THE ABOLITION OF CHURCH PATRONAGE IN SCOTLAND.—A deputation from the General Assembly of the Established Church of Scotland, headed by Dr. Macleod and Dr. Pirie, and accompanied by several noblemen and members of Parliament, whited upon Mr. Gladstone, on June 18th, to urge upon the Government the necessity of taking steps next session for the abolition of patronage, in accordance with the resolution adopted at the late meeting of the Established Assembly. Dr. Macleod stated briefly the object of the deputation; and after some explanations had been made, Mr. Gladstone stated several difficulties in the way of settling the question. At the same time, he requested the deputation to furnish him with all the information they possessed, but he declined to make any immediate promise on the subject.


