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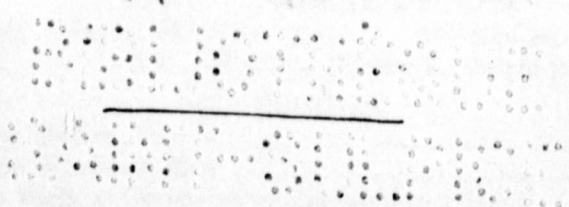

ECLIPSES.

There will be in 1839 only two Eclipses, which is the smallest number that can happen in one year, both of the Sun, and both invisible to the inhabitants of Lower Canada, viz:—March 15th, a total Eclipse of the Sun will commence on the Pacific Ocean, in long. 96° 37' W., lat. 32° 24' S., and cross the Southern Continent of America, the Atlantic, and Interior Africa, ending near Egypt—visible as a partial Eclipse in most countries of Europe. Sept. 7th, an annular Eclipse of the Sun will commence near the Japan Islands, and cross the Pacific Ocean, ending near South America, in lat. 20° 50' S.

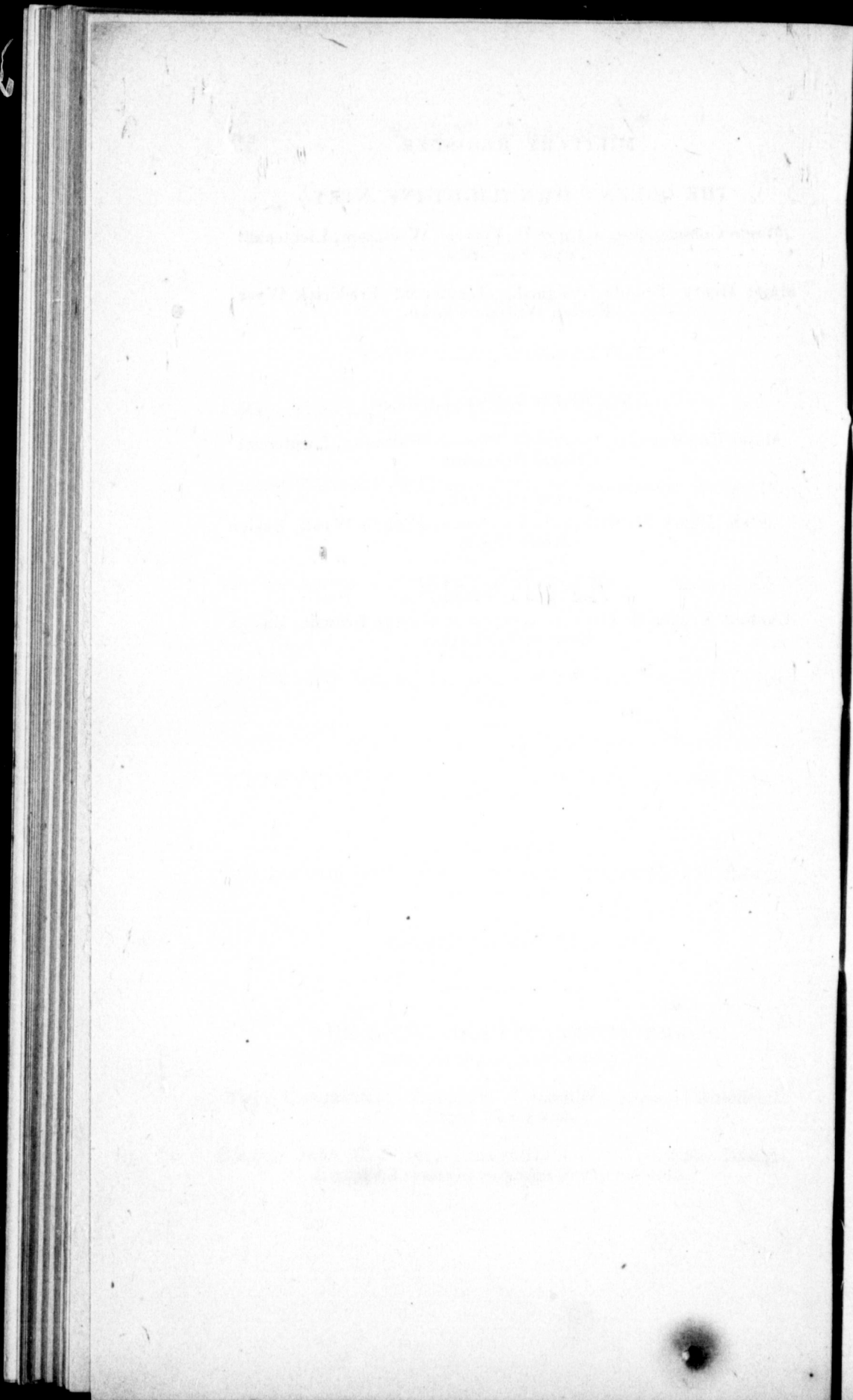

Letters are forwarded to Newfoundland, upon payment of the Postage to Halifax only.

