CONSTITUTION

OF

The Church Society of the Diocese of Toronto.

INCORPORATED BY THE STATUTE OF CANADA,

7 VICTORIA, CAP. 68,

FOR PROMOTING THE FOLLOWING OBJECTS:

FIRST—For the encouragement and support of Missionaries and Clergymen of the United Church of England and Ireland within the Diocese of Toronto, and for creating a Fund towards the augmentation of the stipends of poor Clergymen, and towards making provision for those who may be incapacitated by age or infirmity, and for the Widows and Orphans of the Clergy of the said Church, in the said Diocese.

SECONDLY—For the encouragement of Education, and for the support of Day-Schools and Sunday-Schools in the said Diocese, in conformity with the principles of the said Church.

THIRDLY—For granting assistance where it may be necessary, to those who may be preparing for the Ministry of the Gospel in the said Church within the said Diocese.

FOURTHLY—For circulating in the said Diocese, the Holy Scriptures, the Book of Common Prayer of the said Church, and such other Books and Tracts as shall be approved by the Central Board or Managing Committee of the said Association.

FIFTHLY—For obtaining and granting aid towards the erection, endowment and maintenance, of Churches, according to the establishment of the said Church in the said Diocese; the erection and maintenance of Parsonage-houses; the setting apart of Burial Grounds and Church-yards; the endowment and support of Parsonages and Rectories, according to the same establishment, and the management of all matters relating to such endowments.

I.

That before the Society shall enter upon business at any of its meetings, the following Prayers be said:—

PREVENT us, O Lord, in all our doings, with thy most gracious favour, and further us with thy continual help; that in all our works begun, continued, and ended in thee, we may glorify thy holy name, and finally by thy mercy obtain everlasting life, through Jesus Christ our Lord. *Amen.*

CONSTITUTION.

O God, from whom all holy desires, all good counsels, and all works of piety and charity do proceed, we beseech thee to visit with thy favour our Sovereign, Queen VICTORIA, and so rule her heart, that she may in all things seek thy honour and glory. Prosper with thy blessing the designs of this Society. Comfort with thy grace those benefactors who contribute to its support. Bless the ministry of thy servants, the Clergy; the endeavours of all who are engaged in spreading the knowledge of true Religion in this Province, and the labours of those Missionaries who are promoting the same in foreign parts. And may thy Holy Spirit direct all our consultations to the advancement of thy glory, and the good of thy Church, through Jesus Christ our Lord. *Amen.*

O MERCIFUL God, who hast made all men, and hatest nothing that thou hast made, nor wouldest the death of a sinner, but rather that he should be converted and live: have mercy upon all Jews, Turks, Infidels and Heretics, and also upon all those Heathen Nations on whom the light of thy glorious Gospel hath not yet shone: especially the INDIANS of this Continent. Bless the means used for their civilization and conversion, and take from them all ignorance, hardness of heart, and contempt of thy Word: and so fetch them home, blessed Lord, to thy flock, that they may be saved among the remnant of the true Israelites, and be made one fold under one Shepherd, Jesus Christ our Lord, who liveth and reigneth with thee and the Holy Spirit, one God, world without end. *Amen.*

OUR Father which art in Heaven, hallowed be thy name. Thy kingdom come. Thy will be done in Earth, as it is in Heaven. Give us this day our daily bread. And forgive us our trespasses, as we forgive them that trespass against us. And lead us not into temptation; but deliver us from evil: for thine is the kingdom, and the power, and the glory, for ever and ever. *Amen.*

AND WHEN BUSINESS IS ENDED:

ALMIGHTY GOD, Father of all mercies, we thine unworthy servants do give thee most humble and hearty thanks for all thy goodness and loving-kindness to us and to all men: more particularly, for the providential support by which this Society hath been enabled to spread abroad the knowledge of thy sacred truth. But above all, for thine inestimable love in the redemption of the world by thy blessed Son, for the means of grace, and for the hope of glory, which thou hast given us in the same our Lord and Saviour Jesus Christ; to whom with thee and the Holy Ghost be all honour and glory, world without end. *Amen.*

THE Grace of our Lord Jesus Christ, and the love of God, and the fellowship of the Holy Ghost, be with us all evermore. *Amen.*

II.

That all those who now are or who shall hereafter become Members of the Association, and who shall subscribe Ten Shillings annually to the Funds of the Society, or contribute as much as Five Pounds in one sum, shall be Associated Members of the Society, and shall be eligible to be Members of the Corporation.

Vide By-laws of the Society for the Propagation of the Gospel in Foreign Parts, Art. 8.

III.

That every Incorporated Member subscribe not less than One Pound Five Shillings annually to the funds of the Society, or contribute not less than Twelve Pounds Ten Shillings in one sum.

Vide By-laws of the Society for the Propagation of the Gospel in Foreign Parts, Art. 9.

IV.

That the Corporation shall consist of the Bishop of Toronto for the time being, of the Members appointed by the Charter, and of so many of the other Associated Members of the Society as shall be elected by ballot members of the Corporation, at the meetings to be from time to time holden, on the days and at the place appointed by the By-laws of the Corporation for its stated meetings. Provided always, that the whole number of members of the said Corporation, in addition to those who are made members by the Statute, shall at no time exceed three hundred, and that the whole number of members of the Corporation shall never be less than one hundred.

V.

That the Standing Committee of the Society to be appointed as provided in one of the following By-laws, be empowered, with the sanction of the President, to recommend persons, whether Associated Members or not, to be elected into the Corporation, without reference to the limitation of numbers.

VI.

That the Lord Bishop of Toronto for the time being shall be President of the Society, and the Venerable the Archdeacons within the Diocese shall be Vice-Presidents.

VII.

