandise cannot be forwarded by mail between Canada and the United States.

POSTAGE RATES, ETC., ON PATTERNS AND SAMPLES TO UNITED KINGDOM AND FOREIGN PARTS.

Patterns of merchandise, and samples, may be forwarded between Canada and the United Kingdom, France, Italy, German Empire, Netherlands, Portugal, Switzerland, and Denmark, by the Canadian Packet mails, at book post rates, and subject to the following conditions:

There must be no writing or printing other than the address of the person for whom the packet is intended, the manufacturer's or trade mark and number, and price of the article.

Samples of seeds, drugs, and similar articles intended for delivery within the United Kingdom, may be sent in bags entirely closed, provided such bags be transparent; Bags entirely closed must not be used for the transmission of seeds to foreign parts.

Scissors, knives, razors, forks, steel pens, nails, keys, watch machinery, metal tubing, pieces of metal or ore, and such like articles, are now allowed to be forwarded by the Post as samples, provided they be packed and guarded in so secure a manner as to afford complete protection to the contents of the mail bags, and to the persons of the officers of the Post Office. Such articles, however, must be so packed that they may be easily examined; and any packet containing such articles, which may be found to be insufficiently guarded, will not be forwarded by Post.

None of the articles named in the next preceding paragraph may be sent as patterns or samples to any place abroad, except Germany, Belgium, and the British Colonies, and not to these places when addressed to France.

LEGAL AND JUDICIARY.

THE LAW SOCIETY OF ONTARIO.

The Law Society was first established in 1797, by the act 37 Geo. III. c. 13, which enabled the then practitioners of the law to form themselves into a society and make rules for its government. By the act of 1822, 2 Geo. IV. c. 5, "the Treasurer and Benchers of the Law Society" were formally incorporated; and under these and other statutes the Society has continued to be governed by a Board of Benchers, in the same manner as the various Law societies of England. By the act of last session, 34 Vic. c. 15, the Benchers heretofore appointed from time to time by their own body, are made, exclusive of *ex officio* members, elective by the Bar, the *ex officio* consisting of the Attorney General for the time being, and all members of the Bar of Ontario who have at any time held the office of Attorney or Solicitor General of the former province of Upper Canada, and any retired Judge of the Superior Courts of Law or Equity of Ontario; the *elective*, thirty in number, being chosen by ballot, for a term of five years, by the members of the Bar. In manner prescribed by the act. Vacancies during the term to be filled by the remaining Benchers. The Judges of the Superior Courts are Visitors of the Society, and, on the first day of Easter Term, annually, the Benchers appoint one of their body to be Treasurer, who is also President of the Society. The Benchers sit in convocation every term for the call of Barristers, the admission of Attorneys and Solicitors to practice, and of Students to enter the Society; the fees paid by whom form the revenue of the Society. Osgoode Hall, appropriately named after the first Chief Justice, is the Ontario "Inn of Court," or hall quarters of the Society, in which is provided accommodation for the Courts of Equity, and for the sittings in term of the Superior Courts; with a valuable and extensive library.

COURT OF ERROR AND APPEAL.—Constituted for the hearing of appeals in civil cases from the Courts of Queen's Bench, Chancery and Common Pleas; and appeals in criminal cases from the Courts of Queen's Bench and Common Pleas. From the judgment of this court, an appeal lies to Her Majesty in Privy Council, in cases over £1,000, or where annual rent, fee, or future rights of any amount, are affected. Judges—Hon. Wm. H. COURT OF QUEEN'S BENCH.—The jurisdiction of this Court extends to all manner of actions, causes and suits, criminal and civil, real, personal and mixed, within Ontario, and it may proceed in such, by such process and course as are provided by law, and as shall tend with justice and despatch to determine the same; and may hear and determine all issues of law, and also with the inquest of twelve good and lawful men (except in cases otherwise provided for) try all issues of fact, and give judgment, and award execution, thereon, and also in matters which relate to the Queen's Revenue (including the condemnation of contraband or smuggled goods) as may be done by Her Majesty's Superior Courts of Law in England. LAW CIRCUITS.—Courts of Assize and Nisi Prius and of Oyer and Terminer and General Gaol Delivery shall be held twice a year in each County or union of Counties, in the vacation between Hilary and Easter Terms, and between that period of the vacation after the 21st of August and Michaelmas Term, except the Counties of York and Wentworth, in each of which Counties there shall be a third such Court in every year. In the vacation between Michaelmas and Hilary Terms; and in the County of York there shall be a fourth such Court, between Easter Term and the first day of July, and in the last named County the Courts of Assize and Nisi Prius may be held separate and apart from the Courts of Oyer and Terminer and General Gaol Delivery. There are six Circuits, as follows, viz:—

