

Mr. Chapleau on Commercial Union. We find the following in The New York Tribune of Saturday:

The Secretary of State for Canada, J. A. Chapleau of Ottawa, is a well-formed, handsone man, of perhaps 50 years of age, with a smooth-shaven, classical face, iron-gray mustache and long black hair. In manners he is somewhat French and extremely polite. He is at the Fifth-avenue Hotel with his wife and her parents, Colonel C. King and Mrs. King of Sherbrooke, Canada. The party will sail for Europe to-day by the French line of steamers to spend two months in France. Mr. Chapleau in answer to inquiries about Canadian affairs said among other things:

"There is no matter of great public moment at present engaging attention in Canada. There is considerable talk about commercial union with the United States and about reciprocity. But I think, there is a great deal more ras about it on both sides of the line than there is solid progress toward such a union. The statesmen are not inclined to support it."

"What do the statesmen want?"


