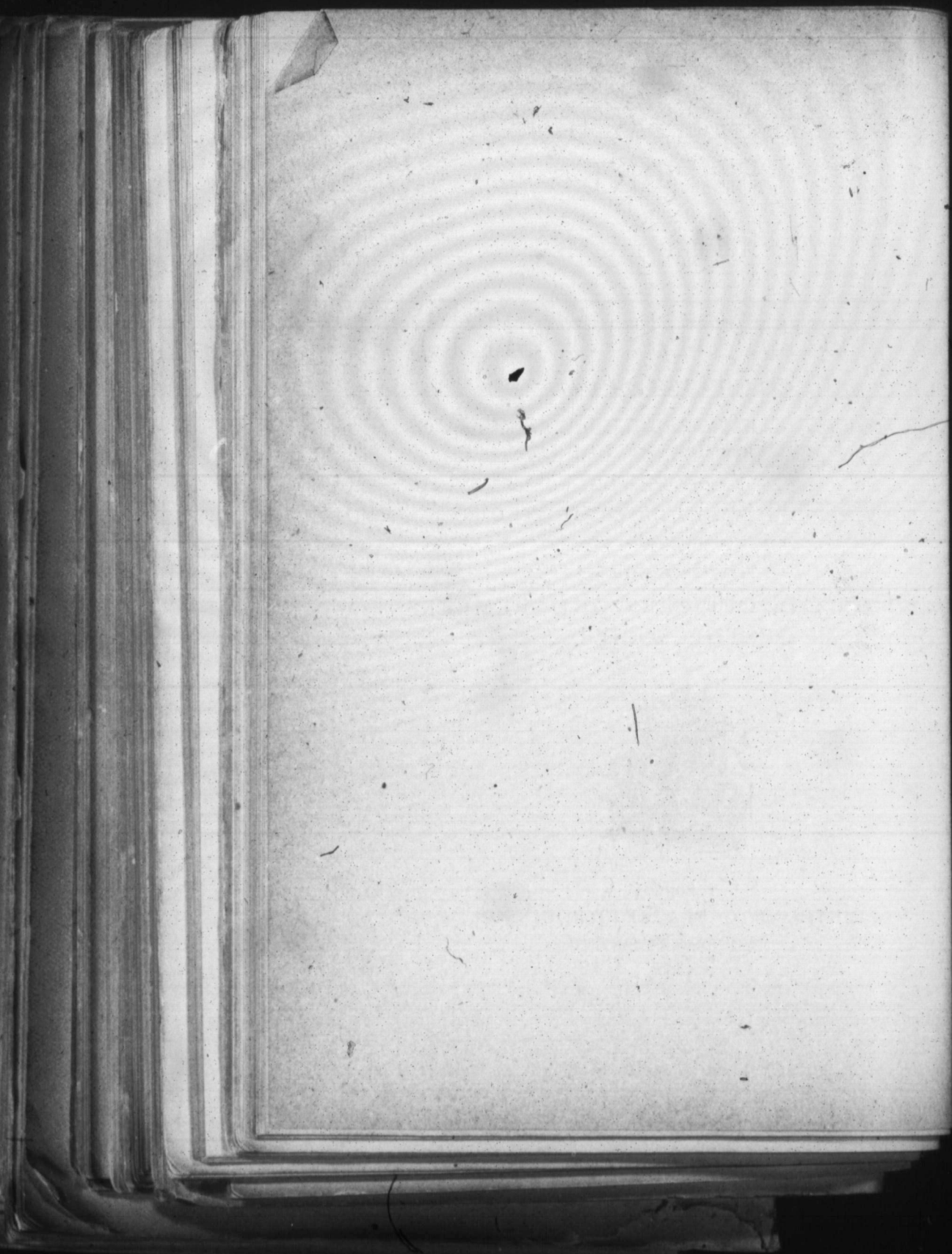

SIXTY-FIRST ANNUAL REPORT
OF THE
COMMITTEE OF MANAGEMENT
OF THE
ST. GEORGE'S SOCIETY
OF TORONTO.
FOR THE YEAR 1895.

YOUR Committee in presenting their Annual Report for the year that has just passed are pleased to be able to congratulate the members upon the continued usefulness of the Society.

The numbers of single, able-bodied men that continue to come to the Society for assistance are a serious drain upon the Society's funds.

RECEIPTS

The total receipts from all sources, including the balance of \$346,16 from last year, amount to \$2,637,61. In the receipts for the annual membership fees, there has

been a falling off, owing to deaths, removals, and the great depression prevailing throughout the year. The life membership fees show a fair increase over the past year. The other sources of revenue were generally smaller than other years, but the one great financial event of the year which was of such an unusual character, viz., the collection for the erection of the Monument in St. James Cemetery, was most liberally responded to.

During the year 1,281 applicants have been relieved as far as practicable according to their various wants and requirements, and services rendered them which are sometimes of more value than even the amount of substantial aid given.

The amount expended in this relief has been \$712.92. Orders for eleven graves for adults, and eight for children have been given in our lots in St. James Cemetery, there being now but little unoccupied space therein.

Great scarcity of employment still prevails in Toronto; it is, however, hoped and expected that an improvement will soon take place.

FINANCIAL.

The Treasurer's statement shows, as heretofore, that the Society is in a sound healthy condition.

MEMBERSHIP.

There have been sixteen Life Members and twenty-nine Ordinary Members elected during the year. The numbers at the present time are : Honorary Members, eleven ; Life Members, four hundred and thirty ; Ordinary Members, five hundred and forty.

