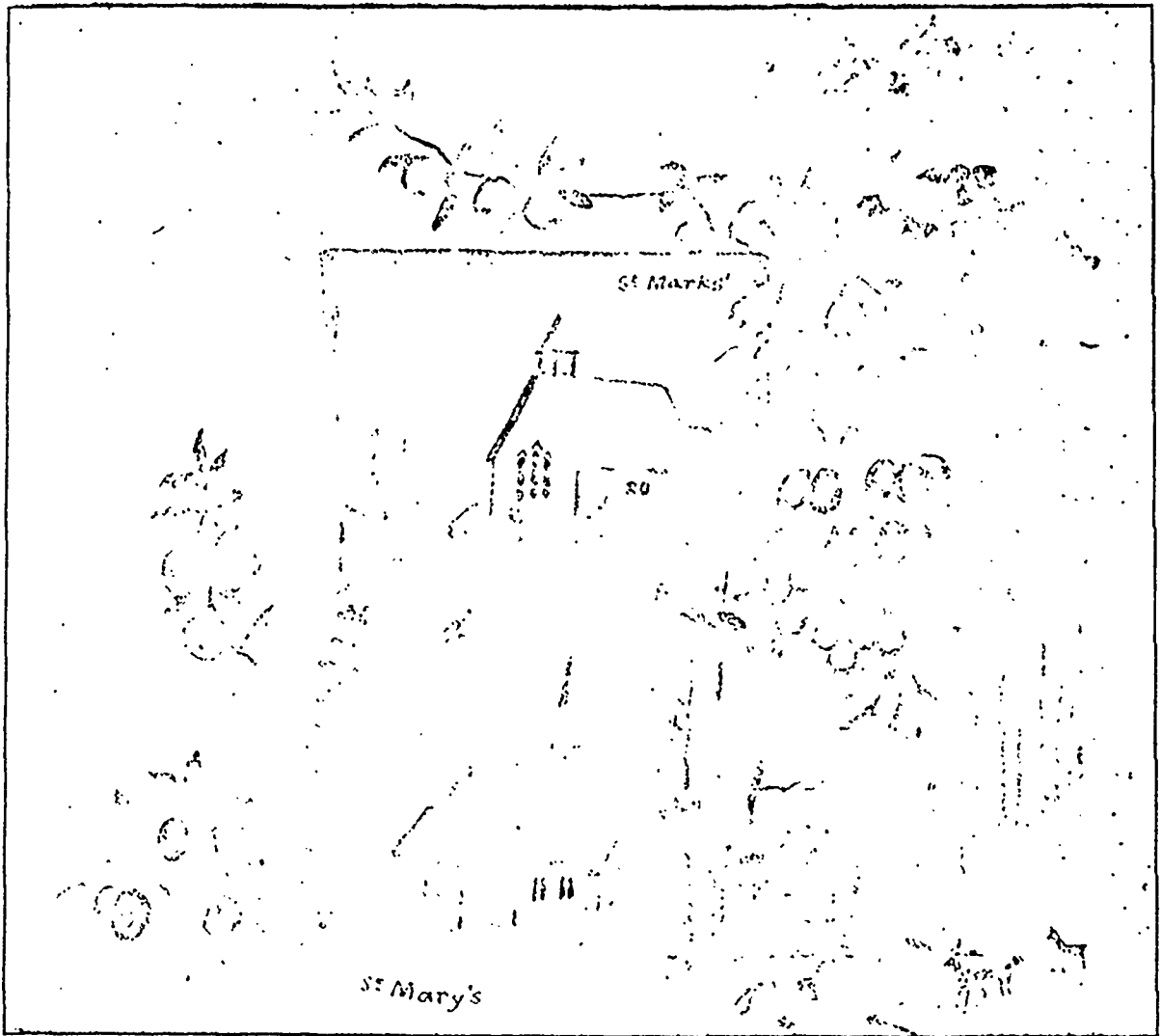

St. Mark's Church, Vesuvius—Morning service 11 a.m., and Holy Communion the first Sunday in each month. Afternoon service 7.30 p.m. on all other Sundays, except when a fifth Sunday in the month occurs. Evening service 7.30 p.m.

