### ELEVENTH ANNUAL REPORT

OF THE MANAGERS OF

## THE ORPHANS' HOME

AND

#### FEMALE AID SOCIETY, TORONTO.

It has again become the duty of the managers to present to the members of this corporation, at their annual meeting, a report of the proceedings of the Society during their year of office; and in doing so the managers desire to record with grateful pleasure the continued prosperity of the Institution, and the uniform good health of the children, with which a kind and merciful Providence has blessed them.

During the past year sixteen children have been admitted into the Home as recipients of the charity, and fifteen children have during the same space of time left the Institution—of whom six have been adopted, six have been taken out by their mothers, who have again become able to support them, and three have been apprenticed into respectable families. It will be observed that this is a far smaller number than was apprenticed out the previous year; but this has happened, however, not for want of applications—for they have been numerous—but because the children in the Home were so young that the managers thought it advisable to retain them until they should become stronger and better disciplined for the duties they might have to perform, and in this the managers have but availed themselves of the ninth rule of the Society, which provides that "children are to be retained in the Home until they are twelve years of age, unless a particularly good situation should offer for a child of an earlier age, when the case may be discretionary with the managers." There are at the present time in the Home sixty children—forty boys and twenty girls—of whom there is but one over twelve years of age; excepting, however, four girls, who are being trained up in the Home to assist in the domestic management of the Institution to save the expense of hired help.

In the month of October last the scarlet fever made its appearance among the children. Providentially five only took the disease, and those, under the skilful treatment of Dr. Ogden and the kind care of Mrs. Holmes and the nurse, were soon restored to health.

The Treasurer's accounts for the past year, now laid before the meeting, show that the sum of \$2,160 37 has (including the balance on the previous year's accounts) been received during the year from subscriptions, donations and other sources for the general purposes of the Institution, and amongst the donors, the managers think it due specially to mention with grateful thanks the young ladies of Mrs. Marshall's academy, who sent \$32 45; Miss Smith, of Liverpool, Eng-

land, \$41 36; the officers of the 30th Regiment \$65, and the sum of \$46 39 collected by the Orange Society, on the occasion of laying the corner stone of the east wing, on the 12th of July last.

The expenditure for ordinary purposes during the past year has been the sum of \$1,703 59, and in the payment of the balance on the building of the west wing \$194 92, and for sheds and repairs to the building \$76 64, leaving a balance in hand for the general purposes of the charity \$185 22.

The Managers would also notice a bequest of \$400 to the Institution, by the late Mr. Sanderson, which has been invested on real estate for the benefit of the charity.

It is proper to observe here that the collector who had faithfully performed his duty the previous year, became a defaulter in the past year's collections to the amount of \$120. This unfortunate event of the collector's defalcation determined the managers, if possible, to be their own collectors in the future.

Miss Holmes, who at the date of the last report had undertaken the regular tuition of the children, having since been married, the managers have succeeded in finding a person well qualified to succeed her in the office at a salary of \$100 per annum, and the managers would here observe that the children have been so much benefitted by the regular tuition of a governess that they feel themselves perfectly justified in incurring this outlay.

The managers deem it proper to inform the meeting that the Rev. Dr. Lett, who from the commencement of this society had been its esteemed and worthy Chaplain, was reluctantly compelled, on his leaving Toronto, to resign the office he had filled with so much zeal and usefulness; and that the Rev. Dr. Fuller has since kindly officiated in that capacity.

And the managers, in resigning their trust into the hands of the members of this association, sincerely hope that their failings may be avoided by their successors in office, and that the future management of the institution may be noted for greatly increased energy and zeal. And they devoutly pray that Almighty God may continue to watch over and protect the "Home" of the orphan and the fatherless.
