# RUSSIANS OUTNUMBERED

London, Feb. 28 .- The fog enveloping the seat of war is again dense. It has not lifted at Possiet Bay, where a Japanese army corps has been reported as landing for the investment of Viadivostock, or at Ping-yang, where the scouts of the two armies are described as skirmishing in advance of a big battle in Northern Korea, or at Dalny, where a third army corps is expected to go ashore unless the mouth of the Hua-kwan River, east of Pitzuwo, be preferred, as in 1894. It is thicker than ever at Nagasaki and other Japanese ports, where thirteen divis-sions have been mobilized for military operations, and it is even blacker at St. Petersburg, where General Kuropatkin is reported as blurting out a plan for the withdrawal of the Russian army from Harbin to the a plan for the withdrawal of the Russian army from fratom to the Transbalkal frontier—a preposterous suggestion at the present stage of hostilities.