That the Society shall, at their meeting on the first Wednesday in June in each year, choose one or more Vice-President or Vice-Presidents, in addition to the Archdeacons; one or more Treasurer or Treasurers; two or more Auditors; one Secretary and one Assistant Secretary; and such other officers, ministers and servants, as shall be thought convenient, to serve in the said offices for the year ensuing.

VIII.

That the Standing Committee shall propose to the Board at the General Meeting in July, a list of seven Members of the Society, to form the Tract and Book Committee for the year ensuing; that at that meeting any Member be at liberty to propose another list of seven Members of the Society, instead of that proposed by the Standing Committee; and that the election of the Tract and Book Committee take place at the General Meeting in August.

IX.

That if it shall happen that any of the persons at any time chosen into any of the said offices shall die, or on any account be removed from such office at any time during the period for which he was elected or appointed to serve, in such case the President, or any one of the Vice-Presidents, shall convene a Meeting, to be held at the usual place of meeting of the Society, at such time as shall be specified in the notice of such Meeting: and that such members of the Corporation as shall be present at the Meeting, or the majority of them, shall and may choose an officer or officers in the room or place of such person or persons so dead or removed, as to them shall seem meet. Provided, that it shall not be necessary for any such Meeting to be called for supplying a vacancy in the office of Vice-President: but the President may do so in his discretion.

X.

That the Society shall and may, on the first Wednesday in every month, yearly, for ever hereafter, and oftener if occasion requires, meet at the place heretofore used for the transaction of the business of the said Society, or at such other place as may be hereafter appointed for that purpose; and that the President or Standing Committee have power to call a Special Meeting of the said Society at any time.

XI.

That no act done in any Meeting of the said Society shall be valid and effectual, unless the President, or some one of the Vice-Presidents, shall be present at such Meeting.

XII.

And with regard to all Meetings of the Society, and to the making, altering, or repealing any by-laws, rules, or regulations at such Meetings, it is to be specially noticed that by the Act of the Legislature incorporating this Society, (7 Vic. ch. 68) it is enacted that no act done in any such assembly or meeting of the Corporation shall be valid or effectual, unless six persons of the Corporation at the least shall be present, and the major part of them consenting thereto.

And further, that no constitution, by-law, rule or regulation of the Society, nor any abrogation, repeal, change, or alteration of the same, shall be of any force or effect until it shall have been sanctioned and confirmed by the Bishop of, or administering the Diocese, for the time being, by writing under his hand.

XIII.

That a Standing Committee consisting of the President, Vice-Presidents, Treasurer or Treasurers, Secretary and Assistant Secretary, and not more than twenty other Members (three of whom shall be a quorum), be appointed to prepare matters for the consideration of the monthly meetings.

XIV.

That minutes of all the proceedings of the Society be taken, and that at each Meeting of the Society the minutes of the preceding Meeting be read by the Secretary, and signed by the Chairman.

XV.

That the accounts of the Society be closed on the thirty-first day of March in each year; and that the same be audited within one month from that date.

XVI.

That the Treasurer manage the receipts and expenditure, under the orders of the Society; and that he keep his accounts in such manner as shall from time to time be directed by the Auditors, subject to the control of the Society.

XVII.

That the Secretary conduct the correspondence of the Society, take minutes of the proceedings of the General Meetings and Committees, and prepare the Annual Report of the Society.

XVIII.

And whereas by the Constitution of the Church Society of the Diocese of Toronto, adopted on the 28th day of April, 1842, it was ordained as follows, that is to say:

In connexion and correspondence with the Society, District Associations shall be established, comprising one or more Districts, (as shall be approved by the Presidents,) into which the Province is by law divided; the same to be composed of the Clergy resident within the bounds of the same, and all other members of the Church who shall contribute in aid of the Society's funds;—the Archdeacon, or senior Clergyman resident within its bounds, shall *ex-officio*, be Chairman of such District Branch Association, with whom shall be associated, as composing a Committee of Management, the Clergy of the several Parishes or Missions, within the bounds of such District, and one or two Laymen from each of the same, a Secretary and Treasurer.

A General Meeting of each Branch District Association shall be held in each year, at any time and place which may be agreed upon at a previous Quarterly Meeting of the Committee of Management; and Quarterly Meetings of the Committee of Management,—not less than five to form a quorum,—shall be held, for the transaction of the ordinary business of the Branch Association.

In order the more fully to carry out the objects of the Society, each Parish, in the person of its Clergyman and Church-wardens, shall be a Sub-Association, in correspondence, through its Chairman (the Clergyman), with the District Branch Association, and may be denominated *The Parochial Committee of the Church Society*. This Committee shall meet so often, and at such periods, as they shall themselves decide to be most convenient, inviting the co-operation of all the parishioners, in their deliberations and designs. They shall collect subscriptions and donations from the members of the Church, in such manner as they shall deem most effective, and endeavour by every means in their power to augment the resources of the Society. All monies raised to be transmitted to the Treasurer of the District Association.

One-fourth of all monies paid into the hands of the Treasurer of the District Committees respectively, shall be transmitted to the Treasurer of the General Society, to be at the disposal of the Central Board, and the remaining three-fourths of all such collections shall, when required, be expended within the Parish or District in which they have been made, for such objects only as are specified in the Constitution of the Society,—

the allotment to be made at the Quarterly Meetings of the District Branch Association. All monies not required to be expended for local purposes, and remaining unappropriated at the General Annual Meeting of the District Association, shall be forthwith transmitted to the Treasurer of the Society at Toronto.

The District Associations, through their respective Secretaries, shall communicate to the Secretary of the Parent Society at Toronto a minute statement of all receipts and expenditure within the sphere of their operations, embodied in the form of a Report, once in each year, so soon as convenient after the General Annual Meeting of such District Branch Association.

XIX.

