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## Entroduction.

It is certain that in the Primitive age the apostolic rite of Confirmation, or Laying on of Hands, was administered, even in the case of infants, as soon as possible after baptism. In fact, it was then considered as the necessary consummation of the baptismal ceremony, and down to the 9th century this was the rule of the whole Christian Church, as it is still the rule of all the Oriental Churches. In the West, the practice is now universal of separating the two, the severance being so complete, that in the Roman communion Confirmation has been raised to the dignity of a distinct Sacrament. The Anglican Church returning, as she believes, to the Apostolic and Scriptural usage, makes it a rite complemental to Baptism, and introductory to the Holy Communion, the link between the only two Sacraments ordained by Christ himself, and the public acknowledgment on the part of the Church that the member initiated in Holy Baptism is now fully qualified to be admitted to the participation of all her privileges, and to the knowledge of the highest mysteries of the Christian religion. She therefore postpones its administration until her children are "able to render an

account of their faith," (P. Book, 1604,) or (more distinctly qualifying the period), until they "have come to years of discretion," and "are of a competent age."

Be she right or wrong, our Church has, for the past 300 years, considered the ordinance of Confirmation as the crowning of the religious instruction of her young men and maidens, her final blessing to them as they emerge from the state of tutelage, and are about to go forth into the world as men and women militant in the great battle of good and evil. At that most critical period of life she calls her children to her altars, and there having caused them to renew openly, before God and their Christian brethren, the solemn Vow and promises of their Baptism, she bestows, through her highest officers of Apostolic rank, her choicest benison, on each one separately invokes the manifold gifts of the Holy Ghost; and, believing that her petitions are answered, she sends them forth assured of the favor and gracious goodness of the Almighty and Ever-living God.

This is Confirmation, as now observed in the Anglican Church, and, until some change be made, her priests are bound to obey her voice, and teach as she directs. Therefore, with them, preparation for Confirmation is the duty that perhaps, of all others, brings the weightiest responsibility. The pastor feels, that to him is then entrusted the launching of frail barks on the stormy waters of life, to sail forth to an immortal destiny of weal or woe, the haven of eternal rest in some degree to be attained by the manner in which each

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vessel is fitted out for the voyage. He is the Officer of a little band, whom he is putting in array for the first time against deadliest enemies. He is conscious that his soldiers are young and inexperienced, with the issue of the battle of life in a great measure depending upon the disposition he makes, the knowledge he imparts, the courage he inspires, and with the certainty that never again will there come the same opportunity for training and teaching. Therefore, he makes this a most solemn season to himself and his catechumens, a season of more earnest, more frequent prayer, and of retirement from the world, and he strains every faculty in drawing the youthful disciples of Jesus nearer to their Lord, in giving to their eyes of faith a clearer sight of the Captain of their salvation, in helping them to realize the happiness and peace that ever follow love and obedience to Him and His Church; and, finally, in preparing them for the coming joy unspeakable the honor inestimable, of admission to His Sacramental Presence, and their reception worthily of His most blessed Body and Blood.

I have not presumed to lay down any invariable course of study, feeling that every clergyman with a cure of souls will be the best judge of the instruction suitable to his own circumstances. Sex, age, education, surrounding influences, social position, will necessarily vary the character of almost every catechumen's preparation. But feeling myself the want of some short Office for my classes, and the inefficacy of merely

naming collects, or even saying the best forms of prayer, if these be not before the eyes at the time, and also knowing the benefit of special devotions for special occasions, I have ventured to draw up the following, and offer it in all humility to my reverend brethren in the Diocese of Ontario. May the Lord perform all our petitions, and give His blessing to our work. May the Hely Spirit be with us at our Confirmation seasons, to take of the things of Christ and show them to us and our dear children in the Church, and thus ever lead us all on to the greater knowledge and obedience of His Word, so that in the end we may obtain life everlasting, and there meet together again, past all the changes and chances of this world, through the infinite Love and Merits and Mediation of our most blessed Lord and Saviour, JESUS CHRIST. Amen.

Grant that I may both perceive and know what things I ought to do, and also may have grace and power so faithfully to fulfil the same, that by the innocency of my life, and constancy of my faith, I may glorify Thy Holy Name, and plenteously bringing forth the fruit of good works, may of Thee be plenteously rewarded. Amen.

