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THE HAMILTON

St. Andrew's Benevolent Society.

The varied migrations of Scotchmen have given rise to several peculiar associations in the lands of their adoption. In their dispersions throughout the world, they have ever carried with them many of the institutions and sympathies characteristic of their fatherland. The cherished impressions of youth and manhood, of country and kindred, have sought development, and, in many cases, have firmly established themselves by vigorous societies of different descriptions, in every community of our countrymen.

It is to the love of the place of our birth, and to our natural affection for home scenes, that we attribute the founding of our "Curling Clubs," our "Burns' Anniversaries," "Friendly," and more especially our St. Andrew's Societies."

The hardships endured by the early pioneers of civilization in this western world, have tended to a most beneficent end. "Fellow feeling makes us wondrous kind," and the dictates of human sympathy have, therefore, everywhere originated the brightest and best of all our associations—"the St. Andrew's Society,"—the predominant feature of which is the manifestation of love in action;—benevolence, the guiding principle; while at the same time, the kindly feeling engendered among the associated members, is not the least desirable of its effects. Whatever tends to throw any light on the origin and progress, the cultivation and expansion of the best sympathies of our nature, must commend itself to the mind of every Scotchman.

The St. Andrew's Society of Hamilton, therefore, have determined to publish along with the rules of the Society, some short account of

its origin and progress, and the names of those who have been intrusted with the duties of office, and of all others who have been "honorable" connected with it.

The earliest record dates as far back as 1835. During that year the Scotch residents of Hamilton incorporated themselves with the members of the "United St. Andrew's Society of Ancaster, Dundas and Flamboro," into a new Society, styled the "District of Gore St. Andrew's Benevolent Society." The objects of the Association are briefly but distinctly stated in the following paragraph, taken from the basis of Union :—"That the object of the Society shall be to afford advice to emigrants from Scotland, and pecuniary aid to poor persons from that country, when absolutely necessary ; with the view of diverting charity to worthy objects on the one hand, and to prevent imposition on the other."

The constitution was adopted at a general meeting, held in Hamilton, on the 12th January, 1836, the principal features of which still form the rules for the government of the Society.

At that general meeting the following office-bearers were appointed :

CONSTITUTION

OF THE

HAMILTON**St. Andrew's Benevolent Society.**

ARTICLE I.*Name and Seal of the Society.*

The name of the Society shall be "THE HAMILTON ST. ANDREW'S BENEVOLENT SOCIETY," and shall have a common Seal with its name engraved thereon around the Arms of Scotland and the National Motto "Nemo me impune lacescit."

ARTICLE II.*Object of the Society.*

The object of the Society is strictly charitable and is intended to afford assistance to Scotchmen and their descendants, especially immigrants who may be in want of pecuniary or other aid.

ARTICLE III.*Of Members.*

Scotchmen and their descendants may be admitted members.

When any one is proposed for admission, the mover and seconder shall give to the Secretary, at a meeting of the Society, a written statement, mentioning the name of the Candidate, his occupation, place of nativity, and present residence, which statement shall be read; and, if approved, he may be elected at once.

The election shall be by ballot, and the consent of a majority of the members present shall be necessary to the admission of a candidate.

No one shall be considered a member until he has subscribed to the Constitution, and paid the first annual subscription, for the proper fulfilment of which the proposer and seconder shall be held responsible.

ARTICLE IV.

Of Honorary Members.

Natives of Scotland and their descendants may be proposed and seconded for Honorary Membership at a meeting of the Society, and ballotted for at the next Quarterly Meeting, at which there shall be not less than twenty (20) members present, and shall be entitled to a certificate of admission, authenticated with the Seal of the Society, and signed by the President and Secretary. A two-third vote shall be necessary for election.

ARTICLE V.

Officers of the Society.

A President, 1st and 2nd Vice-Presidents, a Treasurer, a Secretary, two or more Chaplains, two or more Physicians. Four other Officers to be called the Charitable Committee and two Auditors shall be chosen annually from among the members residing in the City, at the preparatory meeting hereinafter mentioned, who shall be installed and enter upon the duties of their respective offices on the Festival of St. Andrew next ensuing. The Election shall be by ballot, and a majority of votes shall decide.

The President shall be elected first, afterwards the rest of the officers shall be elected separately in the order above given.

ARTICLE VI.

Stated Meetings of the Society.

The Society shall hold Quarterly Meetings on the Second Thursday in February, May and August, and the first Thursday in November, which shall be the meeting preparatory to the Anniversary Assembly.

