

AN EXTRAORDINARY MEDICAL CASE IN NEW ORLEANS.

The doctors of New Orleans are greatly interested in the case of a young German named George Nicker, who fell from a platform about four months ago.

It was supposed that he would die in a few hours, for his head was twice the natural size, and nearly every structure of the skull was enlarged. The left half of the skull was a good deal larger than the right.

Several places, comprising the brain and covered from his mouth, eyes, nose and ears, and his five senses were supposed to be protruded out of their sockets, rising, falling, and checking five times their natural size, and almost as black as coal.

As an important marking, the Sheriff of Carlton County has called a meeting of the inhabitants to be held on the 10th Feb., for the purpose of taking into consideration various public matters.