Letters for the above foreign places, (from France to Bermuda inclusive) can only be received at the offices of Quebec, Montreal, Kingston, Toronto City and Queenston. In rating these letters, the following rule is to be observed: for example, a person at Kingston wishes to send a letter to France—he must pay 2s. 5d. which is the Postage from Kingston to Halifax, and 3s. 9d., the Postage from Halifax to France, and the Post-Master will rate, viz:

Paid to Halifax, 2s. 5d.

Paid to France, 3s. 9d.

Observe that this 3s. 9d. is to be sent in Cash to the Postmaster at Quebec, who will remit it to Halifax.

Letters for any part of the Continent of British North America, or for Prince Edward Island, can be sent with or without payment of the postage at the time of posting.

Letters for Europe can, during the season of navigation, be sent through the Quebec office upon paying the postage to Quebec only. If they are to be sent via Halifax per the Falmouth packet, the postage must be paid to Halifax. If via New-York, both the Provincial and United States Postage must be paid.

Packets of one ounce weight are charged as four single letters. If a single sheet exceed one ounce, it is charged according to its weight.

Packets or covers, containing patterns or samples only, not exceeding one ounce, are charged double postage.

English stamped Newspapers and Colonial Papers, if open, are conveyed free to and from England by the Halifax packets.

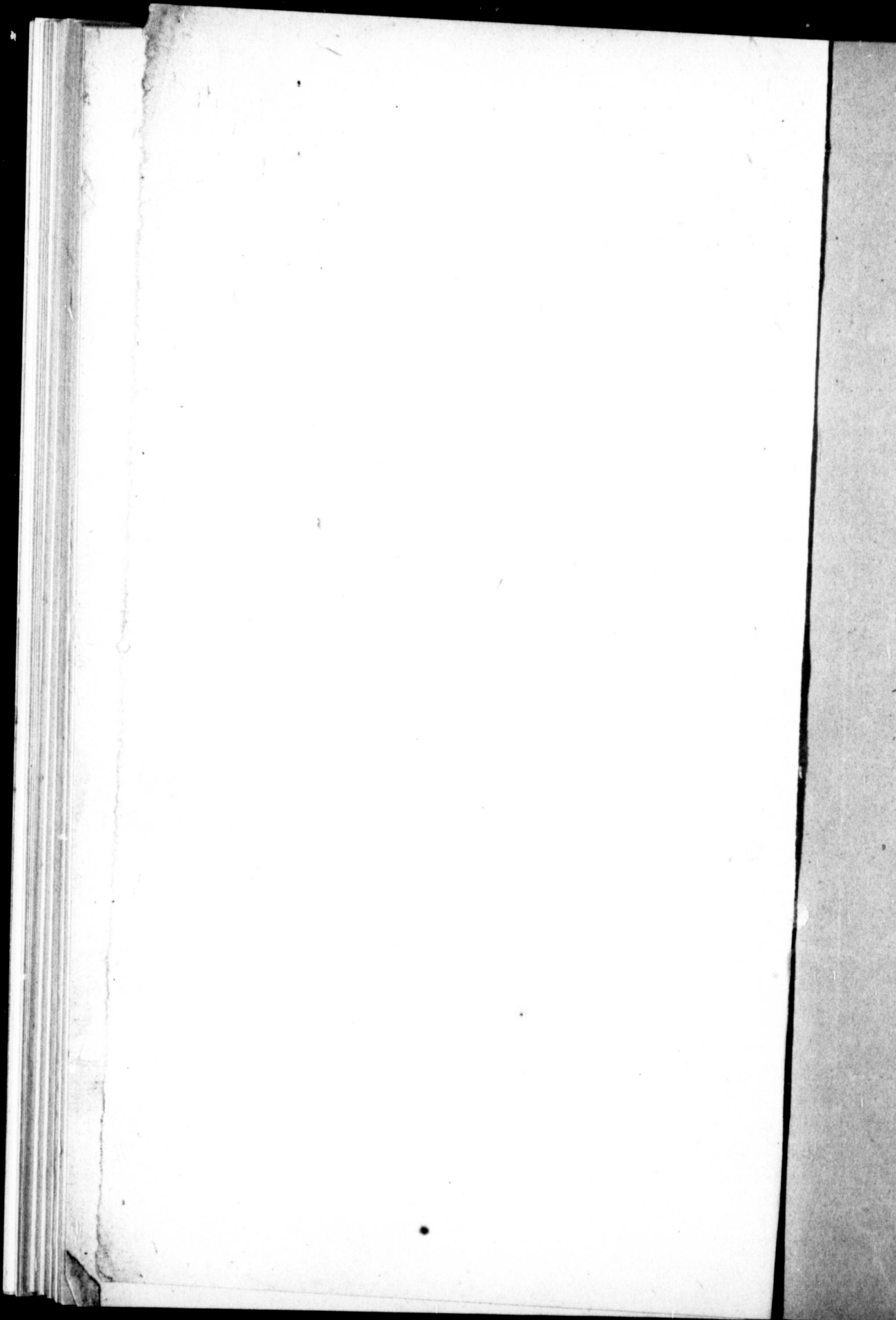

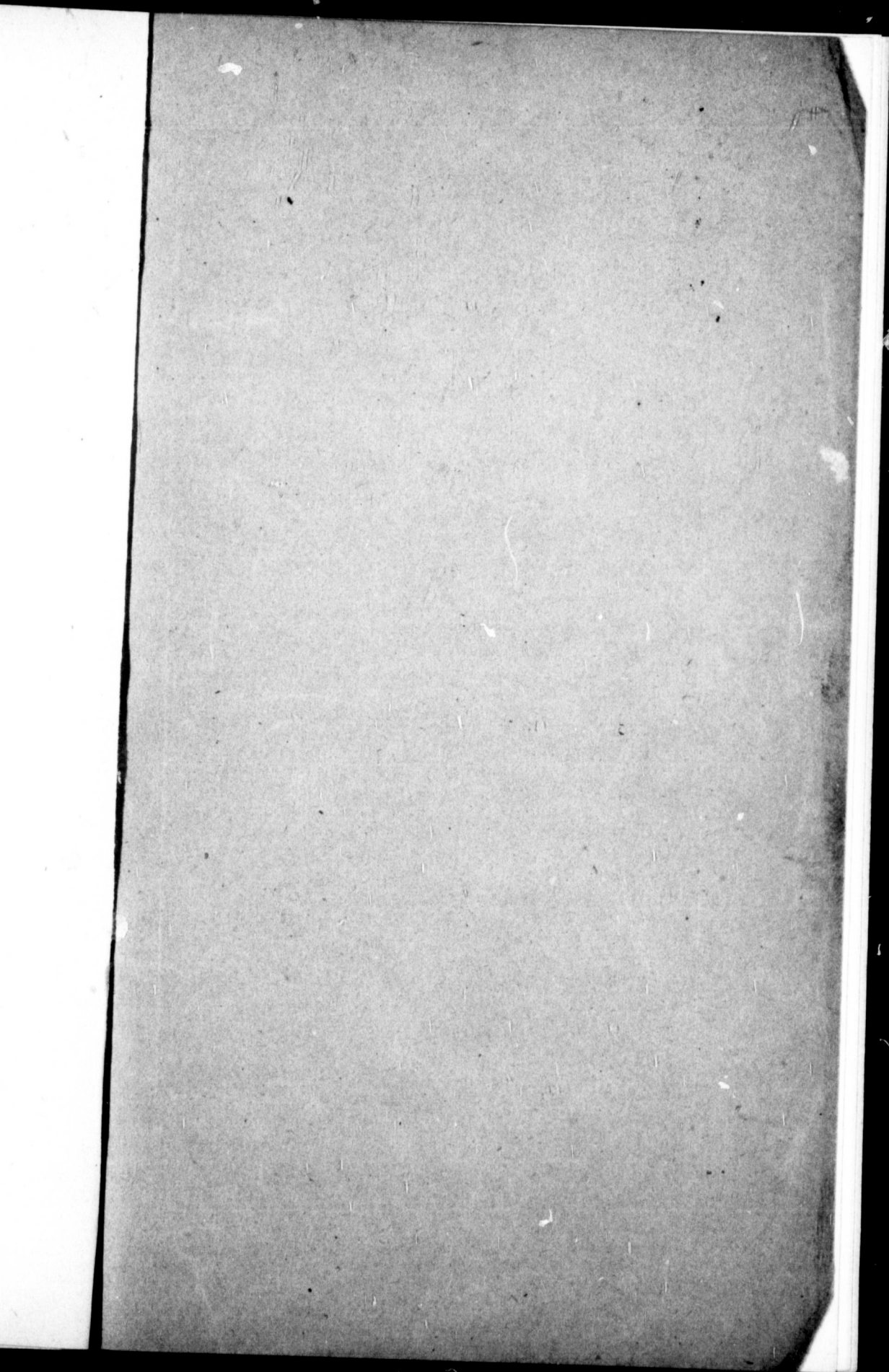