The Eastern; Brockville, Cornwall, Kingston, L'Orignal, Ottawa, Pembroke, Perth, Montreal; Belleville, Cobourg, Lindsay, Nanaimo, Peterboro', Picton, Whitby. Niagara; Barrie, Hamilton, Milton, Owen Sound, St. Catharines, Welland. Ontario; Berlin, Brantford, Cayuga, Guelph, Simcoe, Stratford, Woodstock. Western; Chatham, Godfrich, London, Sandwich, Sarnia, St. Thomas, Walkerton. Zone; Brampton, Toronto.

The Courts in each Circuit shall be presided over by one of the Chief Justices or Judges of the Superior Courts, or, in their absence, by some one Judge of a County Court, or some one of Her Majesty's Counsel learned in the law, requested by any one of the Chief Justices or Judges of the Superior Courts to act in that behalf.

The Courts in each Circuit are presided over by the Chancellor or one of the Vice-Chancellors, or by any one of Her Majesty's Counsel learned in the law, requested by the Chancellor or one of the Vice-Chancellors to act in that behalf.

INSTITUTION FOR THE DEAF AND DUMB.

ONTARIO INSTITUTION FOR THE DEAF AND DUMB, BELLE-VILLE.—Principal: W. J. Palmer, M. A., Ph. D., (late Principal of the North Carolina Institution for the Deaf and Dumb and the Blind). Teachers: J. B. McCaon, Daniel R. Coleman, M. A., James T. Watson, Samuel T. Greene, B.A., Mrs. J. G. Terrill, Miss Perry, R. J. Wallbridge. Teacher of Drawing: Geo. Ackerman. Steward and Book-keeper: Angus Christie. Matron: Mrs. M. A. Keegan. Physician: Wm. Hope, M.D. Farmer: Phillip F. Conniff. Carpenter: Henry Creber. Engineer: Joseph F. Middlemas. Visitors' Aidant: D. Sutherland.

All deaf mute youths of both sexes between the ages of seven and nineteen, not being deficient in intellect, and free from contagious disease, being residents of the Province of Ontario, are admitted into the Institution.

The period of education and instruction for any pupil does not exceed seven years, and no pupil can remain in the Institution after the age of twenty-one, unless under special and extraordinary circumstances.

The regular annual School Session commences on the first Wednesday in September each year, and continues till the last Wednesday in June. No applications for admission will be received after the first Wednesday in Sept., except in special and extraordinary cases.

Parents, guardians or friends, who are unable to pay for the board of pupils, must apply to the Councils of the county, township, city, town, or incorporated village in which they reside. Parents, guardians or friends, who are able to pay for the board of pupils, will make direct application to the Principal for admission into the Institution.

POST OFFICE SAVINGS BANK, CANADA.

Post Office Savings Banks at 242 of the principal Cities and Towns in Ontario and Quebec are open daily for the receipt and repayment of deposits, during the ordinary hours of Post Office business.

The direct security of the Dominion is given by the Statute for all deposits made.

Any person may have a deposit account, and may deposit yearly any number of dollars, from \$1 up to \$300, or more, with the permission of the Postmaster General.

Deposits may be made by married women, and deposits so made, or made by women who shall afterwards marry, will be repaid to any such woman.