That four Sermons be preached annually in the several Churches, Chapels and Stations of this Diocese, in aid of the funds of this Society, at such times as the Lord Bishop shall appoint; that of these collections the proceeds of one shall be annually invested for the benefit of infirm Clergymen, and the Widows and Orphans of Clergymen deceased; that the proceeds of two of the said annual sermons shall be devoted to the maintenance of Travelling or Resident Missionaries in this Diocese, and that the proceeds of the fourth shall be appropriated to any other object embraced within its Constitution as the Society may from time to time direct.

*XX.

That the Charter and these By-laws do together form the Constitution of the Church Society of the Diocese of Toronto, and that nothing which is contained in the Constitution of the Society established on the 28th day of April, 1842, or in any by-law, rule or regulation, amending or altering the same, shall apply to or be in force in respect to the Incorporated Church Society of the Diocese of Toronto, except such provisions thereof as are above continued in force.

PRESENTED AT THE ANNUAL MEETING AT TORONTO,

HELD ON WEDNESDAY, JUNE 4TH, 1845.

IN presenting their Third Annual Report, THE CHURCH SOCIETY hasten to express their earnest, yet humble gratitude, for that reasonable measure of success, with which it has pleased Almighty God to bless their exertions for three successive years. During this period, the Society have laboured diligently, as far as their means would permit, to carry into effect the various objects of their original Constitution. They have circulated, throughout the Diocese, many copies of the Holy Scriptures, numerous Prayer-books, and many useful Tracts; and during the second year, they were enabled to establish one Missionary, and others have since been added; but it was not until the present time that the Society, being now incorporated, and with her funds gradually and steadily increasing, found herself in a position to come forward and urge upon the members of the Church throughout the land, the necessity of immediately carrying into operation, with zeal and perseverance, that which may probably be called the principal object for which the Society has been incorporated, viz.; the making provision for resident and travelling Missionaries, in this extensive Diocese.

We can call to mind,—and a sober remembrance of the past is useful and salutary,—that the Church of England and Ireland has, in various periods of her history, been a Missionary Church. So early as the sixth century, Irish Missionaries carried the Gospel into parts of Scotland; while in the eighth century, we find Anglo-Saxon and Irish Missionaries actively engaged in the same holy work in Holland, on the

banks of the Rhine, and in Switzerland. Nearly one thousand years afterwards, a similar missionary spirit having again revived, the same Church established the Venerable Society for the Propagation of the Gospel in Foreign Parts,—a Society which now, for nearly one hundred and fifty years, has faithfully laboured to carry the religion of the cross into almost every territory, or colonial dependency, within the British Empire,—a Society which, in most cases, has not only prepared the way for, but has continued to nurse, as it were, with parental care, the various colonial branches of the Church, which, watered by the continual dew of the Divine blessing, have sprung into being, during the eighteenth and nineteenth centuries.

Indeed, to the general revival of this missionary spirit may be traced the origin of the Church in British America, in the British West Indies, the Anglo-Indian Church, and the Church in Australia, Tasmania, and New Zealand, all which branches "*continuing steadfast in the Apostles' doctrine and fellowship,*" and in holy communion with the Parent Church, now occupy the face of the colonial empire of Great Britain, and appear in primitive and Apostolical integrity, as living witnesses to the memorable promise, given by our Saviour to his Apostles, "*Lo, I am with you always, even unto the end of the world.*"

And thus it may be said with truth and thankfulness, that the word has not returned void; that much of the good seed has fallen, neither by the way side, nor on stony ground, nor among thorns, but is still continuing to grow up, and ripen, and cover the face of the earth.

The Venerable Society at home entered on their labours with comparatively few Missionaries; but it has pleased Almighty God, of his mere mercy, to bless and reward their exertions, and increase their means for doing good, to such an extent, that, at the present moment, they have nearly 400 Missionaries engaged in the propagation of the Gospel. All this is a manifest token to us, that, if we as faithfully remember who alone gives the increase, a similar increase will be given, in his good time, to us likewise; and a reasonable hope is afforded, that this Society may possibly be used as the humble instrument of administering, in a very great degree, to the wants and peculiar difficulties of this Diocese. And though the increase descends only from above, yet we must remember, that Almighty God has condescended to use

human vessels; that in the Apostolic age, the Gospel was preached from house to house, and from city to city; and it is only by striving lawfully in the same way, that we can now expect to be enabled to go and do likewise.

Bearing this in devout remembrance, and believing that the time for energetic measures is now arrived, we must all be united, laborious, and self-denying, and as members one of another, use every exertion to carry the ministrations of the Church into every township, and realize the hope, which we now have good reason to entertain, that in two or three years, this Society will be enabled to support not less than twenty Missionaries.

ACT OF INCORPORATION.

Since the last annual meeting, the Act incorporating the Church Societies of the Dioceses of Quebec and Toronto, has received the Royal Assent; and on October 23rd, a new Constitution was adopted, modelled principally in accordance with that of the venerable Society for the Propagation of the Gospel in Foreign Parts; at least, as nearly as could be done, in conformity with the provisions of the Act of Incorporation. Under this present Constitution, the actual business of the Society is no longer managed by a Central Board and Lay Committee, but at the General Monthly Meetings of the Society, which are thus thrown open to all, inasmuch as all incorporated members can now take a part in them.

It may be added, that, at the formation of the Society, fears were entertained by many, as to the ultimate stability of the exertions then made: that question seems now happily settled. The Society has received an Act of Incorporation, and has continued to increase steadily in strength and usefulness.

INCOME AND EXPENDITURE.