So far as is known, eight Life Members have died during the year, viz. : Mr. W. J. Baines, an estimable gentleman, belonging to one of the oldest residential families of the city ; Mr. T. Dean, a very warm-hearted and industrious man ; Mr. A. B. Harrison, holding a responsible position in the Molson's Bank ; Mr. C. E. Hooper, a very amiable kind-hearted gentleman and most highly respected man ; Mr. Frank J. Joseph one of the original Charter Members of the Society, at one time an active worker, and always a generous contributor to the funds of the Society, who met with a very sad and shocking death by an accident on the railway ; Mr. F. J. Menet, an active business man ; Mr. A. Oxford, keeping an hotel that was much patronized by farmers coming to the market ; Mr. P. J. Statter, long connected with the Grand Trunk Rail Road. And six Ordinary Members have died, viz., Mr. Richard Lewis, one of the oldest teachers in the Public Schools, and of Elocution in the city, for many years an officer of the Society, and a gentleman of much repute, and greatly esteemed. Mr. E. Samuel, a very highly respected Merchant in the city. Mr. S. Tidey, an old member much respected, and of a very quiet unpretentious character, Mr. R. Bagley a respectable business man ; Mr. H. Benham, a

very kind and generous contributor to the funds of the Society and Mr. C. S. Collard who was of a generous character.

ANNIVERSARIES, ENTERTAINMENTS, ETC.

The regular established usage of attending Divine Service in St. James Cathedral, on the Sunday afternoon nearest to St. George's Day, was again carried out. The rector, the Rev. Canon Du Moulin had very kindly consented to preach, and his sermon was a very able one. The musical portion of the service, under the direction of Mr. E. W. Schuch, was particularly well rendered. His Lordship, the Bishop of Quebec, Rev. Dr. Scadding, the Chaplain of the Society; the Rev. C. J. Boulden and several of the past Chaplains of the Society were present and took part in the service. Our brethren the Sons of England, as heretofore, joined us in goodly numbers and the church was well filled. The collection was an average one.

SMOKING CONCERT.

On the 11th of March, a very successful smoking concert was held in the Hall, and was much enjoyed by those that were present. The Hall was comfortably filled. Past President D. T. Symons was presented with the Past President's medal, and made a feeling response thereon.

ANNUAL DINNER.

The annual dinner was held in the Hall, on Tuesday, April 23rd, St. George's Day and never on any previous

occasion was the Society so highly honoured, His Excellency the Governor General of Canada being on the right hand of the President, and His Honour the Lieutenant Governor of Ontario on his left, with many other of the most notable gentlemen of the Province on either side.

EXCURSION.

The annual excursion was again to the Falls of Niagara, by the large and commodious boats of the Niagara River Line, and the Electric Railway. It was a beautiful day, there was a very fair attendance, and the excursion was much enjoyed.

SPECIAL DONATION.

Mr. E. Hooper, Vice-President of the Canada Permanent Loan and Savings Company, has very generously donated twenty-five shares of the stock in the St. George's Hall Company to the Society, making 417 shares in that Company which the Society now holds.

ST. GEORGE'S UNION.

The Sixteenth Convention of the St. George's Union was held in Kingston, on the 20th to the 23rd of August. Mr. O. A. Howland very kindly undertook to represent the Society at the request of the Committee, taking a very prominent part in the discussions. Our President was elected 1st Vice-President of the Union.

The next meeting of the Union is intended to be held in Utica, N. Y. State.

THE MONUMENT.

The want of some mark of recognition on the large and prominently situated plot of ground owned by the Society in St. James Cemetery had long been felt, and during the summer season, on the occasion of the President and some other members of the Society attending the funeral of a member, the matter was brought forward, and a determination made to at once remedy the deficiency. In accordance therewith a sub-committee was appointed to obtain plans for a suitable monument and to raise the necessary funds to pay for the same. Several plans were received, and that furnished by Mr. J. G. Gibson selected. The monument was subsequently erected and unveiled on the 29th day of November by the President. His Lordship the Bishop of Toronto, and our Chaplains, the Rev. C. J. Boulden and the Rev. Dr. Thomas, taking part in the religious portion of the service, and the Honorable John Beverley Robinson delivering an oration thereon.

The sum of \$572.75 has been raised for the expenditure connected therewith and \$551.75 expended, leaving the sum of \$21 from which the cost of planting shrubs etc., etc., in the spring will be deducted. Thus has been accomplished one of the noblest and one of the most enduring works of the Society.

ANOTHER SMOKING CONCERT.

On the 12th of November a second smoking concert was held, it was well attended and most thoroughly enjoyed; these smoking concerts have proved a most satisfactory means of bringing the members together, and it is urgently hoped that they may continue to be a source of pleasure

and that the opportunity of meeting in friendly intercourse may be availed of by many of our members on future occasions.

CHRISTMAS DISTRIBUTION.

The regular Christmas distribution was made on Tuesday, December the 24th. The convenience to the distribution of having the Hall for the reception of the applicants, their gradually passing down the stairway to the supper room, where they were served and thence out by the front entrance is in marked contrast with the arrangements previous to the erection of the Hall. The collections amounted to \$965.00; the expenditure to \$815.37, leaving a balance of \$149 63. Six hundred and sixty-nine families consisting of two thousand nine hundred and ninety-three individuals, were supplied, being about the usual average number.

Seven thousand three hundred and forty-nine lbs of beef, eighteen hundred loaves of bread (4 lb) nine hundred lbs. of sugar, two hundred lbs. of tea and a quantity of sweet meats were purchased, and a large quantity of meat and sundry other things given, so that there was an abundant supply.

In conclusion, the retiring committee have the satisfaction of feeling that they leave the Society in a thoroughly efficient position to their successors.
