CLIMATE.—Victoria lies about 122° Longitude West from Greenwich, and about 48-52° North Latitude. The thermometer seldom goes as low as zero in winter. The winter of 1876 and 1878, was the coldest for the past 15 years. The thermometer at the lowest 2½ above zero, but very little snow, seldom sleighing, much rain and wind. The coldest snap in winter lasts about one week. The thermometer in summer ranges between 65° and 85°. The world cannot surpass the climate of Victoria in the same latitude.