The following is a brief statement of the Society's Income and Expenditure for the past year:—

This statement exhibits the very considerable increase of nearly 950*l.* in the Society's income, (the second year's income having been not quite 1800*l.*, while this year it has reached 2735*l.*); and it is gratifying to be able to state, that this increase, at the head quarters of the Society, has been so far from diminishing local exertions, that it may rather be hailed as a sound indication of the increased zeal of churchmen, throughout the Diocese, manifested not only in building Churches, but in a more attentive regard to every thing which may conduce to the future well-being of God's visible kingdom.

FOUR ANNUAL SERMONS.

By Article XIX. of the new Constitution it is provided, that four Sermons be preached annually in the several Churches, Chapels and Stations, within the Diocese, in aid of the funds of this Society. Since the Act of Incorporation, two such sermons have been preached; the proceeds of the first have been invested in behalf of the Widows and Orphans' Fund, and the second was given for the benefit of five Clergymen in this Diocese, who, from circumstances which need not here be recapitulated, were deprived of their salaries and thrown into much distress. From both of these Sermons, the returns have been highly satisfactory; while the sermon which was preached on Trinity Sunday last will be devoted to Missionary purposes, being one of the two collections which, according to the 19th Article of the Constitution, will not be invested, but annually devoted for the maintenance of resident, or Travelling Missionaries.

DEPOSITORY.

The issues from the Depository have been to the value of 891*l.* 17*s.* 2½*d.* The amount is somewhat less than during the former year, but it must be recollected, that this is altogether attributable to the more contracted importations which have been made during the same period,—not in the slightest degree to any diminution in the demand for such books as set forth the doctrine and discipline of the Church of England.

Only one Tract has been published by the Society during the year, a translation of that well known and useful Tract, entitled "The Faith and Duty of a Christian," into the Chip-pawa language, by the Rev. F. A. O'Meara.

PROPERTY INVESTED IN STOCK.

During the past year, the sum of 52*l.* 6*s.* 3*d.* has been invested in forty-three shares of Upper Canada Bank Stock; 37*l.* 10*s.* of which is on account of the Missionary Fund, and the remainder, 488*l.* 16*s.* 3*d.* on account of the Widows and Orphans' Fund. It is to be hoped that, during the ensuing year, the Society will be enabled to adopt such measures, with regard to the Widows and Orphans' Fund, as will secure its stability, its permanent increase, and satisfactory management. Several valuable hints have been already thrown out on this subject, which will no doubt be found of material assistance in bringing to maturity this very important object.

ANNUAL SUM OF ONE HUNDRED POUNDS, STERLING, PLACED AT THE DISPOSAL OF THE LORD BISHOP.

By a resolution of the first year, a permanent annual sum of 100*l.* sterling, was placed at the disposal of the Bishop, to be appropriated in such a manner as to his Lordship might seem judicious. His Lordship determined to use it for the purpose of aiding the District Branches in providing Travelling Missionaries for their respective Districts, offering assistance to the amount of one-fourth of the annual salary of the Missionary, on the condition that the District Branch become responsible for the remainder. The Gore and Wellington Districts Branch was the first to comply with this stipulation, viz. of furnishing three-fourths of the income of the Missionary, in consequence of which the Rev. J. Mockridge was appointed last year, and during the present year the Rev. H.

Stoneman has been appointed to the Niagara District, the Rev. Robert Harding to the Newcastle and Colborne District, and the Rev. F. Tremayne to the Eastern District,—the respective Districts having complied with the necessary conditions. Thus it will be seen that, in addition to having been used as the means for supporting five Clergymen, who were unexpectedly thrown upon the resources of the Church, no less than three additional labourers have been added, during the past year, to those already engaged in this portion of the Lord's vineyard.

PUBLIC MEASURES.—CLERGY RESERVES. —

During the last session of the Provincial Parliament, the Society petitioned the Legislature, in conformity with the resolution passed at the special general meeting of the Society, held September 21st, 1844, that they would be pleased to address Her Majesty, praying that the control and disposition of such share of the Clergy Reserve Lands as has been assigned to the Church of England, by the Imperial statute 3 & 4 Victoria, chap. 78, intituled, "An Act to provide for the sale of the Clergy Reserves in the Province of Canada, and for the distribution of the proceeds thereof," may be made over to the Church of England in this Diocese. This petition was supported by very numerous petitions from the various parishes in the Diocese, and was by the Hon. the Legislative Assembly referred to a Select Committee to report thereupon. The Committee reported most favourably in support of the claims of the Church,* but the business proceeded no further. However, from the favourable nature of the Report, it may be hoped that the prayer of the petition will be granted hereafter.

LANDS.

Since the passing of the Act of Incorporation, Deeds for the conveyance of lands to the Society, both by donation and by bargain and sale, have been prepared: so that in conformity with the recommendation made by the Lay Committee, in their last annual Report, titles to lands to be hereafter conveyed for the support of the Church, may be made to the Society,—now that it has acquired the corporate capacity to hold them,—in order that, with respect to all such lands, the

convenience may be enjoyed of being able to make any disposition of them, which a prudent regard to the interests of the Church may dictate, unfettered by any of those restrictions which apply to leases made by Ecclesiastical Corporations.

LAND COMMITTEE.

A Committee called the Land Committee has been appointed, to whom is entrusted the duty of preparing all business relative to lands, and submitting the same to the consideration of the Society at their general monthly meetings. This Committee, in conformity with instructions received from the Society, with the view of obtaining all the information possible, as to the state of the lands belonging to the Church in this Diocese, have forwarded to all the Clergy a blank schedule prepared by the Lay Committee, to be filled up, shewing the state of the Church lands in every township in the Diocese. When this information is obtained, it is hoped that it will be found of considerable use, in assisting the Society to carry out that branch of their operations, which is fully set forth in the original Constitution of the Society, under the head, *Objects of the Lay Committee.*

DISTRICT BRANCHES.

During the past year, two new Branches have been formed in the Brock and Talbot Districts, so that there are now in connection with the parent Society, the nine following Branches:

BRANCH REPORTS.