The President, or in his absence, the Officer highest in rank who may be present, shall appoint the place of next meeting, and the Secretary shall give notice thereof to the members, five (5) of whom shall be necessary to form a quorum. At all meetings the names of the members present shall be recorded.

ARTICLE VII.

Special Meetings of the Society.

The President, or in his absence, the Officer highest in rank shall, when any emergency occurs which in his opinion may render it expedient, or upon the written application made for that purpose by five members, call a special meeting of the Society.

The Secretary shall give notice thereof to the members, eleven of whom shall constitute a quorum.

Special meetings shall be competent for the transaction of such business as shall be stated in the notice calling such meeting, but no other.

The consent of two-thirds of the members present shall be necessary to decide any question, and the yeas and nays shall be recorded by the Secretary.

ARTICLE VIII.

Anniversary Assembly.

As the benevolent views of the Society will be greatly promoted by social intercourse among the members, the Society shall hold an Anniversary Assembly, and such members as may be thereunto disposed and their friends, shall celebrate the day as the preparatory meeting may direct.

The members shall on that day appear with a St. Andrew's Cross, or a Thistle, displayed on the left breast. When St. Andrew's Day happens on a Sunday, the first of December shall be observed as the Festival.

ARTICLE IX.

Duty of the President.

The President shall, when he is present, preside at all meetings of the Society, preserve order, put the question, and declare the decision.

He shall call special meetings of the Society when he may judge it proper, or when he shall be applied to for that purpose, as provided in article VII.

ARTICLE X.

Duty of the Vice-Presidents.

The duties specified in the foregoing article, shall devolve upon the Vice-Presidents in the absence of the President, according to their rank in the Society.

ARTICLE XI.

Duty of the Treasurer.

The Treasurer shall have the charge of the current funds of the Society ; he shall keep regular accounts of his receipts and expenditure, in suitable books provided for that purpose ; he shall at each Quarterly Meeting present an Abstract of his Accounts, stating the sums Received and Expended since the previous Quarterly Meeting, stating the Cash on Hand, that the Society may, if they think proper, take order for the disposal thereof, and at the annual preparatory meeting he shall present a statement of the Receipts and Expenditure during the year ; he shall have his books audited by the proper officers, at this meeting ; he shall enter in his books each sum paid by him on the order of the Charitable Committee, and the name of the person to whom the money was paid.

ARTICLE XII.

The Duty of the Secretary.

The Secretary shall have the custody of all the Records, Journals, the Seal, Badges and other property of the Society, and shall make regular and correct Minutes of all the proceedings at each meeting : he shall keep a list of the names of the members of the Society, and an account of the fees and dues that accrue ; shall collect the same and make payment to the Treasurer, taking his receipt therefor.

... all summon, as directed, the members to all meetings ; he shall, on the order of the Society, erase from the list of members the names of all such persons, as, by the terms of the Constitution shall have forfeited their title to membership, making report thereof

to the next meeting; he shall appoint, if necessary, a suitable person for collecting dues under his direction, who shall receive not more than 10 per cent. therefor, and for whose fidelity he shall be responsible.

He shall present a report at each Quarterly Meeting, and also a synopsis for the year at the annual preparatory meeting, and also have his books audited by the proper officers for this meeting.

ARTICLE XIII.

Duty of the Chaplains.

It shall be the duty of the Chaplains to perform the religious duties customary at the meetings of the Society; by their counsel and advice to promote harmony and good-will among the members, and to visit such sick and distressed persons as may be recommended to their attention by the Charitable Committee.

ARTICLE XIV.

Duty of the Physicians.

It shall be the duty of the Physicians to give their advice and assistance to such persons as may be recommended to their attention by the Charitable Committee, the Society defraying expenses for medicines.

ARTICLE XV.

Of the Charitable Committee.

The Charitable Committee shall attend to poor and distressed persons, natives of Scotland and their descendants, enquire into their circumstances, assist them with their advice, and grant them such pecuniary aid from the Society's funds as they may think proper.

Any two of them may grant orders on the Treasurer for such an amount as in their opinion the case may require.

They shall keep a record of all applications for relief presented, recording in full the name, age, trade or occupation, and native place of applicant, and generally all available information regarding each individual case.

If relief be granted, the nature and amount shall be stated; if refused, the reasons for refusal.

They shall make a report of their proceedings at each Quarterly meeting, and a synopsis of the whole at each annual preparatory meeting, and shall be responsible to the Society for all their transactions, whether done in their collective capacity, or by the act of any two of them.

ARTICLE XVI.