As respects children under ten years of age, money may be deposited—

Firstly—By a parent or friend as trustee for the child, in which case the deposits can be all drawn by the trustee until the child shall attain the age of ten years, after which time repayment will be made only on the joint receipts of both trustee and child.

Secondly—In the child's own name—and if so deposited, repayment will not be made until the child shall attain the age of ten years.

A depositor in any of the Savings Bank Post Offices may continue his deposits at any other of such offices, without notice or change of Pass Book, and can withdraw money at any Savings Bank Office which is most convenient to him. For instance, if he makes his first deposit at the Savings Bank at Cobourg, he may make further deposits at, or withdraw his money through, the Post Office Bank at Collingwood or Quebec, Sarat, Brockville, or any place which may be convenient to him, whether he continue to reside at Cobourg or remove to some other place.

Each depositor is supplied with a Pass Book, which is to be produced to the Postmaster every time the depositor

pays in or withdraws money, and the sums paid in or withdrawn are entered therein by the Postmaster receiving or paying the same.

Each depositor's account is kept in the Postmaster General's Office, in Ottawa, and in addition to the Postmaster's receipt in the Pass Book, a direct acknowledgment from the Postmaster General for each sum paid in is sent to the depositor. If this acknowledgment does not reach the depositor within ten days from the date of his deposit he should apply immediately to the Postmaster General, by letter, being careful to give his address, and, if necessary, renew his application until he receives a satisfactory reply.

When a depositor wishes to withdraw money, he can do so by applying to the Postmaster General, who will send him by return mail a cheque for the amount, payable at whatever Savings Bank Post Office the depositor may have named in his application.

Interest at the rate of 4 per cent. per annum is allowed on all deposits, and the interest is added to the principal on the 30th June in each year.

Postmasters are forbidden by law to disclose the name of any depositor, or the amount of any sum deposited or withdrawn.

No charge is made to depositors on paying in or drawing out money, nor for Pass Books, nor for postage or communications with the Postmaster General in relation to their deposits.

The Postmaster General is always ready to receive and attend to all applications, complaints, or other communications addressed to him by depositors or others, relative to Post Office Savings Bank business.

A full statement of the Regulations of the Post Office Savings Bank may be seen at any of the Post Offices appointed for that purpose.

LOAN TABLE,

Showing Instalments to repay a Loan of \$1,000, in the named number of Years.

When a loan is contracted to be repaid (principal and interest) by equal instalments, extending over a term of years, the amount of the instalment—monthly, quarterly, half-yearly, or yearly—can be found by means of the following Table, the rate of interest being 10 per cent. per annum, payable half-yearly.

As interest is in this country generally payable half-yearly, the half-yearly rate has been taken as the basis, and the calculations are made on the true yearly rate corresponding, and not the nominal rate. Thus 10 per cent. per annum, payable half-yearly, is understood to mean 5 per cent. per half-year, the true yearly rate in this case being 10 1/4; for, \$100 being put out for one year at 5 per cent. per half-year, would amount at the end of the year to \$110.25.

The instalments in the Table are to repay a loan of \$1,000 in any period from 1 to 20 years.

The instalment to repay a loan of any other amount can be found by multiplying the instalment in the Table by the amount of the loan, and removing the decimal point three places to the left.

Ex. 1.—What is the half-yearly instalment to repay a loan of \$1,000 in 12 years?

The required instalment is found in the column headed *half-yearly*, horizontally opposite the number 12, to be \$72.48.

Ex. 2.—What is the monthly instalment to repay a loan of \$1,000 in 15 years?

The required instalment is found in the column headed *monthly*, horizontally opposite the number 15, to be \$40.63.

Ex. 3.—What is the yearly instalment to repay a loan of \$1,850 in 8 years?

The required instalment is found by multiplying 189.16, taken from the column headed *yearly*, opposite the number 8, by 1,850, and removing the decimal point three places to the left, to be \$349.95 nearly.