Newcastle and Colborne District.

This Branch reports, that through the zealous labours of its Missionary, they have been able to make known the glad tidings of Evangelical Truth and Apostolic Order in many Townships hitherto destitute of the ministrations of the Church.

Although the general objects of the Society have been kept in view, and promoted by the transmission of funds to the pa-

rent Society according to the Constitution, and also by the expenditure in each parish of its allotted portion in the support of, in one instance, a Parochial, and in others of Sunday, Schools, and by the distribution of Bibles, Testaments, Prayer books, religious books, and Tracts; yet the great object of this Branch has been the maintenance of a Travelling Missionary, in order that to every place within its bounds, the inestimable benefits of a duly authorised Gospel Ministry may be extended, as far as circumstances will allow.

In July last the Rev. Robert Harding was ordained, and by the Bishop's appointment has since then been engaged in the laborious but honourable duties of a Travelling Missionary. The Committee would look upon this as an earnest of better things to come; and indulge the pleasing hope that, before long, three heralds of the cross may be added to the confessedly insufficient number of Clergy, at present labouring within its bounds.

The income of this Branch has been £135 9s. 1d. The expenditure, including £30 reserved for the parent Society, has been £110 12s. 1d.

Midland District.

This Branch has undertaken to contribute the required three-fourths of the income of a Travelling Missionary.— They have also granted £50 currency per annum for three years, or any sum less than that to which their whole surplus income may amount, towards the maintenance of the Clergyman, who may be appointed to the Church at Barriefield upon the condition of his performing Service once every Sunday in Pittsburg township. The whole of this charge will fall upon the funds of the Kingston Parochial Association.

Books to the amount of £99 14s. 2d. have been purchased for their Depository, and the sales have amounted to £71 14s. 10d.

The income of this Branch, not including sales at the Depository, has been £85 14s. 9d. The disbursements, including £27 19s. 4d. advanced for the Depository, have been £102 10s. 7d.

Prince Edward District.

The Report from this District is certainly not very encouraging, but by the zeal and energy of the Chairman, subscriptions to the amount of £20 8s. 0d. have been procured, and promises made of several valuable lots of land for Church purposes.

Eastern District.

The Committee report, that during the past year another Parochial Association has been formed, and that there are now nine Parochial Committees in connection with this District Branch, viz., at Brockville, Prescott, Williamsburg and Matilda, Merrickville, Bytown, Cornwall, Perth, Kemptville, Richmond. Several of these Committees report an increased number of subscribers, and an additional amount collected. Some others are more fully carrying out the objects of the Church Society by establishing Parochial Libraries and Depositories, by means of which the Word of God, and its appropriate companion, the Book of Common Prayer, are becoming more extensively circulated. From the Report of one of the Parochial Associations, it appears that the Clergyman of the Parish, which is only a rural one, has, in the last few years, distributed upwards of 1000 copies of the Bible, the New Testament, and the Book of Common Prayer.

This District Branch has much pleasure in stating, that the anticipations indulged at their last Annual Meeting, with reference to the appointment of a Travelling Missionary to that District, have been realized. The Rev. F. Tremayne was appointed in June last as a Missionary to travel in the Eastern and Johnstown Districts. He commenced his labours on the 15th June, and has 10 regular stations, in some of which he has officiated twice, and in others once in every four weeks, viz. St. Paul's Church, Moor's Settlement, and Spencer's Mills, Edwardsburg, Mountain, Lang's Settlement and Armstrong's Mills, Winchester, Charleston, South Crosby Chapel, Elizabethtown, 11th Concession, and Billy Sly's. He has also visited other places occasionally. All these places, with one or two exceptions, lie between the St. Lawrence and the Rideau rivers, in the back townships. From one extreme point of the Mission to the other is about 116 miles, consequently their Missionary has travelled since he commenced his labours in June last, upwards of 2500 miles. He during that period baptised 59 children and 1 adult. The income of this Branch has been £231 6s. 0d., including special donations; £36 15s. 11d. has been remitted to the parent Society; £63 has been paid to the Travelling Missionary, and £131 10s. 1d. expended for local purposes.

Niagara District.

This District Branch reports with much thankfulness a small increase in their funds, and also that in most of the

parishes within the District, the increase is regular and steady. Two new Parochial Associations have been formed in the united parishes of Dunnville and the Lake Shore, at the mouth of the Grand River, which promise to be highly useful auxiliaries. A travelling Missionary has been provided for this District, half of whose time is devoted to this duty, and half of whose salary is borne by the District Association. The Committee feel that the District has been highly favoured in the selection of the gentleman whom the Lord Bishop of the Diocese has appointed to this very arduous and important duty; for whilst the situation is one which unquestionably makes great demands upon the physical strength of the Missionary, it is, at the same time, one in which a matured mind and long experience in the Christian Ministry is perhaps even more indispensable.

The total receipts, including special contributions, have been 266*l.* 0*s.* 9*d.*, of which 65*l.* 7*s.* 11*d.* has been reserved for the Parent Society; 62*l.* 19*s.* 3½*d.* for the Travelling Missionary; and the balance, 137*l.* 13*s.* 6*d.*, has been expended for local purposes in the various parishes.

Gore and Wellington District.

This Branch has continued to exert itself in a very active manner during the past year; and its labours have been attended with an increase in the number of its members, and in the amount of contributions. The annual visitation of the Parochial Associations by deputations of the Clergy, who assisted at their anniversary meetings, was attended with many gratifying disclosures with regard to the estimation in which the Church Society was held. Annual meetings were held in succession at Galt, Paris, Brantford, Ancaster, Dundas, Oakville, Wellington Square, and Guelph, in most of which places, the affairs of the Society were found in a most flourishing and satisfactory state.

