Tonorro, Nov. 10th. Tonorro, Nov. 10th. The Attorney-General introduced the following bill respecting the election of members to the Legislative Assembly: 1. It provides that no person holding an office of emolument under the Dom-inion of Canada or the Province of On-tario shall be eligible as a member of the Legislative Assembly. 2. The members of the Executive Council of the Province are exempt from the ineligibility, also any officer of Her Majesty'sarmy and navy, and any officer in the militia or militiaman, (except officers of the staff of the militia receiving per-manent salaries) unless otherwise dis-qualified. 3. A statement of the Public accounts of the Province of Ontario for the first nine ruenths of the present year, was laid before the House on Mon-tay, by the Treasurer, Mr. Wood, We have not space to give the items in detail. Suffice it to say that the total revenue of the Province from all sources for the time mentioned has been \$1,530,636.31 Of this sum \$1, 193,750.00 was from the Dominion on account of subsidy, and the remainder account of subsidy, and the remainder meterued from refunds, Crown Land Revenue, special funds, as Olergy Common School and Grammar School ands, from Tavern Licenses, Interest on Debentures, Consolidated Muni cipal Loan Fund, fines, forfeitures &c. The total expenditure has been \$1, 744,230.37, leaving a balance to the oredit of the Province of \$456,405.94. This balance consists of cash in the Royal Canadian Bank \$76,545. 65; amount of unexpended warrant for contigencies \$1,613.16; amount in Banks to credit of Crown Lands 65,769.926-these sums making up the total balance mentioned above. 


