The Beef Ring.

FARMERS MAY HAVE FRESH MEAT IN SUMMER. Department of Agriculture, Ottawa, June 16.

Although a live stock is grown on almost every Canadian farm, the farmer as a rule finds it very difficult to furnish his table with fresh meat during the summer months. Salt and poultry are in general use, but it is evident that a liberal supply of fresh beef would make the problem of preparing the summer menu a much easier one for the women of the household, and would ensure a more wholesome and palatable bill of fare for the family.

BEEF RINGS.

These rings are not, as the name might indicate, "rings" for the control of the production and sale of beef, but are groups of farmers who cooperate to supply the tables with fresh meat during the summer.

THE ANIMAL.

The regulations usually provide that each member shall provide a certain number of head of stock, and that the number drawn lots the previous winter to determine the order in which they shall contribute animals.

KILLING AND DISTRIBUTION.

A butcher is employed to kill and cut up the animals, the carcasses being changed and packed in ice. The amount paid for killing and cutting up a beast is usually \$2 to \$2.50, with an extra dollar if the butcher makes every thing which is not a general practice.