An additional Parochial Association has been formed, during the past year, in the parish of the Rev. J. L. Alexander, comprising Binbrook, Barton, and Stoney Creek, which has 81 members, and has paid 20*l.* 10*s.* 7½*d.* into the hands of the Treasurer.

The Travelling Missionary has been labouring diligently in the several Townships entrusted to his care, and in the discharge of his duty is cheerfully suffering every species of fatigue and privation. No less than 10 stations are regularly

visited by him, and supplied with the ministrations of the Church. 10*l.* annually has been appropriated by this Branch for the very important purpose of enabling the Travelling Missionary to distribute, throughout the circuit of his labours, sound religious Tracts. The receipts of this Branch have been 25*l.* 9*s.* 8½*d.*, shewing an increase of 5*l.* 14*s.* 8*d.* over the past year.

London and Huron District.

Twenty-five pounds has been paid to the Treasurer of this Branch. It must be recollected that this Branch has been considerably reduced by the separation of the Brock and Talbot Districts from it.

Brock District.

This Branch has been set off, since the last Annual Meeting, from the London, Brock, Talbot, and Huron Branch, at a meeting held in Woodstock, on the 2d September, 1844, at which the Lord Bishop presided. This District is one of the smallest in the Diocese, and their report only extends over a period of five months, and the receipts are almost exclusively drawn from the Rectory of Woodstock.

The Committee have established a Depository, and have granted 5*l.* towards the establishment of a Sunday School Library.

The total receipts have been 81*l.* 9*s.* 3*d.*, of which 40*l.* 5*s.* 6*d.* have been expended, leaving a balance in hand of 41*l.* 3*s.* 9*d.*

Talbot District.

This is the youngest District Branch in the Diocese, comprising only one parish, that of the Rev. F. Evans, the only Clergyman in the District. This District, like that of Brock, was set off from the London, Brock, Talbot, and Huron Branch, at a public meeting held in Simcoe, on the 19th October last, and its report only embraces a period of little more than three months.

The Committee stated that three Churches were building, and that there are no less than fifteen places in the District where congregations now exist, sufficiently large to sanction the establishment of regular service.

The income has been 5*l.* 16*s.* 8½*d.*, which has been expended in books and tracts, except the sum of 1*l.* 2*s.* 2½*d.*, reserved to be remitted to the parent Society.

Home and Simcoe Districts Parochial Associations.

Toronto.—The amount of subscriptions in the city and neighbourhood of Toronto, paid to the Treasurer, is 21*l.* 15*s.* 5*d.* A grant was made of 9*l.* 3*s.* 9*d.* to Trinity Church for a stone font, being the amount of a special donation for that purpose.

York Mills.—2*l.* has been received from this Association.

Thornhill.—There has been paid to the Treasurer by this Association, 46*l.* 8*s.* 2*d.*

Streetsville.—The Association at Streetsville have subscribed the sum of 3*l.* 7*s.* 6*d.*, and the Hurontario Association 2*l.* 6*s.* 3*d.*

Georgina.—This Parochial Association has contributed 5*l.* 16*s.* 10½*d.*

Tecumseth and West Gwillimbury.—31*l.* 18*s.* 8½*d.* has been paid to the Treasurer from this Association.

Weston and Mimico.—This Association has contributed 4*l.* 17*s.* 6*d.* to the funds of the Society.

Chinguacousy.—The sum of 3*l.* 10*s.* has been subscribed in this parish towards the funds of the Society.

Barrie Parochial Association has paid to the Treasurer 3*l.* 16*s.* 10*d.* on account of collections made in that parish.

At the Monthly General Meeting of the Society, held on 6th March, it was Resolved, That Annual Meetings should be held of the several Parochial Associations in the Home and Simcoe Districts, and that such meetings should be attended by as many of the neighbouring Clergy as possible. There is no doubt, that, by following this plan, which has been attended with such very beneficial results in other Districts, much more will be done in future than has been heretofore in these Districts.

Efforts are being made to establish at least one Travelling Missionary in these Districts. One mission, that of the Rev. F. L. Osler, has already contributed and pledged itself to continue the sum of 15*l.* towards this very important object.

In reviewing the labours of the Society, during the past year, there will be found undoubtedly much, which, laying aside all enthusiasm, calls for serious congratulation, the steady increase of the funds, the addition of three Missionaries, the determination to provide, through the medium of Missionary Sermons, for the immediate support of one or two

additional Missionaries in each District, the active measures which have been taken in Toronto for concentrating the business of the Society, whether as regards money or lands, the increased efficiency of the District Branches, which are now beginning in some measure to cover the face of the Diocese, are so many practical proofs, that the objects, for which the Society has received an Act of Incorporation, are being steadily and zealously carried out.

But perhaps the most favourable omen, and that from which the happiest results may be expected, is the prevailing spirit of the times. That general spirit of enquiry, which, formerly confined to a few, so remarkably characterizes the present age, has reached us here, and is now beginning to fill the length and breadth of the land. It will be believed, that no human inventions or institutions can continue to exist always against such a spirit of enquiry, especially when such enquiry is conducted as it always ought to be, in a meek and humble manner. It is true that local causes may for a while impede the progress of such a wholesome state of things, but it is still more true, as the history of the past teaches, that Eternal Truth itself, however vilified, shall in the end prevail. Amid all the confusion, which, in consequence of human corruption, invariably accompanies any religious movement, men are now investigating with the utmost seriousness and concern the divine constitution of the Church of Christ; and the result already has been, that many who some years ago treated this subject with the utmost indifference, have now returned to the fold, constrained, as it were, by a wholesome fear, from remaining any longer outside, lest, by so doing, they should be found haply to fight against God.

