 CLIMATE.—Victoria lies in about 48° 30' Longitude West from Greenwich, and about 48-22 North  
 Latitude. The thermometer seldom gets as low as zero in winter. The winter of 1876 and 1877, was  
 the coldest for the past 18 years. The thermometer at the lowest 30 above zero, but very little  
 snow, seldom weighing, much rain and wind. The coldest snap in winter lasts about one week.  
 The world cannot surpass the climate of Vic-  
 toria in the same Latitude.  
 FIRST DRIVE.—Across James's Bay Bridge, round the mouth of the harbor, then following the