North End School—Service 11 a.m. the third Sunday in each month.

The "Divide" School—Service 1 p.m. the first Sunday in each month.

Beaver Point School—Service 11 a.m. the fifth Sunday in the month, whenever there are five Sundays.

St. Mary's Church, Fulford—Morning service 10.30 a.m. second and fourth Sundays in each month. Holy Communion on the fourth Sunday of every second month. During the summer months an additional evening service the first Sunday of the month 7.30 p.m.

Salt Spring Island Parish and Home

JULY, 1897.

Mr. H. W. Bullock will leave England to return to his home on Salt Spring Island on July 15th.

There is to be a meeting of the Salt Spring Island Agricultural and Fruit Growers' Association at Burgoyne Bay on Saturday, the 3rd instant.

Mr. Connery has been laid up for several weeks with broken ribs, the result of an unintentional kick by a favourite mare of his. The mare had a foal at her side, and the kick was intended for another horse in the yard, not for her master.

Weather Report for May.—Kuper Island: Mean temperature for the month, 54.9; maximum (on the 28th) 83.2; minimum (on the 1st) 34.5; rainfall, 0.95 inches; mean proportion of bright sunshine, 0.54; number of days completely clouded, 1.

It had been planned to erect a Jubilee flagstaff outside the Public Hall on the night of Wednesday, June 23rd, but owing to a case of severe illness in the immediate vicinity it was thought better to postpone it. Notices are now up for the erection of the flagstaff at 7:30 p.m., Dominion Day, July 1st. A new Union Jack has been purchased by public subscription and will be hoisted as soon as the pole is in its place. Then the National Anthem will be sung and sixty guns fired in honour of the Queen. The pole is about eighty feet high.

Miss Kathleen Wilson, daughter of the Rev. E. F. Wilson, has been dangerously ill with an attack of cerebro-spinal meningitis. For a time her life was despaired of, but, in answer to the many prayers offered on her behalf, she is now, we are thankful to say, in a fair way towards recovery. The medical men in attendance were Dr. Elliott, of Chemainus, and Dr. McKechnie, of Nanaimo. Mrs. Beddis, Miss Peddar and Miss Collins very kindly assisted Mr. Wilson's family in nursing the invalid, and all the neighbours were most kind in rendering every assistance possible.

A special Jubilee service was held in St. Mark's Church Sunday afternoon, June 22nd. The church was very prettily decorated with flowers, a sweet-scented bouquet adorning the end of each seat, and the font and chancel steps being covered with choice roses from Mr. Berrow's nursery. An appropriate sermon was preached, giving a short history of the Queen's life with allusions to the many acts of kindness and goodness which have so endeared her to her people. At the close of the service the National Anthem was sung.

The last club dinner passed off very successfully at Mr. Philips' house, Cusheen Lake. Mr. Philips proved himself an excellent and genial host.

Mr. Reid Bitancourt, contractor and carpenter, has his hands more than full at present, having houses to erect for Mr. E. J. Bitancourt, Mr. H. W. Bullock, Mr. J. Scovell and Messrs. E. and F. Abbott.

Mr. Edward Walter, of "The Maples," Ganges Harbour, has done a wise act in taking to himself a wife. The lady arrived from England the beginning of June, and the marriage ceremony took place in Vancouver.

The full carrying out of the programme for Jubilee Day, June 22nd, was somewhat interfered with through various causes. Some, who were to have taken a leading part, were away in Victoria; others were kept at home by illness; and the weather, too, was not very propitious. However, there was a goodly gathering for a picnic under the maples, and all who were present greatly enjoyed themselves. The climb to the mountain top and the lighting of a beacon fire was given up, as with the high wind blowing, it was feared the conflagration might get beyond bounds and do damage to fences.