Of the Executive Committee.

The Executive Committee shall consist of the President, Vice-Presidents, the Treasurer, Secretary and the members of the Charitable Committee, and shall have the general management of the affairs of the Society.

*ARTICLE XVII.

Duty of the Auditors.

The duty of the Auditors* shall be to examine the Books and Accounts of the Treasurer and Secretary, and to make a report to the Society at the Annual Preparatory Meeting, or at any other time they may be required to do so by the President.

ARTICLE XVIII.

Installation of Officers.

At the annual preparatory meeting a Committee of two members shall be appointed, who shall, on the Anniversary Festival, present and install the officers elected for the ensuing year.

ARTICLE XIX.

Death, Resignation or Removal of Officers.

In case of the death, resignation, or removal of any of the officers during the year, the Society shall, at the next meeting elect others in their room to serve for the remainder of the year.

ARTICLE XX.

Funeral of Deceased Members.

The Society shall attend the funerals of its deceased members, the order of procession being the same as given in election of officers, (Article V,) the non-official members following.

ARTICLE XXI.

Of the Funds of the Society.

The funds of the Society shall be improved to the best advantage; therefore, if at any time there should be more money in the hands of the Treasurer than the exigencies of the poor require, the same shall be invested at interest in Dominion Securities, or one of the Chartered Banks, or in Real Property.

It shall not be competent for any meeting to direct the disposal or appropriation of any part of the Society's Stock vested in Dominion Securities, any of the Chartered Banks, or in Real Property, unless the President, or one of the Vice-Presidents, and at least twenty members be present.

ARTICLE XXII.

The Fees and Dues to be paid to the Society.

Members shall, upon their election, and subscribing to the Constitution, pay a sum of not less than One Dollar, which shall be their subscription for the current year, and shall contribute not less than One Dollar annually, to be paid on the first of May, in each and every succeeding year.

ARTICLE XXIII.

Of Life Members.

On the payment, by any member of a sum not less than Ten Dollars, the same shall be accepted, if so desired by the Society, in lieu of any further subscription or contribution.

ARTICLE XXIV.

Of Delinquency in Paying Dues.

All members of the Society shall, within six months after their admission, subscribe to the Constitution, otherwise they shall be con-

sidered as having forfeited their membership; and in future, if any member, unless in indigent circumstances, of which the Society shall judge, shall refuse or neglect to pay his dues for one year after they become due, provided he has been called upon or notified by the Secretary or Collector, shall be considered as having withdrawn from the Society, and the Secretary, in accordance with Article XII, shall erase his name from the list of members.

ARTICLE XXV.

Members Absent from the City.

Any member being absent more than a year at any one time, may, if he think fit, decline paying his subscription for the time he has been absent; and, on his stating in writing to the Secretary, the time of his absence, the charge standing against him in the Secretary's books shall be cancelled.

ARTICLE XXVI.

Order of Procedure at Meetings.

At each meeting of the Society, after the presiding officer shall have taken the chair:—

1st. The minutes of the previous regular meeting, and any special meeting, shall be read by the Secretary, and when approved shall be signed by the Chairman.

- 2nd. The Report of the Treasurer.
 - 3rd. The Report of the Secretary.
 - 4th. The Report of the Charitable Committee.
 - 5th. Communications Received.
 - 6th. Reports of Special Committees.
 - 7th. Proposal and Election of Candidates.
 - 8th. Business deferred or new.
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ARTICLE XXVII.

Obedience to the Rules of the Society.

The members of the Society shall faithfully observe and conform to the rules and regulations made by the Society, and entered in the books thereof, on pain of being dismissed.

ARTICLE XXVIII.

Expulsion of Members.

If a majority of members present at any quarterly meeting, at which there are not less than 20 members present, shall vote for the expulsion of a member, his name shall be erased and he shall not afterward be allowed to attend any meeting of the Society, unless again elected as a new member.

ARTICLE XXIX.

The mode of altering the Constitution.

Any proposal for altering the Constitution of the Society shall be made in writing at one of the regular meetings, but not adopted except at a meeting called specially for that purpose, not less than one month after the proposal has been made, or at the next quarterly meeting, at which the President, or one of the Vice-Presidents, and not less than twenty members shall be present, the consent of a majority of whom shall be necessary to ratify any alteration; and such proposal to alter the Constitution shall be stated in the notice calling the meeting.

The foregoing By-Laws and Constitution were adopted at a special meeting of the Society called for that purpose held at the Board Room of the Mechanics' Institute, on September 14th, 1876.