And such knowledge is power. When men begin to realize their privileges as members of Christ's body corporate, then religion comes home with a real force, and men prove their faith by a life of obedience, earnestly exerting themselves in the cause of their Great Master, and endeavouring, by every possible means, to become, under the Divine grace, the humble instruments of extending this saving knowledge to all around them.

From such knowledge, a spirit of primitive charity is springing up amongst us. More exertions are made for the good cause, while it may be stated with truth that there is less show and ostentation; more gifts are offered up, the fruit of silent self-denial, and with a single eye to the cross, and more of

our people are learning that it is not the gift, but the will with which the gift is given, which for Christ's sake is accepted before the mercy seat; and it may be added, that we are all powerfully, though silently, being taught this important lesson, that while we may feed the hungry, and clothe the naked, and succour the distressed, without seeking to know who the sufferers are, yet that we cannot subscribe to promote the peculiar religious views of those who have separated from our communion, without violating the first principles of Christian unity; because true charity, emanating from above, necessarily continues steadfast in the Apostles' doctrine and fellowship.

It becomes the melancholy duty of the Society to notice the death of the Rev. George Mortimer. During the past year it has pleased the Great Head of the Church to remove him, in a very sudden manner, from those labours, in which for so many years he had been engaged with singular diligence and fidelity. J. S. Cartwright, Esq., one of the Vice Presidents of the Society, has been likewise removed by death; the remembrance of his earnest piety and unostentatious liberality will live long in the hearts of those who knew him.

Nor, in conclusion, while recounting the labours of the past year, can the Society forget the generous assistance which the two venerable Societies at home still continue to supply to the Colonial branches of the Church; and it is likewise satisfactory to learn, as appears from the public papers, that the sister Societies of Nova Scotia and Quebec are steadily carrying out the various objects for which they were originally constituted.

It will have been seen from this Report, that much has been done during the past year, and it may be added, that the present aspect of this Diocese is encouraging. Churches have been built or repaired, and others are now being erected; a deeper anxiety is evinced to obtain a sound religious education for the members of the Church, and to provide for an increased number of Clergy, their better maintenance, and the improvement of their parsonage-houses: still it must be carefully borne in mind, that we must never rest contented, until the wish of our venerable Diocesan, as expressed throughout his Pastoral Letter on the formation of this Society, be in some measure carried out, viz., that at least two parishes be endowed in every township, and every baptised person in the Diocese become a member of the Church Society.

RESOLUTIONS

APPENDIX.

REPORT OF THE SELECT COMMITTEE

ON THE PETITION OF THE CHURCH SOCIETY, DIOCESE OF TORONTO, AND
MANY THOUSAND OTHER PERSONS, PRAYING TO HAVE THE CON-
TROL AND MANAGEMENT OF THE CHURCH OF ENGLAND'S SHARE
OF THE CLERGY RESERVES.

The Committee to whom was referred the petition of the Church Society of the Diocese of Toronto, and other petitions signed by many thousand persons, members of the United Church of England and Ireland, resident in the said Diocese of Toronto, and the Diocese of Quebec, praying to have the controul over, and the disposition and management of, their respective shares of the Clergy Reserves as is equivalent to the proportion of the funds assigned by the provisions of an Act of the Imperial Parliament, passed in the fourth year of her Majesty's reign, for the support of the Church of England,—beg leave respectfully to Report,—

That by the said Act, entitled "An Act to provide for the sale of the Clergy Reserves in the Province of Canada, and for the distribution of the proceeds thereof," the Government of this Province is empowered to sell all or any of the Clergy Reserves, under regulations to be approved by Her Majesty in Council; and that the proceeds, in money, to be derived from the sale and leasing of the Clergy Reserves, after the deduction of certain allowances which are specified in the said Act, are directed to be divided into two equal parts; one of which is to be distributed in certain proportions between the Churches of England and Scotland, and the other to be applied by the Governor of this Province, with the advice of his Executive Council, for purposes of public worship and religious instruction in Canada.

From the foregoing provisions, it appears to your Committee that it was not the policy of the Imperial Parliament, at the time of the passing of the said Act, to apportion the said lands among the denominations of Christians whose claims were therein recognized, but rather to place the Clergy Reserves at the disposal of the Government, to be sold, and the proceeds to be divided in the proportion mentioned in the said Act.

Your Committee, however, have given the subject and the matters set forth in the various petitions referred to them their best consideration, and they are led to doubt the utility or expediency of such a policy, and particularly when they cannot but consider that, at the time these lands

were originally set apart for the support of religion, and the maintenance of public worship, it was thereby intended to create an adequate fund to form a permanent endowment for those important objects.

And when it is further borne in mind, that the members of the Church of England inhabiting the State of New-York, are at this day enabled to erect their churches, and station their missionaries in every section of that extensive country, by the aid of funds provided by the pious care of a British monarch, when that country was a British Colony; that the numerous Dutch population of the same State are supplied with Pastors from ample funds provided also at an early day by the care of the Government, and that in both these cases the foundation of the endowment was a grant of land, insignificant in extent and value at the time it was made, compared with the Clergy Reserves set apart in this Colony by his late Majesty King George the Third, but which grants being scrupulously preserved and respected by succeeding Governments, now yield most munificent resources for the support of religion.

When your Committee also take into consideration, that our Roman Catholic fellow-subjects of Lower Canada are enjoying, at this day, the most ample endowments for their Churches and Colleges, arising from early grants of land, which if alienated at the value they once bore, would have afforded but a nominal provision, wholly inadequate to the wants of the passing hour, they feel strongly the impolicy of the provisions of the act to which they have referred, and the justice of the claims set forth by the petitioners. Besides, it is stated in the petition of the Church Society, that "the petitioners have observed with great regret, that under the system which has been adopted for the sale of the Clergy Reserves, and from the great deductions made from the proceeds for the expense of inspection and management, their share of the fund which has been appropriated by the Legislature to the Religious instruction of the people, is likely to be in a great measure consumed in charges which to them appear unnecessary, and to so great an extent that they are apprehensive that it will yield a little more than a nominal provision for the support of their Church." To this portion of the petition, your Committee have devoted a good deal of attention, and it appears to them that a very large and unnecessary degree of expense has been incurred in the manner pointed out by the petitioners.