Grant that I may diligently follow the example of my Saviour, Christ, and be made like unto Him; that as He died and rose again for me, so I may die unto sin and rise again unto righteousness, continually mortifying all my evil and corrupt affections, and daily proceeding in all virtue and godliness of living; that so as I have been made partaker of the Death of Thy Son, I may also be partaker of His Resurrection; and, finally, with the residue of Thy Saints, may be an inheritor of Thine everlasting Kingdom. ## Prayer to be said Daily while preparing for Confirmation.

O dispose my mind by Thy heavenly grace, carefully and diligently to perform those conditions Thou requirest to qualify me for such inestimable benefits, and that I may continue in the same unto my life's end.

And now, O Lord, that I am preparing myself to receive a further degree of Thy grace and favour, which will advance me into the number of the faithful, by being permitted to approach Thy Holy Table, I humbly beseech Thee to enlighten my mind with the true knowledge and understanding of that solemn Vow which I made at my Baptism, and which I am now about to ratify and confirm publicly, in Thy presence:—

1. That I may constantly renounce the Devil, by avoiding all those temptations with which he seeks to destroy me, and by abstaining from all those sins which partake most of his diabolical nature.

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2. That I may resist all covetous desires of honor, riches and pleasure, and all those evil customs and maxims of the world which alienate men's minds from the love of God; and that I may mortify all the inordinate appetites of my own corrupt nature.

3. That I may believe all Thy holy Revelations, and keep Thy blessed will and commandments all the days of my life. Amen.

Give me, O Lord, unfeigned repentance for all my past errors; that the many sins that I have committed may not deprive me of the assistance of Thy Holy Spirit, which I am about to receive: but let my hearty sorrow, through the merits of Christ, wash away all that is past; and let power and strength, communicated to me from above, mortify and subdue them for the time to come. Amen.

I am unable, O Lord, of myself to help myself; mercifully grant that Thy Blessed Spirit may in all these things rule my heart; that by His holy Inspiration I may always think those things that are good, and by His gracious guiding may perform the same; through Jesus Christ our Lord. Amen.

# Prayer to be frequently used after Confirmation.

Almighty God and Heavenly Father, I bless and praise Thy Holy Name, that Thou hast vouchsafed to call me to a knowledge of Thy grace and faith in Thee, and hast certified to me, by the Laying on of hands, the remission of my sins, Thy favor and goodness, and the inheritance of everlasting life. Grant, I beseech Thee,

that I may continue in this state of salvation, in the holy fellowship of Thy Church—the mystical body of Thy Son; and, by Thy Grace, may do all such good works as Thou hast prepared for me to walk in. But, O Gracious God, Who knowest the frailties of my nature, and that I am set in the midst of many and great dangers, grant me Thy strength and Thy protection, support me in all dangers and carry me through all temptations; -may I never cast away my confidence in Thee, nor place it anywhere but in Thee. Keep me, I beseech Thee, from all things hurtful to my salvation, and lead me to all things profitable to it. May I remember always that I am bound by the most solemn obligations to follow the example of my Saviour Christ, to die unto sin and to rise again unto righteousness. Mortify and destroy all vices in me, and strengthen me by Thy grace, that by the innocence of my life and constancy of my faith, even unto death, I may glorify Thy Holy Name. Beholding constantly, by faith, the glory that shall be revealed, the good things which Thou hast prepared for those that love Thee, may I forsake all worldly and carnal affections, all covetous wishes and inordinate love of this world, and seek, supremely, those heavenly treasures—those true joys which are at Thy right hand, and which exceed all that I can desire. ## Rules for a Holy Life.

I. Begin and close every day with private devotion. Dan. vi., 10.

II. Read, daily, some portion of God's Holy Word. St. John v., 39.

III. Attend regularly and reverently the services of the Church; and especially the Holy Communion. Heb. x. 25. Ps. cxi. 9. St. Luke xxii. 19.

IV. Keep strict watch over yourself, especially your tongue. St. Matt. xxvi. 41. St. James iii.

V. Be careful of your example, especially before the young. Eph. iv. 29, 30.

VI. Avoid all companionship with the ungodly. 1 Cor. xv. 33.

VII. Trust God in everything. Job xiii. 15.

VIII. When you have done all, feel you are an unprofitable servant. St. Luke xvii. 10.

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
