

Daily Chronicle, under the heading "R.I.P.," says: On Saturday the proprietors of The New York Herald London daily (reduced in size some time ago) announced that they did not intend to continue the publication of that journal, though in its weekly form it would still be issued. "Mechanical difficulties" are stated to have been the barriers to the success of the enterprise. Apart from these mysterious "mechanical difficulties," we may venture to observe that The New York Herald experiment has been an ineresting one. It has shown, we think, pretty conclusively that journalism, as it fourishes across the Atlantic, is not to the taste of the "old country."