By certain public returns made by the Commissioner of Crown Lands and by the Surveyor General, and laid before the Legislature in compliance with an address of the 9th of October, 1843, it appears that the sums which are realized from the sales of the Reserves, are, in a great measure, sunk in the expense of management, and in defraying the general charges of the Land Granting Department.

Your Committee find that in addition to a deduction of 5 per cent. out of all monies received by the District Agents, and besides the charge of remunerating a large number of Inspectors of Clergy Reserves, who have been appointed to be paid by the day at a rate not specified in the returns,

the proceeds of these lands are also charged, by an order of the Government made in August 1841, with 40 per cent. of the expense of the Crown Land Department up to the time of that return. It appears that in Lower Canada there had been no sales of Clergy Reserves since the 1st January, 1838, and that since the Union of the Provinces, not more than about £1150 had been received on account of the funds, while £600, or more than one-half of the whole amount received, had been charged against it as disbursed for expenses.

In the first half of the year 1843, the whole monies collected in Lower Canada seem not to have exceeded £75 16s. 6d., while the disbursements charged against the fund are £431 9s. 2d.

In Upper Canada it appears by the same documents, that the sales of Reserves had been few for some time previously, though large sums had been received on account of previous sales.

In the year 1842, the collections amounted to £18,000, and the disbursements to £5,196.

For the year 1843, the amount collected up to the 1st of July is stated at about £7,000, and the charges at £1,763 11s. 3d., and while so large a sum, as that above mentioned, has been charged against the fund for disbursements, there appears to have been only a sale of 200 acres effected within that period, at the price of £90.

From the information above stated, it appears to your Committee, that there is really no proportion or connection whatever between the service rendered to the fund, and the charges which are imposed upon it.

For the considerations stated, your Committee, therefore, beg leave respectfully to suggest to your Honourable House, to adopt an Address to Her Most Gracious Majesty, beseeching Her Majesty to recommend to the Imperial Parliament to amend the said Act passed in the fourth year of Her Majesty's reign, so as to place at the disposal of the Church of England their share of the said Reserves in Upper and Lower Canada, to be controlled and managed by the respective Incorporated Church Societies of the Dioceses of Toronto and Quebec, and to extend to other denominations entitled to a share of the Clergy Reserve Fund, the same advantages, should they so desire.

Upon trust to hold the same for ever hereafter, to the intent and upon the trust that the rents, issues, and profits thereof,—after deducting all such charges and disbursements as may be incurred in the care and management of the said property, and in the execution of the said Trust,—may be appropriated and applied for the encouragement and support of Missionaries and Clergymen of the United Church of England and Ireland within the Diocese of Toronto, and for creating a fund towards the augmentation of the stipends of poor Clergymen.

Widows and Orphans' Fund.

Upon trust to hold the same for ever hereafter, to the intent and upon the trust that the rents, issues, and profits thereof, after deducting all such charges and disbursements as may be incurred in the care and management of said property and in the execution of the said trust, may be appropriated and applied towards the fund for making provision for the Widows and Orphans of the Clergy of the United Church of England and Ireland in the Diocese of Toronto.

Schools.

Upon trust to hold the same for ever hereafter, to the intent and upon the trust that the rents, issues, and profits thereof, after deducting all such charges and disbursements as may be incurred in the care and management of said property and in the execution of the said trust, may be appropriated and applied for the encouragement of Education and for the support of Day Schools and Sunday Schools in the Diocese of Toronto, in conformity with the principles of the United Church of England and Ireland.

Particular School.

Upon trust, &c., may be appropriated and applied for the support of Day Schools and Sunday Schools [or Day Schools] [or Sunday Schools] in the Township of or for the support of a School which hath been established on Lot No. in the Concession of the Township of in the Diocese of Toronto, in conformity with the principles of the United Church of England and Ireland.

Divinity Students.

Upon trust, &c., may be appropriated and applied towards a fund for granting assistance, where it may be necessary, to those who may be preparing for the Ministry of the Gospel in the United Church of England and Ireland in the Diocese of Toronto.

Circulation of Bibles, Prayer Books, and Religious Books and Tracts.

Upon trust, &c., may be appropriated and applied towards the circulating, in the Diocese of Toronto, the Holy Scriptures, the Book of Common Prayer of the United Church of England and Ireland, and such other Books and Tracts as shall be approved by the Church Society of the Diocese of Toronto aforesaid.

Erection and Endowment of Churches and Parsonages.

Upon trust, &c., may be appropriated and applied towards the erection, endowment, and maintenance of Churches according to the establishment of the United Church of England and Ireland in the Diocese of Toronto; the creation and maintenance of Parsonage-Houses; the setting apart of Burial-Grounds and Church-Yards, and the endowment and support of Parsonages and Rectories according to the same Establishment.

Site of a Church.

Upon trust to hold the same for ever hereafter, for the use of a Church of the United Church of England and Ireland, to be erected upon the said parcel or tract of land, and for a Burial-Ground in connexion therewith.

Endowment of a Church.

Upon trust, &c., may be appropriated and applied to the support of the Incumbent of that certain Church of the United Church of England and Ireland, situated in called

Site for a Parsonage-House.

Upon trust to hold the same for ever hereafter, as a site for a Parsonage-House, for the use of the Clergyman of the United Church of England and Ireland doing duty at

A BEQUEST OF PERSONAL ESTATE.
